Thursday, July 21, 2016

D Squad

Trespass /4300 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officer Noble responded to a report of a male sleeping behind the location for several nights. He was contacted and trespassed.

Assault/1400 blk W 27th Ave- Male head butted another male in the face during an argument. The suspect fled prior to the officers arriving. H3 also has 4 warrants for his arrest. An area check was not successful. Case was forwarded for charges.

Assault DV/1000 blk N Volland St- Officers responded regarding a male/female physical altercation. The clerk called to report a domestic disturbance in the parking lot (in a car) between a male and female. A male was seen choking a female. The male then exited the car and got on the roof and started to jump around, damaging the car. Prior to police arrival, the male had fled on foot. He was last seen jumping over fences to the west of the store. Officers arrived and contacted the victim. She stated she had been in an argument with her boyfriend. She said he choked her and damaged her car. He was located at a nearby bus stop and was detained without incident. He denied harming his girlfriend or damaging her car. There were several witnesses, all of which provided statements confirming the victims story. He was booked for Assault 4th DV, Threats and Malicious Mischief.

B-Shift

Vehicle Prowl/300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant left his vehicle, a 2016 Dodge Dart, parked behind the business. Sometime between 0700 and 1615 hours, an unknown person entered his vehicle and stole his backpack containing an iPad, tools and other items. No witnesses or suspects have been identified.

Provoking Assault/1st & Cascade- 29 year old male was in the area of the parkade yelling profanities and causing a scene. He approached a male, who was walking in the area with his 2 children playing Pokemon Go. The first male asked the second male if he could use his phone. He refused and the first male started cussing and threatened to punch him. Officers located the suspect nearby and he was detained without incident. Once in handcuffs, however, he became uncooperative. He spit all over the back of a patrol car. He was upset that his backpack could not come with him to the jail. He stated that he would cause a disturbance at KPD when he returned to collect it after being released from jail.

Warrant Service/1000 blk W 4th Ave- 51 year old male got into an argument with his son. The son left prior to our arrival. According to dad it was verbal only. Dad had a felony warrant out of Franklin County. He was taken into custody without incident and transported to the Franklin County jail.

Theft Shoplift/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Officer Compton responded in reference to an uncooperative female shoplifter. Loss Prevention caught the juvenile female stealing makeup. They confronted her and struggled with her to get her in handcuffs. Upon arrival, the female was detained and waiting in the LP office. Officer Compton was unable to confirm the female's identity. She was obviously providing a fake name. While this was going on, Officer Johnson was in the 4800 blk W Clearwater looking for a runaway. Yakima County CPS was looking for a 15 year old female and had reason to believe she was in Kennewick. The shoplifter was found to be the runaway. She had a warrant out of Yakima as well. She was booked into Juvenile for the warrant. JCR completed for Theft, False Reporting and Obstructing.

Friday, July 22, 2016

C-Squad

Warrant Arrest/300 Blk W Kennewick- Officers contacted a male who is a transient. A citizen had requested a welfare check on the male. He was contacted and arrested on three warrants out of Kennewick.

A-Shift

Graffiti/Keewaydin Park- Graffiti was located on benches, concrete sidewalks and Gazebo poles. GAP notified.

Assault/00 blk W 3rd Ave- Male came to the location and was told by the female renter to leave. The male threw a black object from his pocket at her and injured her knee. She called 911 and he fled after retrieving the object. He was gone upon arrival. Citation forwarded for mailing.

Order Violation/3000 blk W 4th Ave- Male is the respondent in a No Contact Order with the reporting party. He was at the residence today arguing with her about her allegedly cheating on him. He was gone upon arrival.

Trespass/900 blk S Washington St- An intoxicated male was hanging around the store for a couple of hours wearing no shirt. He was trespassed from the location.

DUI/Clearwater & Quay- Officer Quinones stopped a male for lane travel and upon further investigation arrested him for DUI.

Warrant/4200 blk W Clearwater Ave- Female failed to show up for court last week and a warrant was issued. She was at her shop tonight and arrested without incident.

Urinating in Public/00 blk S Cascade St- An intoxicated male urinated on the wall of the Sports Page with several officers standing across the street. When an officer shined his light on him and asked what he was doing, he quickly zipped up his pants and said "I'm peeing." He continued peeing and was cited and released to a sober friend.

Trespass/400 blk E Bruneau Ave- The owner received an alarm from the location and when he checked the video he saw a male lurking around within the locked compound. Officers arrived and detained the suspect as he tried to flee on the railroad tracks. He was confirmed to be the person inside the compound and was booked for trespass.

Disorderly/5th & Quincy- We received numerous complaints of a male walking through yards yelling and standing in the middle of the road. He was contacted standing in the road yelling and obviously under the influence of narcotics. He was booked for Disorderly Conduct.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/4700 blk W Metaline Ave- Detectives Dorame and Schwartz observed a male walking on Metaline Ave. He was contacted and arrested for a DOC warrant. He was booked into Benton County Jail.

Saturday, July 23, 2016

C-Squad

Order Violation/4th & Union- Officers responded to the area for a report of a male arguing with a female, yelling that he was going to kill someone and a motorcycle seen driving recklessly from the area. On arrival Officers contacted male and female. Investigation revealed that they had been arguing with the female's father who sped off

on the motorcycle. A record check revealed a valid No Contact Order between the male and female, and also showed a valid arrest warrant for him. He was arrested and booked without incident.

Hit and Run/Columbia Center Blvd & Quinault Ave- Complainant reported that he was traveling west on Quinault when a bright blue Jeep Wrangler 4 door, driven by an older female with Blonde hair, entered the roadway from the Target parking lot and struck the rear driver's side of his Toyota Tacoma. The vehicle continued driving after impact and was lost in traffic.

A-Shift

Warrant Arrest/500 blk N Colorado St- Officer Sullivan arrested a 35 year old male for an outstanding warrant and booked him into jail.

Assault DV/4700 blk W Metaline Ave- Male and female got into a fight resulting in physical injury to both. She said he choked her until she couldn't breathe. She added that she had to pull his arms from around her neck to breathe. A neighbor came to the apartment and saw the male on top of her with his hands around her neck. He was booked for Assault DV and a No Contact Order was issued.

DV Malicious Mischief, Assault & Resisting Arrest/400 blk N Arthur St- Officer Hamel, Sgt's Dronen and Genack responded to a 16 year old Domestic Violence suspect. He was threatening his mother, throwing chairs around in the apt and breaking glass. On Officer Hamel's arrival the juvenile, who has a personality disorder, was ignoring Hamel's commands and tried to walk away from him. The male was resisting Officer Hamel's efforts to handcuff him but was able to pin him down on the floor until backup arrived. He was booked into jail for assault and Malicious Mischief DV and resisting arrest.

CAT

Theft, Warrant & Narcotics/Edison & Yellowstone- 'A' Shift & K-9 assisted 2 CAT detectives who were waiting for theft suspect and wanted narcotic dealer. CAT was advised the male had three warrants out of the Franklin County, deals drugs and carries a pistol even though he is a convicted felon. The male showed up with a female passenger a little after midnight. About 15 minutes after arriving, he drove off in a gray Ford Taurus and was felony stopped by CAT, 'A' Shift & K-9. He gave up without incident. CAT impounded the Taurus and obtained a search warrant. Cash, meth and heroin were seized. He was booked on a 72 hour hold for felony narcotic possession of narcotics and his warrants.

Sunday, July 24, 2016

C-Squad

Auto Theft/5300 blk W Okanogan- Complainant reported that his car was stolen during the night. His car had been parked out front of his residence. The car is a 1995 Toyota Camry 4 door, green in color with a red and blue flag sticker in the front passenger windshield. It also has damage on the front passenger fender. Car entered as stolen, there are no suspects.

Theft Shoplift/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Store loss prevention detained a male for shoplift. The male did not have any identification so an Officer responded to assist. The male provided a name of however we were not able to confirm his identity. The male was booked under the name he provided.

Community Care Fund/Columbia Park- Female was in the park at a birthday party with her children. She noticed a 4 year old boy that was lost. Parents were not able to be found and Officers responded. She cared for the lost child up until reunited with parents. It was then learned that she is on a fixed income and circumstances had put her in need until her next check on 08/01. She had not asked for assistance but the Officers learned there was a need. She was provided a room for her and her two boys. We also purchased a gift card at Safeway to provide food. The Safeway manager was not previously aware of the Community Care Fund and advised he will start the process to make this year's donation the Community Care Fund.

Weapons/Gage & Steptoe- At the end of shift Officers respond to a welfare check on a male that appeared very disoriented. Witnesses reported that the male fell down and passed out. Officers arrived to find the male laying on his side obviously under the influence. He had a pistol laying right in front of him and one hand underneath his body where it could not be seen. The male being unconscious, allowed the Officers to easily contact and detain him while securing the gun. The male has history to indicate he is a felon. He was medically cleared and booked for felon in possession of a firearm by A Shift.

A-Shift


