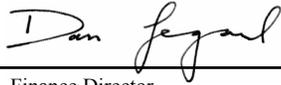

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as shown in the "Execution Date" on page one (1) in the heading of this AGREEMENT, between the City of Kennewick hereinafter called the "AGENCY," and the name/organization referenced on page one (1) in the heading of this AGREEMENT, hereinafter called the "CONSULTANT."

WHEREAS, the AGENCY desires to accomplish the work referenced in the section I. "Description of Work" section of this AGREEMENT and hereafter called the "SERVICES"; and does not have sufficient staff to meet the required commitment and therefore deems it advisable and desirable to engage the assistance of a CONSULTANT to provide the necessary SERVICES; and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT represents that they comply with the Washington State Statutes relating to professional registration, if applicable, and has signified a willingness to furnish consulting Services to the AGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, or attached and incorporated and made a part hereof, the AGENCY, and the CONSULTANT mutually agree as follows:

I. Description of Work

The Scope of Work and projected level of effort required for these SERVICES is described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT.

If, due to the CONSULTANT'S error or oversight, corrections to the SERVICES contracted for herein are necessary, the CONSULTANT will make such corrections at no additional cost to the AGENCY and will submit such corrections to the AGENCY within ten (10) days of receipt of the AGENCY'S request.

II. General Requirements

CONSULTANT shall, at all times, comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations, decrees, directives, guidelines, etc., (together "Laws") which may impact or apply to the performance of SERVICES under this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether such Laws are modified or are enacted during the term of this AGREEMENT.

III. Period of Performance

This AGREEMENT shall commence on the date executed by the AGENCY and the CONSULTANT shown in "Execution Date" in the heading of this AGREEMENT on page one (1) and shall be completed on the date shown in "Completion Date" in the heading of this AGREEMENT on page one (1), unless modified by a written AGREEMENT revision extending the "Completion Date" or unless terminated sooner as provided herein.

Upon completion or termination of this AGREEMENT, the CONSULTANT shall turn over all documents, records and file materials to the AGENCY.

IV. Payment Provisions

The CONSULTANT shall be paid by the AGENCY for completed work and SERVICES, deemed to be satisfactory by the AGENCY, rendered under this AGREEMENT as provided hereinafter. Such payment shall be full compensation for work performed or SERVICES rendered and for all labor, materials, supplies, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the SERVICES specified in section I. "Description of Work",

unless otherwise specified in section XVII. "Special Provisions." The CONSULTANT shall conform to all applicable portions of 48 CFR Part 31.

- A. Lump Sum AGREEMENT: Payment for all consulting SERVICES shall be on the basis of a lump sum "Maximum Amount Payable" as shown in the heading on page one (1) of this AGREEMENT.
 - 1. Maximum Amount Payable: The Maximum Amount Payable by the AGENCY to the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT shall not exceed the amount shown on page one (1) in the heading of this AGREEMENT unless modified by written contract revision prior to the CONSULTANT exceeding this amount. No minimum amount payable is guaranteed under this AGREEMENT.
- B. Final Payment: Final Payment of any balance due the CONSULTANT of the gross amount earned will be made promptly upon its verification by the AGENCY after the completion of SERVICES under this AGREEMENT, contingent, if applicable, upon receipt of all reports, electronic data, and other related documents which are required to be furnished under this AGREEMENT. Acceptance of such Final Payment by the CONSULTANT shall constitute a release of all claims for payment, which the CONSULTANT may have against the AGENCY unless such claims are specifically reserved in writing and transmitted to the AGENCY by the CONSULTANT prior to its acceptance. Said Final Payment shall not, however, be a bar to any claims that the AGENCY may have against the CONSULTANT or to any remedies the AGENCY may pursue with respect to such claims.

The payment of any billing will not constitute an agreement as to the appropriateness of any item and at the time of final audit, all required adjustments will be made and reflected in a final payment. In the event that such final audit reveals an overpayment to the CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT will refund such overpayment to the AGENCY within thirty (30) calendar days of notice of the overpayment. Such refund shall not constitute a waiver by the CONSULTANT for any claims relating to the validity of a finding by the AGENCY of overpayment. Per the WSDOT'S "Audit Guide for CONSULTANTS," Chapter 23 "Resolution Procedures," the CONSULTANT has twenty (20) working days after receipt of the final post-audit to begin the appeal process to the AGENCY for audit findings.

V. Compensation

The CONSULTANT shall be paid \$114,200.00 for all SERVICES and expenses under this AGREEMENT, provided that the total reimbursement under this AGREEMENT shall not exceed \$114,200.00. Such payment shall include all the CONSULTANT'S expenses in the performance of this AGREEMENT unless otherwise specified in Section XVII "Special Provisions." The CONSULTANT'S invoice shall include: the project title, description of the services rendered, and the dates worked.

VI. Records and Accounts

The CONSULTANT and any authorized sub-consultant, or any other person or firm, shall keep detailed records relating to the charges made and expenses incurred for work required by this AGREEMENT.

The CONSULTANT'S accounting records pertaining to this AGREEMENT shall be available for inspection by the representatives of the AGENCY, the State and the United States, at the office of the CONSULTANT. The CONSULTANT shall include in any sub-consultant agreement/contract or any agreement/contract with any person or firm a provision requiring such sub-consultant, person, or firm to make its financial records available for inspection by the AGENCY in accordance with this provision.

The accounting record referred to in the preceding paragraph shall be available for inspection during normal business hours and shall be retained by the CONSULTANT or sub-consultant, or any other person or firm, for a period of three (3) years following final payment from the AGENCY to the CONSULTANT with the following exception: if any litigation, claim, or audit is started before the expiration of the three (3)-year retention period, the records shall be retained until all litigation, claim, or audit findings involving the records have been resolved.

The CONSULTANT further agrees that any duly authorized representative of the AGENCY, the State or of the United States, in the official conduct of its business shall have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, photographic negatives, and records of the CONSULTANT involving the SERVICES provided under the terms of this AGREEMENT at any time during normal business hours during the life of this AGREEMENT and for three (3) years after the date of the final payment under this AGREEMENT.

An audit may be performed on this AGREEMENT. The audit, if any, will be performed by the WSDOT's Internal Audit Office.

VII. Performance of Services

In the performance of the SERVICES under this AGREEMENT, the CONSULTANT shall comply with all applicable AGENCY regulations, State and Federal laws, regulations and procedures.

1. Non-delegation

The SERVICES to be furnished under the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be performed by the CONSULTANT and the CONSULTANT'S bona fide employees, and shall not be delegated to any other person or firm.

2. Subcontracting

The CONSULTANT shall not hire sub-consultants or any other person or firm to provide SERVICES under this AGREEMENT except pursuant to a revision of this AGREEMENT as authorized in Section XVIII "Modification of Agreement." All applicable portions of this AGREEMENT shall be contained in the subcontract between the CONSULTANT and its sub-consultant(s).

The CONSULTANT shall remove any employee from assignment to perform SERVICES under this AGREEMENT immediately upon receipt of written request to do so from the AGENCY.

The CONSULTANT warrants that, if it is full or partially employed by any public agency other than the AGENCY, its acceptance of this AGREEMENT is with the consent of such agency; that the CONSULTANT shall spend no time in the performance require in this AGREEMENT during which time the CONSULTANT should normally be employed and paid by such agency; and that the acceptance of this AGREEMENT will not interfere with any obligations the CONSULTANT may have to such agency.

VIII. Employment and Organizational Conflict of Interest

The CONSULTANT warrants that they have not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT, to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this AGREEMENT. For breach or violation of this warrant, the AGENCY shall have the right to annul this AGREEMENT without liability or, in its discretion, to deduct from

this AGREEMENT price or consideration or otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.

Any and all employees of the CONSULTANT or other persons while engaged in the performance of any work or SERVICES required of the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT, shall be considered employees of the CONSULTANT only and not of the AGENCY, and any and all claims that may arise under any Workmen's Compensation Act on behalf of said employees or other persons while so engaged, and any and all claims made by a third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of the CONSULTANT'S employees or other persons while so engaged on any of the work or SERVICES provided to be rendered herein, shall be the sole obligation and responsibility of the CONSULTANT.

The CONSULTANT shall not engage, on a full- or part-time basis, or other basis, during the period of this AGREEMENT, any professional or technical personnel who are, or have been, at any time during the period of this AGREEMENT, in the employ of the United States Department of Transportation or the AGENCY, except regularly retired employees, without written consent of the public employer of such person if he/she will be working on this AGREEMENT for the CONSULTANT.

The CONSULTANT shall comply with the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act and any other legislation affecting its employees and the rules and regulations issued there under; and shall save the AGENCY free, clear and harmless from all actions, claims, demands and expenses arising out of said Act and any rules and regulations that are or may be promulgated in connection therewith.

The CONSULTANT assumes full responsibility for the payment of all payroll taxes, use, sales, income or any other form of taxes, fees, licenses, excises, or payments required by any Federal or State legislation which are now or which may be enacted during the term of this AGREEMENT as to all the CONSULTANT'S employees, and as to all the duties, activities, and requirements of the CONSULTANT in the performance of this AGREEMENT.

The CONSULTANT shall comply with the WSDOT's Organizational Conflict of Interest Policy, WSDOT Manual 3043, and revisions thereto <http://www.wsdot.wa.gov/Publications/Manuals/M3043.htm>, and its requirements for employees, the CONSULTANT firm and any entities created to do business with the AGENCY.

IX. Nondiscrimination

During the performance of this AGREEMENT, the CONSULTANT, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest, agrees as follows:

1. Compliance with Laws and Regulations

The CONSULTANT shall comply with the regulations relative to nondiscrimination in Federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as the "REGULATIONS", which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this AGREEMENT. The CONSULTANT shall comply with the State Law Against Discrimination, Chapter 49.60 RCW and any REGULATIONS adopted thereto.

2. Nondiscrimination

The CONSULTANT with regard to the work performed by it during the AGREEMENT, shall not discriminate on the grounds of age, sex, marital status, race, creed, color, national origin, or the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical handicap unless based upon a bona fide occupational qualification, in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The

CONSULTANT shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination of prohibited by Chapter 49.60 RCW or by section 21.5 of the REGULATIONS, including employment practices when the AGREEMENT covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the REGULATIONS.

3. Solicitation for Sub-consultants, Including Procurement of Materials and Equipment

In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the CONSULTANT for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurement of materials or leases of equipment, each potential sub-consultant or supplier shall be notified by the CONSULTANT of the CONSULTANT'S obligations under this AGREEMENT and the REGULATIONS relative to nondiscrimination on the above grounds.

4. Information and Reports

The CONSULTANT shall provide all information and reports required by the REGULATIONS; or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts or other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the AGENCY or the Federal Highway Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such REGULATIONS, directives or laws. Where any information required of a CONSULTANT is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refused to furnish this information, the CONSULTANT shall so certify to the AGENCY, WSDOT, or the Federal Highway Administration as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

5. Sanctions for Noncompliance

In the event of the CONSULTANT'S noncompliance with the discrimination provisions of this AGREEMENT, the AGENCY shall impose such AGREEMENT sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including but not limited to (1) withholding of payments to the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT until the CONSULTANT complies, and/or (2) cancellation, termination, or suspension of this AGREEMENT in whole or in part.

6. Incorporation of Provisions

The CONSULTANT shall include the provisions of paragraphs 1 through 6 in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the REGULATIONS, or directives issued pursuant thereto. The CONSULTANT shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the AGENCY, WSDOT, or Federal Highway Administration may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance; provided, however, that, in the event a CONSULTANT becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the CONSULTANT may request the AGENCY to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the AGENCY and / or WSDOT; and, in addition, the CONSULTANT may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

X. Termination

The right is reserved by the AGENCY to terminate this AGREEMENT at any time with or without cause upon ten (10) days written notice to the CONSULTANT.

In the event this AGREEMENT is terminated by the AGENCY, other than for default on the part of the CONSULTANT, a final payment shall be made to the CONSULTANT which, when added to any payments previously made, shall total the same percentage of the Lump Sum Amount as the work completed at the time of termination is to the total work required for the SERVICES. In addition, the CONSULTANT shall be paid for any authorized extra work completed.

No payment shall be made for any SERVICES completed after ten (10) days following receipt by the CONSULTANT of the notice to terminate. If the accumulated payment made to the CONSULTANT prior to Notice of Termination exceeds the total amount that would be due when computed as set forth in paragraph two (2) of this section, then no final payment shall be due and the CONSULTANT shall immediately reimburse the AGENCY for any excess paid.

If the services of the CONSULTANT are terminated by the AGENCY for default on the part of the CONSULTANT, the above formula for payment shall not apply.

In the event of a termination for default, the amount to be paid to the CONSULTANT shall be determined by the AGENCY with consideration given to the actual costs incurred by the CONSULTANT in performing SERVICES to the date of termination, the amount of SERVICES originally required which was satisfactorily completed to date of termination, whether that SERVICE is in a form or a type which is usable to the AGENCY at the time of termination, the cost to the AGENCY of employing another firm to complete the SERVICES required and the time which may be required to do so, and other factors which affect the value to the AGENCY of the SERVICES performed at the time of termination. Under no circumstances shall payment made under this subsection exceed the amount, which would have been made using the formula set forth in paragraph two (2) of this section.

If it is determined for any reason that the CONSULTANT was not in default or that the CONSULTANT's failure to perform is without the CONSULTANT's or its employee's fault or negligence, the termination shall be deemed to be a termination for the convenience of the AGENCY. In such an event, the CONSULTANT would be reimbursed for actual costs in accordance with the termination for other than default clauses listed previously.

The CONSULTANT shall, within 15 days, notify the AGENCY in writing, in the event of the death of any member, partner, or officer of the CONSULTANT or the death or change of any of the CONSULTANT's supervisory and/or other key personnel assigned to the project or disaffiliation of any principally involved CONSULTANT employee. The CONSULTANT shall also notify the AGENCY, in writing, in the event of the sale or transfer of 50% or more of the beneficial ownership of the CONSULTANT within 15 days of such sale or transfer occurring. The CONSULTANT shall continue to be obligated to complete the SERVICES under the terms of this AGREEMENT unless the AGENCY chooses to terminate this AGREEMENT for convenience or chooses to renegotiate any term(s) of this AGREEMENT. If termination for convenience occurs, final payment will be made to the CONSULTANT as set forth in the second and third paragraphs of this section.

Payment for any part of the SERVICES by the AGENCY shall not constitute a waiver by the AGENCY of any remedies of any type it may have against the CONSULTANT for any breach of this AGREEMENT by the CONSULTANT, or for failure of the CONSULTANT to perform SERVICES required of it by the AGENCY. Forbearance of any rights under the AGREEMENT will not constitute waiver of entitlement to exercise those rights with respect to any future act or omission by the CONSULTANT.

XI. Disputes

Any disputed issue not resolved pursuant to the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be submitted in writing within 10 days to the Director of Public Works or AGENCY Engineer, whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding on the parties of this AGREEMENT; provided however, that if an action is brought challenging the Director of Public Works or AGENCY Engineer's decision, that decision shall be subjected to judicial review. If the parties to this AGREEMENT mutually agree, disputes concerning alleged design errors will be conducted under the procedures found in Exhibit "J". In the event that either party deem it necessary to

institute legal action or proceeding to enforce any right or obligation under this AGREEMENT, this action shall be initiated in the Superior Court of the State of Washington, situated in the county in which the AGENCY is located. The parties hereto agree that all questions shall be resolved by application of Washington law and that the parties have the right of appeal from such decisions of the Superior Court in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington. The CONSULTANT hereby consents to the personal jurisdiction of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, situated in the county in which the AGENCY is located.

XII. Legal Relations

The CONSULTANT, any sub-consultant, and the AGENCY shall comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, rules, codes, and regulations applicable to the work to be performed under this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

The CONSULTANT shall defend, indemnify, and hold the State of Washington (STATE) and the AGENCY and their officers and employees harmless from all claims, demands, or suits at law or equity arising in whole or in part from the negligence of, or the breach of any obligation under this AGREEMENT by, the CONSULTANT or the CONSULTANT'S agents, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the CONSULTANT may be legally liable; provided that nothing herein shall require a CONSULTANT to defend or indemnify the STATE and the AGENCY against and hold harmless the STATE and AGENCY from claims, demands or suits based solely upon the negligence of, or breach of any obligation under this AGREEMENT by the STATE and the AGENCY, their agents, officers, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the STATE and / or the AGENCY may be legally liable; and provided further that if the claims or suits are caused by or result from the concurrent negligence of (a) the CONSULTANT or the CONSULTANT'S agents, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the CONSULTANT is legally liable, and (b) the STATE and / or AGENCY, their agents, officers, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors and or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the STATE and / or AGENCY may be legally liable, the indemnity obligation shall be valid and enforceable only to the extent of the CONSULTANT'S negligence or the negligence of the CONSULTANT'S agents, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the CONSULTANT may be legally liable. This provision shall be included in any AGREEMENT between CONSULTANT and any sub-consultants, subcontractor and vendor, of any tier.

The CONSULTANT shall also defend, indemnify, and hold the STATE and the AGENCY and their officers and employees harmless from all claims, demands, or suits at law or equity arising in whole or in part from the alleged patent or copyright infringement or other allegedly improper appropriation or use of trade secrets, patents, proprietary information, know-how, copyright rights or inventions by the CONSULTANT or the CONSULTANT'S agents, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the CONSULTANT may be legally liable, in performance of SERVICES under this AGREEMENT or arising out of any use in connection with the AGREEMENT of methods, processes, designs, information or other items furnished or communicated to STATE and / or AGENCY, their agents, officers and employees pursuant to the AGREEMENT; provided that this indemnity shall not apply to any alleged patent or copyright infringement or other allegedly improper appropriation or use of trade secrets, patents, proprietary information, know-how, copyright rights or inventions resulting from STATE's and / or AGENCY's, their agents', officers' and employees' failure to comply with specific written instructions regarding use provided to STATE and / or AGENCY, their agents, officers and employees by the CONSULTANT, its agents, employees, sub-consultants, subcontractors or vendors, of any tier, or any other persons for whom the CONSULTANT may be legally liable.

The CONSULTANT'S professional liability to the AGENCY, including that which may arise in reference to Section XIV "Insurance" of this AGREEMENT, shall be limited to the total amount of the AGREEMENT or one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), whichever is greater. In no case shall the CONSULTANT'S professional liability to third parties be limited in any way.

The CONSULTANT specifically assumes potential liability for actions brought by the CONSULTANT'S own employees or its agents against the STATE and / or AGENCY and, solely for the purpose of this indemnification and defense, the CONSULTANT specifically waives any immunity under the STATE industrial insurance law, Title 51 RCW.

XIII. Independent Contractor

The CONSULTANT shall be deemed an independent contractor for all purposes. The CONSULTANT and its employees and any authorized sub-consultants, or any other person of firm, shall not be deemed the employees of the AGENCY for any purpose.

XIV. Insurance

The CONSULTANT shall obtain and keep in force during the terms of this AGREEMENT, or as otherwise required, insurance with companies or through sources approved by the STATE Insurance Commissioner pursuant to Title 48 RCW.

It is the CONSULTANT'S responsibility to provide evidence of continuing coverage during the overlap periods of the policy and the AGREEMENT.

The parties enter into this AGREEMENT for the sole benefit of the parties, and to the exclusion of any third party, and no third party beneficiary is intended or created by the execution of this AGREEMENT.

XV. Confidentiality

The AGENCY is contracting for the CONSULTANT'S independent performance of the specified SERVICES. Should the AGENCY employ another CONSULTANT to perform the same services, the CONSULTANT shall not discuss or otherwise exchange information with such other CONSULTANT.

The project for which the SERVICES of the CONSULTANT are required may involve litigation of claims against or brought by the STATE and / or AGENCY. Subject to Washington's Public Records Act (RCW ch. 42.17 et. al.) all information developed by the CONSULTANT and all information made available to the CONSULTANT and all analyses, conclusions, and/or opinions reached by the CONSULTANT shall be confidential as between the CONSULTANT and the AGENCY. Such information shall not be revealed by the CONSULTANT to any other person, organization, or entity without the express consent of the AGENCY. The confidentiality of such information will survive the completion of work under this AGREEMENT and/or the termination of this AGREEMENT.

The SERVICES to be performed under this AGREEMENT do not include SERVICES as an expert witness; in the event of the commencement of litigation, SERVICES as an expert witness will be the subject of a separate AGREEMENT.

XVI. Applicability of Law

Agreement Number:

This AGREEMENT shall be deemed executed in the State of Washington and the laws of the State of Washington shall govern the interpretation and application of its provisions. Venue for any suits between the CONSULTANT and the AGENCY arising from this AGREEMENT shall be brought and maintained in the Superior Court of Thurston County for the State of Washington.

XVII. Special Provisions

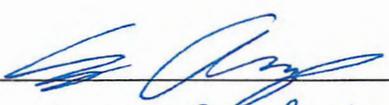

The appraiser shall be responsible for coordinating directly with the WSDOT Review Appraiser and/or the LAC, and shall make such modifications and corrections as required by the Review Appraiser and/or the LAC.
- c.) The City will provide limited liability title reports with history for each parcel, and will pay any WSDOT costs associated with any review appraisals.
- d.) Certain damages will be corrected by the City's contract. Typically, this would include such items as relocating existing commercial signs, modify existing parking lots, relocate fences to the new right-of-way, transitions driveways, relocate irrigation sprinklers to the new right-of-way, and remove and replace water meters. The City will not attempt to salvage or replace landscaping, plantings, or other physical improvements within the strip take area, nor will the City reconstruct lost improvements on site. The appraiser shall include the value of these types of improvements in the appraisal and shall provide copies of supporting estimates from specialized contractors when necessary.

Acquisition Work:

- a) Review and abide by all federal, state and city requirements and become familiar with the sites, present development and planned future work.

- e) Obtain release of all liens and encumbrances as necessary to vest title to the City. Notify the City in writing of any liens or encumbrances that cannot be released.
- f) Provide a bi-weekly project update report. The report will include any concerns or issues that may arise.
- g) Deliver a project diary of all negotiations.

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Exhibit I

Alleged Consultant Design Error Procedures

The purpose of this exhibit is to establish a procedure to determine if a consultant's alleged design error is of a nature that exceeds the accepted standard of care. In addition, it will establish a uniform method for the resolution and/or cost recovery procedures in those instances where the agency believes it has suffered some material damage due to the alleged error by the consultant.

Step 1 Potential Consultant Design Error(s) is Identified by Agency's Project Manager

At the first indication of potential consultant design error(s), the first step in the process is for the Agency's project manager to notify the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer regarding the potential design error(s). For federally funded projects, the Region Local Programs Engineer should be informed and involved in these procedures. (Note: The Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer may appoint an agency staff person other than the project manager, who has not been as directly involved in the project, to be responsible for the remaining steps in these procedures.)

Step 2 Project Manager Documents the Alleged Consultant Design Error(s)

After discussion of the alleged design error(s) and the magnitude of the alleged error(s), and with the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer's concurrence, the project manager obtains more detailed documentation than is normally required on the project. Examples include: all decisions and descriptions of work; photographs, records of labor, materials and equipment.

Step 3 Contact the Consultant Regarding the Alleged Design Error(s)

If it is determined that there is a need to proceed further, the next step in the process is for the project manager to contact the consultant regarding the alleged design error(s) and the magnitude of the alleged error(s). The project manager and other appropriate agency staff should represent the agency and the consultant should be represented by their project manager and any personnel (including sub-consultants) deemed appropriate for the alleged design error(s) issue.

Step 4 Attempt to Resolve Alleged Design Error with Consultant

After the meeting(s) with the consultant have been completed regarding the consultant's alleged design error(s), there are three possible scenarios:

- It is determined via mutual agreement that there is not a consultant design error(s). If this is the case, then the process will not proceed beyond this point.
- It is determined via mutual agreement that a consultant design error(s) occurred. If this is the case, then the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer, or their representatives, negotiate a settlement with the consultant. The settlement would be paid to the agency or the amount would be reduced from the consultant's agreement with the agency for the services on the project in which the design error took place. The agency is to provide LP, through the Region Local Programs Engineer, a summary of the settlement for review and to make adjustments, if any, as to how the settlement affects federal reimbursements. No further action is required.
- There is not a mutual agreement regarding the alleged consultant design error(s). The consultant may request that the alleged design error(s) issue be forwarded to the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer for review. If the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer, after review with their legal counsel, is not able to reach mutual agreement with the consultant, proceed to Step 5.

Step 5 Forward Documents to Local Programs

For federally funded projects all available information, including costs, should be forwarded through the Region Local Programs Engineer to LP for their review and consultation with the FHWA. LP will meet with representatives of the agency and the consultant to review the alleged design error(s), and attempt to find a resolution to the issue. If necessary, LP will request assistance from the Attorney General's Office for legal interpretation. LP will also identify how the alleged error(s) affects eligibility of project costs for federal reimbursement.

- If mutual agreement is reached, the agency and consultant adjust the scope of work and costs to reflect the agreed upon resolution. LP, in consultation with FHWA, will identify the amount of federal participation in the agreed upon resolution of the issue.
- If mutual agreement is not reached, the agency and consultant may seek settlement by arbitration or by litigation.

Consultant Claim Procedures

The purpose of this exhibit is to describe a procedure regarding claim(s) on a consultant agreement. The following procedures should only be utilized on consultant claims greater than \$1,000. If the consultant's claim(s) are a total of \$1,000 or less, it would not be cost effective to proceed through the outlined steps. It is suggested that the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer negotiate a fair and reasonable price for the consultant's claim(s) that total \$1,000 or less.

This exhibit will outline the procedures to be followed by the consultant and the agency to consider a potential claim by the consultant.

Step 1 Consultant Files a Claim with the Agency Project Manager

If the consultant determines that they were requested to perform additional services that were outside of the agreement's scope of work, they may be entitled to a claim. The first step that must be completed is the request for consideration of the claim to the Agency's project manager.

The consultant's claim must outline the following:

- Summation of hours by classification for each firm that is included in the claim;
- Any correspondence that directed the consultant to perform the additional work;
- Timeframe of the additional work that was outside of the project scope;
- Summary of direct labor dollars, overhead costs, profit and reimbursable costs associated with the additional work; and
- Explanation as to why the consultant believes the additional work was outside of the agreement scope of work.

Step 2 Review by Agency Personnel Regarding the Consultant's Claim for Additional Compensation

After the consultant has completed step 1, the next step in the process is to forward the request to the Agency's project manager. The project manager will review the consultant's claim and will meet with the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer to determine if the Agency agrees with the claim. If the FHWA is participating in the project's funding, forward a copy of the consultant's claim and the Agency's recommendation for federal participation in the claim to the WSDOT Local Programs through the Region Local Programs Engineer. If the claim is not eligible for federal participation, payment will need to be from agency funds.

If the Agency project manager, Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer, WSDOT Local Programs (if applicable), and FHWA (if applicable) agree with the consultant's claim, send a request memo, including backup documentation to the consultant to either supplement the agreement, or create a new agreement for the claim. After the request has been approved, the Agency shall write the supplement and/or new agreement and pay the consultant the amount of the claim. Inform the consultant that the final payment for the agreement is subject to audit. No further action is needed regarding the claim procedures.

If the Agency does not agree with the consultant's claim, proceed to step 3 of the procedures.

Step 3 Preparation of Support Documentation Regarding Consultant's Claim(s)

If the Agency does not agree with the consultant's claim, the project manager shall prepare a summary for the Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer that included the following:

- Copy of information supplied by the consultant regarding the claim;
- Agency's summation of hours by classification for each firm that should be included in the claim;
- Any correspondence that directed the consultant to perform the additional work;
- Agency's summary of direct labor dollars, overhead costs, profit and reimbursable costs associated with the additional work;
- Explanation regarding those areas in which the Agency does/does not agree with the consultant's claim(s);
- Explanation to describe what has been instituted to preclude future consultant claim(s); and
- Recommendations to resolve the claim.

Step 4 Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer Reviews Consultant Claim and Agency Documentation

The Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer shall review and administratively approve or disapprove the claim, or portions thereof, which may include getting Agency Council or Commission approval (as appropriate to agency dispute resolution procedures). If the project involves federal participation, obtain concurrence from WSDOT Local Programs and FHWA regarding final settlement of the claim. If the claim is not eligible for federal participation, payment will need to be from agency funds.

Step 5 Informing Consultant of Decision Regarding the Claim

The Director of Public Works or Agency Engineer shall notify (in writing) the consultant of their final decision regarding the consultant's claim(s). Include the final dollar amount of the accepted claim(s) and rationale utilized for the decision.

Step 6 Preparation of Supplement or New Agreement for the Consultant's Claim(s)

The agency shall write the supplement and/or new agreement and pay the consultant the amount of the claim. Inform the consultant that the final payment for the agreement is subject to audit.

Recommendation

That Council authorize the Mayor to sign the letter to Lucky Bridge Casino.

Motion for Consideration

I move to authorize the Mayor to sign a letter to Lucky Bridge Casino which authorizes a penalty payment in the amount of \$1,930.35 in lieu of default provisions of the Settlement Agreement.

Summary

On May 3, 2016, the City and Tri-Cities Gaming LLC d/b/a Lucky Bridge Casino entered into a Settlement Agreement to resolve delinquent gambling taxes, penalties and interest. The Agreement required Lucky Bridge to make a monthly payment towards the gambling taxes that were in arrears as well as stay current on gambling taxes as they became due. In exchange, the City agreed to hold the penalties and interest that had accrued in abeyance; upon full payment of the total debt, the City agrees to waive the penalties and interest. In Section 3 of the Agreement the parties agreed that should Lucky Bridge default, the City has the right to require Lucky Bridge to pay the past due gambling taxes, plus all of the penalties and interest upon 10 days' notice. Failure to pay the full amount results in the revocation of their business license per the Agreement. Lucky Bridge recently made their gambling tax payment for September's activity three days after the due date. Lucky Bridge was able to make its payment for the past due taxes by the due date. While the late tax payment is technically an event which triggers the default provisions of the Settlement Agreement, staff is proposing an alternative resolution. Taking into consideration that Lucky Bridge has paid \$50,000 towards the past due taxes and the fact that this current tax payment was only three days late, staff is proposing the City simply impose the penalty and interest provision in KMC 3.60.060. Per the KMC, a late gambling tax payment results in a 10% penalty plus 1% interest. In this instance, Lucky Bridge would pay a total of \$1,930.35 as its penalty for the late payment. For Council's review and approval is a letter addressed to Lucky Bridge Casino which authorizes the penalty payment in lieu of the default provisions of the Agreement.

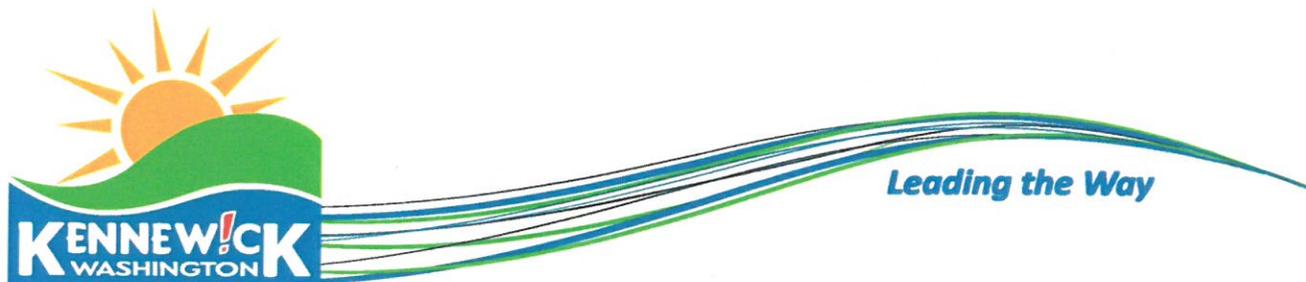

Re: Delinquent Gambling Tax Payment and Settlement Agreement Default

Dear Mr. Sturges:

It has come to the City's attention that you are in default under the terms of the Settlement Agreement entered into between the City and your company on May 3, 2016. Tri-Cities Gaming LLC, d/b/a Lucky Bridge Casino, failed to remit its gambling tax payment for September's activity by the due date, October 31, 2016. Per the Settlement Agreement and the Kennewick Municipal Code ("KMC"), Tri-Cities Gaming LLC is required to pay all current gambling taxes as they become due. However, the City did receive the monthly payment of \$7,860.35 towards the gambling taxes that are in arrears per the Settlement Agreement. On November 1, 2016, the City received a letter from your General Manager stating that the Lucky Bridge Casino needed 10 more days to make its payment for September's activity, but then on November 3, 2016, the City received the gambling tax payment for September in the amount of \$17,390.65.

Section 3 of the Settlement Agreement states that upon default, the remaining balance owing under the payment plan plus previously waived penalties and interest of \$68,178 shall become due and owing immediately and that failure to pay within 10 days' notice will result in the City revoking your business license. In consideration of the fact that September's gambling tax payment was three days late and considering the fact that Tri-Cities Gaming LLC made its monthly payment towards the gambling taxes that are in arrears, the City Council has authorized me to notify you that the City will not consider this delinquency an event of default under the Settlement Agreement as long as Tri-Cities Gaming LLC pays the standard 10% penalty and 1% interest that is required under KMC 3.60.060. The 10% penalty is \$1,739.06 plus the 1% interest on the penalty and tax is \$191.29 for a total of \$1,930.35. Tri-Cities Gaming LLC has 10

business days from the date of this letter to remit \$1,930.35 to the City of Kennewick. The due date for that payment will be November 29, 2016. Upon receipt of the penalty and interest, the City will consider this instance of delinquency closed.

This exception is not intended to waive the City's rights under the Agreement. The City reserves its right to enforce the default provisions of the Settlement Agreement as to any and all future delinquent payments.

RE: Ordinance 5680 – Taxicab and Transportation Network Company Code – Amendment of KMC 6.44

Ordinance 5680 proposes to repeal KMC 6.44 in its entirety and replace it with new regulations governing for-hire vehicles, specifically Taxicabs and Transportation Network Company (TNC) vehicles. If this ordinance is adopted, parent companies will be responsible for obtaining background checks for drivers, ensuring drivers are licensed and insured, and making sure vehicles are inspected by a certified mechanic. A new Class III license will be created – a Taxicab Company and TNC Special License. In order to get a Special License, taxicab companies and TNCs will be required to submit an affidavit swearing under penalty of perjury that their company and all affiliated drivers are in compliance with KMC 6.44. Compliance will be verified by the City through yearly audits of randomly selected driver records.

On October 25, 2016, at Council Workshop, staff presented proposed Ordinance 5680 for consideration. On November 3, 2016, a meeting was held by City Staff where all taxicab companies licensed to operate in Kennewick were invited. A copy of proposed Ordinance 5680 was attached to the email invitation, which was sent on October 26, 2016. Only the owners of Rad Cab responded and attended the meeting. As a result of the meeting and comments from Council at the Workshop, modifications to the proposed ordinance presented at Council Workshop are recommended. These modifications are shown in redline/strikeout on the attached ordinance.

First, amendments were made to recognize that taxicab companies may utilize an Internet online-enabled platform or application without being defined as a TNC. The word “exclusively” was added to the definition of TNC in Section 6.44.010(11) to clarify that TNCs only connect passengers with drivers through an Internet online-enabled platform or application. Second, a new section was added to Section 6.44.070 that states that taxicab companies may use an Internet online-enabled platform or application to arrange rides as long as all other taxicab requirements are being met. Third, that the receipts required in Section 6.44.070(6) contain company contact information rather than the company address. Lastly, Section 6.44.050 has been amended to require that yearly vehicle inspections be performed by a mechanic certified by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TAXICAB AND TRANSPORTATION

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENNEWICK, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 6.44 of the Kennewick Municipal Code be, and the same hereby is, repealed
and recodified as follows:

CHAPTER 6.44

TAXICAB AND TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY CODE

SECTION:

- 6.44.005: Purpose
- 6.44.010: Definitions
- 6.44.020: Taxicab Company and Transportation Network Company Special License - Fees
- 6.44.030: Class
- 6.44.040: Taxicab and TNC Driver Requirements
- 6.44.050: Vehicle Requirements
- 6.44.060: Insurance Requirements
- 6.44.070: Operational Requirements
- 6.44.080: Registered Agent Required
- 6.44.090: Audit
- 6.44.100: Revocation, Suspension, and Penalties
- 6.44.110: Enforcement

6.44.005: Purpose: The purpose of this chapter is to provide for and promote the safety and welfare of the general public by regulating transportation by for-hire vehicles within the City. This chapter does not create or designate any particular class of persons who will or should be specifically protected by its terms. Nothing contained in this chapter is intended nor shall be construed to create any liability on the part of the City or its employees for any injury or damage resulting from the failure of the licensee to comply with the provisions of this chapter, or by reason or in consequence of any act or omission in connection with the implementation or enforcement of this chapter on the part of the City or its employees. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.010: Definitions: As used in this Chapter:

- (1) "City" means the City of Kennewick, Benton County, Washington.

(2) “For-hire vehicle” means any motor vehicle used for the transportation of passengers for compensation, including taxicabs and transportation network company (“TNC”) vehicles. The following motor vehicles are excluded from the definition of for-hire vehicles:

- (a) School buses operating exclusively under a contract to a school district;
- (b) Ride-sharing vehicles under Chapter 46.74 RCW;
- (c) Limousine carriers licensed under Chapter 46.72A RCW;
- (d) Vehicles used by nonprofit transportation providers solely for elderly or handicapped persons and their attendants under Chapter 81.66 RCW;
- (e) Vehicles used by auto transportation companies licensed under Chapter 81.68 RCW;
- (f) Vehicles used to provide courtesy transportation at no charge to and from parking lots, hotels, and rental offices;
- (g) Vehicles licensed under, and used to provide "charter party carrier" and "excursion service carrier" services as defined in, and required by, Chapter 81.70 RCW; and
- (h) Vehicles used to provide Ambulance Service under KMC 6.36.110.

(3) “Independent Contractor” means a person who contracts to do a piece of work according to his own methods and subject to the employer’s control only as to the end product of his or her work. An independent contractor performs work but is not considered an “employee.”

(4) “Licensing Officer” means the Chief of the Kennewick Police Department or his designee.

(5) “Operate”, “Operated”, or “Operating” means using a taxicab or transportation network company vehicle to at any time transport any passenger or item of property for compensation from a point within the corporate limits of the city.

(6) “Person” and “he” and “she” means and includes any natural person, and in addition, a partnership, corporation or an unincorporated association unless a contrary intention plainly appears.

(7) “Special License” shall mean a Special License issued by the License Officer to a taxicab company or TNC.

(8) “Taxicab” means a motorized vehicle that is held out to the public as providing transportation to passengers or articles:

- (a) Where the route traveled, destination, or both route and destination is controlled by the customer; and
- (b) Where the fare is based on an amount recorded and indicated on a taxi meter; and
- (c) Where the vehicle is not operating as a TNC vehicle on a TNC’s digital network in accordance with this chapter.

(9) “Taxicab Company” means any entity operating one or more taxicabs other than as a driver, regardless of the legal form of the entity and regardless of whether the taxicabs so operated are owned by the company, or leased, or owned by individual members of the entity.

(10) “Taxicab Driver” means a person engaging in any combination of owning, leasing, advertising, driving, occupying or otherwise using a taxicab to at any time to transport any passenger or item of property for compensation from a point within the incorporated limits of the City.

(11) “Transportation Network Company” which may be abbreviated herein to “TNC”, means a company that **exclusively** uses an Internet online-enabled platform or application to connect passengers with TNC drivers.

(12) “Transportation Network Company Driver” or “TNC Driver” means a driver

under contract with a TNC Company who:

- (a) Receives connections to potential passengers and related service from a TNC in exchange for payment of a fee to the TNC;
 - (b) Operates a motor vehicle that is owned, leased, or otherwise authorized for use by the individual and is used to provide TNC services;
 - (c) Is an independent contractor of a TNC; and
 - (d) Is not an employee of a TNC.
- (13) “Transportation Network Company Vehicle” means a personal vehicle used by a

TNC driver to provide transportation services arranged through a TNC’s digital network. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.020: Taxicab Company and Transportation Network Company Special License - Fees:

(1) The License Officer may issue a Special License to a taxicab company or TNC provided that:

- (e) The taxicab company or TNC provides proof of insurance coverage for the limits required in this chapter for all employed or affiliated drivers; and
- (f) The taxicab company or TNC submits an affidavit sworn under penalty of perjury that the taxicab company or TNC is in compliance with the driver requirements, vehicle requirements, insurance requirements, and operational requirements established in KMC 6.44.040 - 6.44.070. The affidavit form will be made available by the License Officer at the Kennewick Police Department and on the department’s website.

(2) The Special Licenses issued under this chapter are effective upon approval and must be renewed through the License Officer annually on or before the expiration date of the license in order to continue operating after the expiration date.

(3) The application review fee shall vary based on the number of employed or contracted drivers operating for the company applying for the license. The fee amounts shall be as follows:

- (a) \$300.00 for companies employing or contracting with ten (10) or fewer drivers;
- (b) \$700.00 for companies employing or contracting with eleven (11) to forty (40) drivers; and
- (c) \$2,000.00 for companies employing or contracting with forty-one (41) or more drivers.

(4) The application review fee prescribed by this section shall be paid to the City at the time of submitting both initial and renewal Special License applications.

(5) No taxicab company or TNC Special License shall be issued or valid until the affidavit and proof of insurance referenced in this section has been reviewed and approved and the fee prescribed in this section has been paid.

(6) Drivers who are independent contractors, affiliated with special licensed taxicab companies or TNC’s, shall obtain a business license as required in KMC Chapter 6. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.030: Class: Taxicab Company and TNC Special Licenses are Class III Licenses. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.040: Taxicab and TNC Driver Requirements:

(1) All drivers shall be at least 21 years of age and shall possess a valid driver's license, proof of motor vehicle registration, and proof of current automobile liability insurance that meets the requirements of this chapter.

(2) The TNC, its agent, or its contractor shall maintain accurate and up-to-date records for all TNC drivers accessing its digital network to operate in the City of Kennewick. Said records shall include the driver's name, age, address, social security number, criminal history, driver's license, motor vehicle registration, and automobile insurance.

(3) The taxicab company or its agent shall maintain accurate and up-to-date records for all taxicab drivers employed by the company to operate in the City of Kennewick. Said records shall include the driver's name, age, address, social security number, criminal history, driver's license, motor vehicle registration, and automobile insurance.

(4) Prior to permitting a person to operate as a taxicab driver or as a TNC driver, and biennially thereafter, the taxicab company or TNC shall conduct, or have a third party conduct, a criminal background check report for such person. The criminal background check shall include a search of no less than seven years of database history, unless prohibited by law, in which case the duration of the search shall be the maximum number of years permitted by law. The criminal background check shall include local, state, and national criminal history databases and publically accessible national sex offender registries. Any person who is on a sex offender registry or who has been convicted, within the past seven years, of crimes involving driving under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances, felony fraud, sexual offenses, acts of violence, acts of terror, or use of a motor vehicle to commit a felony, shall not be permitted to act as a taxicab or TNC driver. The taxicab company or TNC, or its agent, shall maintain records of such criminal background checks for a period of two years. For purposes of this section, the term "conviction" includes convictions, bail forfeitures, and other final adverse findings.

(5) A TNC or taxicab company shall revoke a TNC or taxicab driver's authority to operate as a driver for their company if it finds that the standards set forth in this section are no longer being met by such person. The TNC or taxicab company shall only reinstate his or her authority upon a finding by the taxicab company or TNC that all standards are again being met by such person. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.050: Vehicle Requirements: Each taxicab or TNC vehicle shall pass an inspection prior to commencing services in the City of Kennewick, and annually thereafter, by a mechanic certified by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence~~by an approved mechanic~~. Taxicab companies and TNC's shall keep records of all such inspections. Such an inspection shall, at a minimum, include inspection of the following components:

- (1) Foot brakes;
- (2) Parking brakes;
- (3) Steering mechanism;
- (4) Windshield;
- (5) Rear window and other glass;
- (6) Windshield wipers;
- (7) Headlights;
- (8) Taillights;
- (9) Turn indicator lights;
- (10) Stop lights;
- (11) Front seat adjustment mechanism;

- (12) Doors (open, close, lock);
- (13) Horn;
- (14) Speedometer;
- (15) Bumpers;
- (16) Muffler and exhaust system;
- (17) Condition of tires, including tread depth;
- (18) Interior and exterior rear view mirrors; and
- (19) Safety belts for driver and passenger(s). (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.060: Insurance Requirements:

(1) The owner or operator of every taxicab is to procure liability and property damage insurance covering passengers as well as other persons, from a company licensed to write bodily injury liability and property damage liability insurance in the state, on each taxicab used or to be used in transporting persons for compensation in an amount not less than \$100,000.00 for any recovery for personal injury by one person, and not less than \$300,000.00 for all persons receiving personal injury, by reason of one act of negligence, and, not less than \$50,000.00 for damage to property of any person other than the insured, and maintain such liability and property damage insurance in force on each motor-propelled vehicle while so used under such license. A \$500,000.00 combined single limit policy may be substituted.

(2) TNC's and all affiliated drivers shall comply with the automobile liability insurance requirements contained in RCW Chapter 48.177 as enacted or subsequently amended.

(3) A certificate for each policy for liability or property damage insurance required herein shall be filed with the License Officer and kept in full force and effect, and failure so to do shall be cause for the revocation of the license. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.070: Operational Requirements:

(1) Rates: Taxicab drivers shall prominently post rates in each vehicle and charge accordingly. Drivers who solely operate as TNC Drivers are exempt from this requirement. The TNC's software application or website shall display for the passenger the applicable rates being charged and the option to receive an estimated fare before the passenger enters the TNC vehicle.

(2) Records: TNC's and taxicab companies shall maintain the individual records of all trips made by all drivers for at least one year from the date each trip was provided.

(3) Driver Information: Taxicab drivers shall have a document containing their name, photograph, driver's license number, and company worked for clearly posted in any taxicab being operated by the driver. The TNC's software application or website shall display for the passenger the first name and photograph of the TNC driver.

(4) Marking of Vehicles: All taxicabs shall be clearly marked as such and shall include the taxicab company name, phone number, and a vehicle identification number in plain sight. The company name and vehicle identification number shall use letters and numbers a minimum of four (4) inches in height with width proportional. The taxicab company phone number shall use numerals a minimum of two and one half (2 ½) inches in height with the width proportional. Vehicles operated solely by TNC Drivers are exempt from the above marking requirements. The TNC's software application or website shall display for the passenger the make, model, and license plate number of the TNC vehicle.

(5) Method of Soliciting Rides: Only taxicab drivers are permitted to solicit or accept street hails. TNC drivers shall accept only rides arranged through a TNC's digital network and shall not solicit or accept street hails.

(6) Receipts: Whenever demanded by the passenger, the driver of a taxicab or TNC vehicle shall deliver to the person paying for the hiring of said vehicle, at the time of such payment, a receipt therefor either in hard copy or electronically in legible printing or writing. This receipt shall contain the name of the taxicab company or TNC and its address/contact information, the name of the driver, any and all items for which a charge is made, the total amount paid, and the date of payment.

~~(7)~~ ~~(7)~~ Zero Tolerance: TNC's and taxicab companies shall implement a zero tolerance policy on the use of drugs or alcohol applicable to any taxicab drivers employed or affiliated with the company and any TNC drivers on a TNC's digital network. Taxicab companies and TNC's shall provide notice of the zero tolerance policy on their website, if they have one, as well as the procedures to report a complaint about a driver with whom the passenger was matched and for whom the passenger reasonably suspects was under the influence of drugs or alcohol during the course of the ride. If a taxicab company or TNC does not have a website, they must clearly post the zero tolerance policy and procedures to report a complaint in all taxicabs or TNC vehicles owned or operated by the company and its drivers. Taxicab companies and TNC's shall immediately suspend a driver upon receipt of a passenger complaint alleging a violation of the zero tolerance policy. The suspension shall last the duration of the investigation.

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(8) Nothing in this Chapter shall prohibit a taxicab company from using an internet online-enabled platform or application to connect passengers with drivers as long as all other requirements for taxicab companies, vehicles, and drivers are being met. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

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6.44.080: Registered Agent Required: Taxicab companies and TNC's shall maintain a registered agent for service of process in the State of Washington. The name, telephone number, and physical address of the registered agent shall be submitted to the City of Kennewick at the time of license application. The taxicab company or TNC shall notify the City of Kennewick in writing of any changes to its registered agent during the term of the license. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.090: Audit: No more than twice per license year, the City may audit the taxicab company or TNC's records to review compliance with this chapter. Each audit shall be limited to records relating to twenty (20) percent of randomly selected taxicab or TNC drivers, up to a maximum of twenty (20) drivers, that have operated within the last thirty (30) days in the City of Kennewick. In the event the audit reveals discrepancies in the records reviewed, the City reserves the right to audit all of the taxicab company or TNC's records related to taxicab or TNC drivers operating in the City of Kennewick. The audit shall occur at the Kennewick Police Department, 211 West Sixth Avenue, Kennewick, Washington; provided that the City may in its discretion agree to an alternative location. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City may require the taxicab company or TNC to produce records directly related to an active investigation of a specific allegation of a violation of this chapter. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.100: Revocation, Suspension and Penalties:

(1) The License Officer, or on review the Hearing Examiner, may suspend, revoke or refuse to issue a Special License if the licensee or applicant has violated any of the provisions of this Title. A violation includes any and all failures to meet or maintain any of the requirements or qualifications set forth in this chapter for obtaining a Special License and the making of a materially false statement in the affidavit required under KMC 6.44.010. The decision to

suspend, revoke or refuse to issue a Special License may be appealed to the Hearing Examiner pursuant to KMC 6.01.120(6) and KMC Chapter 4.04.

(2) Upon a violation of this chapter, the License Officer may assess a penalty of \$250.00 per violation, up to a maximum of \$10,000.00. The failure of the licensee to pay a penalty assessment automatically suspends the license until such time as it is paid. The License Officer, City Treasurer or their designee are hereby authorized to use any lawful means to collect penalties assessed under this chapter, including the use of a collection agency. Suspensions, revocations and penalties are suspended during the course of hearing, appeal and review unless the License Officer or Hearing Examiner finds that the licensee or applicant's claim is meritless. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

6.44.110: Enforcement: The License Officer shall have the administrative authority to implement and enforce this chapter, and may adopt rules and regulations for its administration, not inconsistent with this chapter. This provision shall not be construed to abrogate or limit the jurisdiction of the Kennewick Police Department to enforce any provisions of this chapter or of any other city ordinance relating to motor vehicles or the operation of taxicabs or TNC vehicles. (Ord. 5680 Sec. 1 (part), 2016)

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect five days from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

I move to adopt Ordinance 5681.

Summary

Amendments to KMC Chapter 6.60 relating to Security Systems, were passed in July of 2016. One of the main effects of the amendments was to change the license for persons who install, service, or maintain alarms systems from a one-year renewal to a two-year renewal. The fee was increased from \$75.00 to \$125.00. The proposed amendment to KMC 6.60.042 was inadvertently left out of the July 2016 adopted changes. As a result KMC 6.60.042(3) is inconsistent with the remainder of the chapter.

Ordinance 5681 is essentially a housekeeping measure that will correct the inadvertent omission of the proposed changes to KMC 6.60.042 in the July 2016 adopted code amendments and create consistency with the remainder of KMC Chapter 6.60.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SECURITY SYSTEMS AND AMENDING
SECTION 6.60.042 OF THE KENNEWICK MUNICIPAL CODE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENNEWICK, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 6.60.042 of the Kennewick Municipal Code be, and the same hereby is,
amended to read as follows:

6.60.042: Identification Required:

(1) All persons who install, service, or maintain alarm systems must possess an
identification card supplied by the License Officer. Such individuals shall display this
identification card to persons lawfully on the premises where the alarm is located or upon request
by any police officer.

(2) Any card issued pursuant to this Section may be revoked or suspended by the
Police Chief upon conviction of any of the above offenses, after the card holder is given notice
and an opportunity to show cause why the revocation or suspension should not occur.

(3) ~~A renewal fee for the identification card supplied by the License Officer shall be
made through application and payment of \$75.00. Renewal of the identification card is required
in January of each year. If a criminal history check reveals that renewal applicant has been
convicted of any felony or any offense not constituting a felony but which because of its nature
would render the installer a security risk, or any offense involving moral turpitude as determined
by the Police Chief, the identification card to install alarms will be denied and the application fee
forfeited by the applicant. The License Officer shall collect a \$125.00 fee for each identification
card renewal. The Card shall be good for two (2) years from the date of application, barring any
cause for revocation or suspension that may arise after issuance. (Ord. 5681, Sec 1, 2016; Ord.
5008 Sec. 24, 2003)~~
