**Friday, July 8, 2016**

### C-Shift

**Community Care Fund/Canal & Columbia Center Blvd-** Officer Howard responded to a disabled vehicle blocking on Columbia Center Blvd. The driver is currently homeless living out of his van. He said he could not afford the tow bill and would lose his van if it was towed. We used the Community Care Fund to have the vehicle towed to Tri-Cities Battery where a new alternator was installed. Mel's donated the tow.

**Malicious Mischief/2300 blk W 16<sup>th</sup> Ave** - Complainant reported his vehicle was keyed overnight. No suspects.

### A-Shift

**Assault DV/600 blk S Kent St-** Male was on the couch and his mom told him to get off. He then struck his mom. He went to jail.

**Malicious Mischief DV/1800 blk S Honeysuckle St** - 16 year old male is living at his mom's house. He and his dad had a falling out and his dad wanted to sell the car he had purchased. The 16 year old rode his scooter from Pasco all the way to the listed address and found his dad locked him out. He took his scooter and smashed the window with it. He was screened into Juvenile then Crisis interviewed him due him yelling suicidal remarks during the incident.

**Disturbance/4th & Beech** - We responded to a "riot" called in by neighbors. It turned out to be a drunk male who began yelling and accusing everyone else, who were also intoxicated, of stealing his cell phone. He found his phone in his pocket and they told him to leave very loudly and in unison. No weapons as reported by the complainant.

**Dog Bite/1000 blk W 27<sup>th</sup> Ave** - The family boys were rough housing inside playing around when the family dog (a Mastiff) got in on the fun. Medics were able to stop the 17 year old son's bleeding from his thigh and transported him to Trios.

## **CAT**

**Warrant Arrest /900 blk W Columbia Dr-** Detectives Trujillo and Bennett observed a wanted male in the parking lot of the Bar. He quickly entered the bar where he and two others were all located inside. Each had 3 warrants (9 total) for their arrest and were booked into Benton County Jail.

### **C-Shift**

**Theft from Vehicle/1500 blk W 45<sup>th</sup> PI-** Complainant reported **his unlocked vehicle** was prowled last night and the suspect took a Dell laptop, and other miscellaneous items. No suspects.

**Property/00 blk N Kent-** Complainant reported he found a tool box in his 16yoa son's bedroom that he thought was stolen. The items were collected at his request and included a hard hat with several markings on it: "The Associated General Contractors of Washington," "Swinerton Builders," and "Tri Ply Construction LLC."

### **A-Shift**

**Warrant/7700 blk W Deschutes Ave-** A friend of the clerk was out in the parking lot when he noticed two transients lurking around. One of the males approached the complainant in an effort to get money for gas and offered to sell him "some sxxx." The complainant refused by buy anything from him and called 911. Officers were in the area and arrived immediately as a male and the suspect quickly drove off leaving one male standing there on the sidewalk. Driver of the vehicle was stopped and arrested on warrants and DWLS. The seller of "some sxxx" said he wanted to sell a battery charger and leather boots which was willing to part with in exchange for fuel.

## **Sunday, July 10, 2016**

### **C-Shift**

**Weapons & Narcotics/8<sup>th</sup> Ave & Green St-** A neighbor reported two males were walking in the neighborhood whistling at each other and looking into cars. They saw them meet up with someone and go to a back yard, then return to the street. Officers

Veitenheimer and Kuehny located two males, also gang members, hiding behind some bushes. Both were contacted and detained on warrants. Officer Kuehny located a .22 rifle magazine in a bag that one of the males had on him and asked him about it. He admitted he threw a gun under a tree. They located a sawed off .22 rifle with live rounds in his pocket. He also indicated he threw some meth in the yard. Officer Merkl and K-9 Bear responded and located a small amount of meth the male had thrown. He said they were looking for a place to smoke their meth. He is a convicted felon and booked for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Unlawful Firearm, and Possession of a Controlled Substance, and a warrant. The other male invoked and was booked on 4 warrants.

***Suicide Threats/8800 blk W Deschutes-*** Officer Engel responded to a report a female posted to Facebook she was going to kill herself and asked for help. There was no answer at the door, but they could see a note on the floor stating she was going to kill herself. The front door was breached and she was in bed. She said she was suicidal, but had not made any attempt yet. Crisis issued a Detain and Transport and she was transported to Trios. At the hospital she caused a ruckus and was arrested for interfering with a medical facility.

***Trespass/2900 blk S Waverly St-*** Officer Veitenheimer responded to a possible burglary in progress and contacted two males exiting the residence. One stated he was renting the location, but Officer Veitenheimer located a report where he was recently arrested from the location for trespassing and narcotics. He was released with follow up pending.

## **A-Shift**

***Theft & Warrant/2700 blk S Quillan St-*** Loss Prevention watched a male steal a bottle of alcohol and walk out of the store with it then put it in his trunk. Another male and two females walked out the store a few minutes later and got in the same car. Officers arrested one male for a felony warrant and theft 3<sup>rd</sup> and a second male for a misdemeanor warrant. The two females were released.




