Tuesday, July 5, 2016

C-Shift

Malicious Mischief/2500 blk W Falls- An unknown suspect broke a window to the business between July 1st and 3rd.

Suspicious Fire/600 blk N Dayton- Kennewick Fire responded to a fence on fire at the location at 1000 hours. The homeowner said she heard possible fireworks prior to the fire starting. No suspects.

Assault DV/2700 blk W Kennewick Ave- Female and her boyfriend got into an argument. He tried to pull her up by her hair and reached back to hit her when a third party intervened. Boyfriend was located a short distance away and booked for Assault DV and warrants.

A-Squad

Theft/700 blk S Vancouver St- Complainant returned from her car and saw a gray passenger car occupied to two Hispanic males speeding off from the area where her car was parked. She found her window broken and her purse stolen. No further suspect info.

Burglary/200 blk E 1st Pl- Complainant found his fence gate forced open and his home entered. He found electronics and jewelry missing. He suspects his former son-in-law who has held a grudge against the family since his daughter left him.

Warrant/Kennewick Ave & Perry- Male was passed out lying on the ground in the area. He had a warrant and went to jail.

Trespass/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Management requested we trespass a male from the restaurant. He was located in a dumpster nearby and served with a 30 day trespass notice per their request.

Theft/00 blk S Kellogg St- Complainant found his WA license plate missing from his 1946 Jeep Willy's. No suspects.

Malicious Mischief/2100 blk S Sharron St- Complainant said he hired a firm to sell his house. He then changed his mind and the representative of the firm said "what goes around comes around" and left the residence. He later found his car rear passenger window broken. Nobody witnessed the crime and she had not returned our calls.

Assault/3000 blk W Kennewick Ave- A highly intoxicated male caused a ruckus at the location. He assaulted a patron and damaged a machine. Officers arrived and his wife was preparing to take him home. Due to high level of intoxication and continual vomiting, we cited/released him so his wife could take him home. A while later he was found lying in the street at Canal and Perry. Officers tried to assist him and he tried to charge the officers. He then went to jail.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/3000 blk W Kennewick Ave- CAT detectives observed two young females hiding behind a dumpster. The two were contacted and identified. The two were dumpster diving in the area. One was arrested for a theft warrant, trespassing and false reporting (lied about name) and the other was released to her father.

Order Violation/3500 blk W Hood Ave- Detective Riley spoke with a female who reports that she has a restraining order against a male. She advised over the past few months she has let him come over to the apartment to visit his kids. She said now she is mad at him, so she wants to report an order violation. Follow up to continue.

Wednesday, July 6, 2016

D Squad

Vehicular Assault/10000 blk W Clearwater Ave- Officers responded for a head on collision in front of the Calvary Chapel. The investigation revealed a male driver had been west bound on Clearwater headed to work in Benton City. He fell asleep at the wheel and crossed three lanes of traffic and hit another car head on which had been east. The other driver, 70's year old female sustained a possible broken pelvis in the collision. The male driver is believed to have broken his right wrist as well. Both were taken to Trios ER for treatment. At the time of the incident, the male driver smelled

heavily of marihuana. A search warrant for blood was obtained and possible charges of Vehicular Assault are pending toxicology results.

Resisting Arrest/1000 blk W 4th Ave- Male known to have warrants and also known to run from police, was seen in the area. When Officers attempted contact him he fled on foot toward the Kennewick School District offices where he was quickly apprehended. He was booked at the BCSO jail on his warrants and for resisting.

Aggravated Assault DV/1600 blk W 1st Ave- Officer Ayala contacted a female at Trios for a reported assault. She had visible injuries to her face and neck and reported she lost consciousness after being squeezed around the neck by her ex-boyfriend and father of children. Another male also had text messages of the suspect admitting to the assault that occurred after a male co-worker called her phone while she dropped her and his children off with him for the day. In an attempt to avoid a standoff thinking that he would attempt to leave with the children, officers staged in the area and a call was made to him telling him that Officers needed to speak with him. He exited the residence and walked to his vehicle with his children moments later where he was contacted and arrested without incident. He was placed on a 72hr hold for Assault 2nd DV.

B-Shift

Warrant Service/7700 blk W Deschutes Ave- Officer Compton contacted and arrested a female on an outstanding DOC warrant after she had been reported as a suspicious person.

Warrant Service/100 blk S Beech- Officer Sneyd contacted and arrested a female on two outstanding warrants. Officers had been dispatched to the residence for a possible disturbance which was unfounded.

Theft/2700 blk S Quillan St- Loss prevention reported that an unknown male entered the store and took a bag from a checkout stand. The suspect then selected 7 Nintendo controllers and placed them in the bag and attempted to exit the store. When confronted by loss prevention, the suspect ran to a waiting vehicle and fled the area. Loss prevention will be working on security video of the suspect.

Trespass & Assault/300 blk W 10th Ave- A 24 year old female was intoxicated and under the influence of meth. She was wandering around Kennewick and found herself in the backyard of a residence in the 300 blk W 10th Ave. The homeowner woke up after hearing her rummaging through things on his back patio. She cursed at him and then walked into the backyard of another nearby residence. She opened the rear sliding glass door at this location and walked inside. The homeowner heard some commotion in her kitchen and she confronted her in the kitchen. The suspect cursed at resident and attempted to pick up a small dog in the house. The homeowner managed to push the female out the front door and call 911. Officers arrived within a minute and detained

the female who was still out front. She was obviously under the influence and thought she was in Richland. She was transported to Trios, where she was medically cleared before being booked into Benton County. While at Trios she kicked Officer Sneyd in the leg. She was booked for Assault 3 and Criminal Trespass.

Malicious Mischief/200 blk S Johnson St- Officer Rosane responded to this residence for a disturbance in progress. The victim reported that her ex-boyfriend was outside kicking the door. Officers arrived on scene and contacted him in the parking lot. The door was checked and found to have been kicked open. He was arrested and booked for Malicious Mischief.

Thursday, July 7, 2016

D-Squad

Warrant Arrest/7800 blk W Quinault- Female was stopped for a traffic violation and found to have a valid arrest warrant. The record check also revealed that there was a No Contact Order between her and a male passenger who was the respondent in the order and also had a valid arrest warrant. Both were arrested and booked without incident at the BCSO Jail.

Weapons/2700 blk W 7th Ave- Officers responded to the Kadlec ER at 19th and SR395 for an adult male that had unintentionally shot himself. On arrival the 72year old was contacted. He had a bandage to his left hand and held it out to reveal a significant wound to his hand between the little finger and wrist. He stated he frequently inspects his pistol, an early model 1911 style .45, and he did so today. On this occasion he believes he dropped the hammer causing the gun to fire as he was racking the slide. The round passed through the side of his hand and into the mattress. The scene was inspected and evidence matches his account of the incident

Warrant Arrest/4th & Olympia- Female known to have warrants was seen in the area. She was contacted and arrested without incident.

Auto Theft/5100 blk W Clearwater Ave- Management reported that one of their rentals, a 2015 Chevrolet Equinox, was rented using stolen ID and documents. The vehicle is past its return date and has been entered as stolen.

Auto Theft/200 blk N Benton- Some time during the night, 2 vehicles were stolen from the location. 1.) 2000 Chrysler Voyager, light blue in color w/ no license plate on it. 2.) A black 2013 Cadillac. Both vehicles entered as stolen.

Drive by Shooting/1000 blk W 4th- Officers responded for a report of shots fired from a vehicle in the area and a male seen running away. Investigation revealed shell casings in

the roadway on Kent just south of 4th. Multiple witnesses stated a white Honda/Nissan type vehicle turned onto Kent from 4th and an unknown subject began firing at the male from the vehicle. CID responded and conducted a canvas of the area. The investigation is ongoing.

B-Shift

Shooting/4700 blk W Metaline Ave- Officers responded to a report of a shooting in progress in the parking lot. The complainant advised that two vehicles were involved and multiple rounds had been fired. Both vehicles left the scene prior to police arrival. Witnesses were located and recorded statements were taken. CAT processed the scene and collected casings. A non-involved vehicle was struck with at least one round. Area hospitals have been notified in case they have a walk in gunshot victim and an Attempt to locate has been issued for the vehicles involved. Both vehicles left the area at a high rate of speed.

Obstructing & Resisting Arrest/100 blk W 1st Ave- Officers responded to the area in reference to a theft call. The complainant advised that his father's phone had been stolen and the suspects were about to meet them. He further advised that his father was armed and planned to hold the suspects at gunpoint until officers arrived. As officers were responding it was reported that the two suspects had arrived and were now fleeing the area on bikes. Officers Sneyd located one suspect near 1st Ave and Beech St. Officer Sneyd attempted contact the subject fled on his bike jumping curbs and cutting through allies. When he reached the back of the former Bank of the West building at 1st Ave and Washington he hit a curb and crashed. He failed to comply with commands and resisted arrest. It was learned that the other male had the phone and his whereabouts are unknown. The other male was arrested for obstructing, resisting and a misdemeanor warrant. Kennewick Fire responded and transported him to Trios for injuries sustained in the bike crash. At Trios it was found that he had two broken ribs and a punctured lung. He was admitted and released from our custody.

Order Violation/300 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant reported that her ex-husband has been violating a no contact order by calling and texting her. At this time we have been unable to locate him. Follow up continuing.

Assault DV/1900 blk W 4th Pl- Complainant reported that her boyfriend became angry with her. He punched her in the chest, threw her to the ground and broke her glasses and Fitbit. He fled the scene prior to police arrival. Criminal citation forwarded to City Attorney for mailing.
