**Monday, July 18, 2016**

### **C-Squad**

***Recovered Stolen/Canal & Garfield-*** Officer Davis dealt with a blocking unoccupied disabled car at the location. The plates returned to a recovered stolen truck from a nearby business, however the car the plates were on was a Chrysler Voyager. The Voyager returned to car dealership who when contacted realized they were missing the car. The Voyager had been stolen off the lot sometime over the weekend. The other business was contacted and their license plates returned. Their security video showed what appears to be a male stealing the plates on Friday morning. The Voyager was released to dealership.

***Auto Theft/600 blk S Washington St-*** Complainant reported that his car was stolen overnight. It had been parked at his apartment and he has the keys and title. The vehicle is a red 1995 Ford Thunderbird 2 door, with moon roof. The vehicle has been entered as stolen, there are no suspects.

***Burglary/00 blk N Washington-*** The rear doors to the business location had been pried open. The door jamb was pried from the hinges and the dead bolt pried open. The location was just sold and there is currently nothing in it. The owner walked through and confirmed that there was nothing missing or damaged on the inside.

***Warrant Arrest/200 blk W 6<sup>th</sup>-*** Female came to the station to pick up property out of safekeeping. Our Evidence Tech became aware the female had a local warrant. She was arrested on her misdemeanor warrant and booked into Franklin County Jail.

### **A-Shift**

***Disturbance/1300 blk W 13<sup>th</sup> Ave-*** Officers responded to another disturbance involving mother and daughter. There was a lull in disturbance calls at this address for a while but the daughter moved back with her mother. No assault, verbal only.

***Information-*** Officers respond to several suspicious person calls that turned out to be adults playing Pokémon Go during the late hours of the night. Several were warned about trespassing on closed business sites.

## **Tuesday, July 19, 2016**

### **C-Squad**

***Dog Bite/1100 blk N Grant Pl-*** Grandfather brought his 7 year old grandson to meet a dog they were thinking of adopting. He had been to the shelter previously and looked at the mid-size dog. The dog was brought out to play with them. They fed it treats and when his grandson approached the dog, it attacked the child. The dog was not provoked. The dog bit the child in the face causing fairly significant injury and tearing. The grandfather immediately intervened getting bit in the arm. KFD responded and transported for medical care. The child's eyes were not injured. The Animal Control Officer advised that the dog would be quarantined for 10 days and then euthanized. This incident was originally dispatched to BCSO, whose Sergeant requested to have KPD respond and handle. BCSO Sergeant did respond to the scene. Benton County Risk Management has already spoken with our investigating Officer.

***Fail to Supervise/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup>-*** Officer Buroker took custody of two small children that were found wandering around the complex by maintenance. The children were able to take Officer Buroker to their apartment which was. The mother was contacted. The two children were dirty, the apartment was filthy, rotten food was piled up, trash was everywhere, and dog/cat feces was on the floors. Officer Buroker cited the mother for not properly caring for and supervising her children. Discussions were had on what needed to be done, with a follow up visit by Officer Buroker to ensure corrective steps are being taken. There was food in the apartment for the children. Report forwarded to CPS to ensure continued proper child care.

***Disorderly Conduct/Columbia Park-*** Officers contacted a male in reference to him causing a disturbance in the park. He was yelling and cursing at people. He threw garbage cans at people and knocked over a posted sign. A female in the park pepper sprayed him when he approached her aggressively. He was having obvious mental health issues. His mother and his counselor were contacted. They advised that he is schizophrenic and having issues lately. The counselor thought that jail might be the safest solution. He was medically cleared and booked for disorderly conduct and destruction of property.

## **A-Shift**

**Theft from Vehicle/4900 blk S Olympia St-** Reporting party advised that unknown subject **entered her unlocked vehicle** and took her prescription medication. No other suspect info.

**Threats & Disturbance/2900 blk W 7<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Officer Hamel and Sgt Dronen responded to this address for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time tonight. Roommates got into an argument again and one was making threats he was going to kill someone. When officers arrived he became uncooperative and was hiding in the bedroom. Other officers arrived on scene to assist and containment was set up on the duplex until Sgt Dronen and Officer Hamel figured out what exactly we had. In the end the first male was a very unreliable witness and victim and since the second male is mentally unstable it appeared the best with no solid PC to discontinuing trying the effort of getting him to come outside. First male refused assistance in finding an alternate place to stay and in the end wanted to go back inside to his own bed. Both subjects have substance abuse and mental issues. The report will be forwarded to the Prosecutor for review.

**Assault/Deschutes Ave & Hawaii St-** Officer Sagen investigated a disturbance where the 13 year old complainant advised two other kids on bikes assaulted him and his friends by throwing Gatorade on them and pulled a knife at the nearby Circle K. A 13 year old male was identified as the one who displayed the knife in the altercation was located with a friend. He admitted to throwing the bottle of Gatorade at the male and when the male his friend quickly approached him he pulled the knife out of his pocket and the blade opened unexpectedly. He said he warned the male he didn't want to hurt anyone just wanted them to stop picking on his friend. Investigation revealed that the second male was the aggressor in this incident and by all accounts appeared to obviously be trying to provoke an altercation with the male because he had allegedly picked on his friend in the past at school. Suspects father was contacted and advised that after talking to the Prosecutor his son would be booked into Juvenile for aggravated assault with a knife.

**Shoplift/1300 blk W 4<sup>th</sup> Ave-** 22 year old female and 37 year old male shoplifted merchandise from the store and were caught by employees leaving without paying. Both were both booked for theft and the female also had several outstanding warrants.

## **Wednesday, July 20, 2016**

### **D Squad**

**Burglary/300 blk Canyon Lakes Dr-** Complainant reported she and her husband went for a short walk **and left their door unlocked**. When they returned they noticed \$90.00 had been taken from a bowl in the kitchen. No suspects.

**Domestic/800 blk W 40<sup>th</sup> Pl-** Male and female were verbal over dishes. No evidence or information concerning assaults. She left the location.

**Accident FTS&ID/900 blk W Columbia Dr-** Complainant reported that white Ford flatbed pickup hit her vehicle from behind. The suspect fled the scene and could not be located.

**Order Violation/3100 blk W Hood Ave-** Complainant reported that a male has been violating a protection order by contacting her via Facebook and emails. He has 2 prior order violation cases. He could not be located and a criminal citation will be mailed.

**Vehicle Prowl/2600 blk W 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that an unknown suspect **entered his unlocked vehicle** and took a camcorder, a camera, 2 laptops, DVD player and \$400.00. The video did not catch the crime. The management said there has been an increase of these types of crimes lately and asked for extra patrol.

**Counterfeit/5600 blk W Canal Dr-** Staff reported that a male gave them a fake twenty dollar bill. The serial number of the bill is 1E40492711C. This investigation will continue.

**Theft/400 blk W Entiat Ave-** Staff said they have video of a flashlight being stolen. Female was at the location to make a transaction and a male that was with her took the flashlight, concealed it and left without paying for it. She was contacted and identified the male. She said she did not have anything to do with the theft and the male did not discuss it with her afterward. The store video clearly shows the theft and his identity was confirmed with a photo. He lives in Benton City and a criminal citation was mailed to him for Theft.

## **B-Shift**

**Trespass/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave-** 37 year old male was walking around the store with no shirt or shoes on. The store manager asked him to leave, however he refused to do so. KPD was called, but the male had left the store before we arrived. A trespass form was completed and handed to nightshift in case we located him. At 2000 hours, Officer Brakebill located the male in the bathroom at the City Pool. He was given the trespass form and told he could not return to store. He stated he was headed for the mission in Pasco.

**Auto Theft/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave-** Complainant owns a blue colored 2001 Dodge Durango. On 07/19 he allowed a female drive him to Safeway. While he was inside the store, she left with the car. He made contact with her by phone, and she promised to return it. A day later and she still hasn't returned the car and stopped answering her phone. Vehicle has been listed as stolen. **\*\*UPDATE\*\*** Vehicle was located and returned to owner.


**Assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV/5500 blk W Hildebrand Blvd-** Officers responded in reference a male vs. female physical altercation. The female claimed that her boyfriend slapped and choked her after she caught him cheating on her. While taking a statement from her, Officers located the male walking through the parking lot. He was detained without incident. He admitted to slapping her in the face and was booked for assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV and a couple warrants. A no-contact order was issued.

Weapons Violation/1100 blk N Cleveland St- Officers responded to the area of 1100 blk N Cleveland Street reference several callers reporting shots fired. A search of the area revealed spent .40 casings in the parking lot. The immediate area was canvassed and no suspects/victims were located. While searching the area, a very intoxicated male came out of an apartment. He had a handgun tucked in his waistband. He complied with verbal commands and was detained without incident. The handgun was found to be a .40 caliber. The barrel to the gun was still warm and the rounds in the magazine matched the spent casings found in the parking lot. It is believed that he fired the rounds into the air. He was booked into the Benton County Jail.
