Thursday, July 28, 2016

C-Squad

Shooting/700 blk S Hartford- Male was preparing to 'clean' his Taurus .40 caliber pistol when he accidentally fired a round. The round passed fully through his hand and into his upper leg. The round traveled through the leg lodging in his lower leg. He was transported by KFD for medical care. There were no indications that this was anything other than improper firearm handling.

Child Neglect/100 blk N Buchanan St- Complainant called CPS and said his ex-wife dropped off their 2 year old daughter with him today in Pasco and said she could not care for her. He is disabled from a stroke, living out of his van, and said he could not care for her either. He called from a friend's house in Kennewick. She is a homeless drug addict and we could not contact her. Officer Harrington placed the child into the custody of CPS.

Assault DV/4600 blk W Clearwater - Officers responded to a report of two transients fighting in the parking lot of Winco. A witness reported a male strangled his girlfriend with a backpack strap and took off running. When officers located him, he failed to comply with their commands and was taken to the ground. He was booked for Assault 2 DV and Resisting Arrest. The Community Care Fund was used to put the victim up in a hotel for the night.

A-Shift

Burglary; Assault DV & NCO Violation/3000 blk W 4th Ave- Victim reported that her ex-boyfriend has had a NCO served against him and was arrested last week. He entered her apartment when she was not there and refused to leave. Another fight ensued and

he assaulted her again before running off. The area was checked but he was not located. ATL was put out and the case will be sent to Prosecutor for charges.

Trespass, Assault & Resisting/5200 blk W Clearwater Ave- Officers Sullivan and McGee responded to a male refusing to leave the gas station. The 38year old male was again causing the clerk difficulties similar to last night at the location. He was under the influence again and was acting very bizarre. When contacted and eventually placed under arrest for trespassing, he became aggressive and would not get into the police car. Even though cuffed, he resisted the officer's efforts to get him inside the car. After struggling with him and getting him half way in Officer McGee entered the back seat from the opposite side of the SUV to assist by pulling him into the car. Once inside and Officer Sullivan closed the door the suspect pushed off the closed door with his legs and attempted to head-butt Officer McGee who was still partially inside the backseat. He was taken to Trios for medical clearance and booked him for trespass, assault and resisting arrest. The subject is reportedly living out of a rented storage garage on Clearwater.

Burglary/2900 blk W Kennewick Ave- The manager reported that a subject overnight climbed over the locked fenced in area behind the store and forced entry into a locked storage box taking items from the box. The store's cameras captured video of the burglary suspect.

Theft from Vehicle/7000 blk W Canal Dr- Complainant advised unknown ***subject entered their unlocked vehicle*** and stole the Jensen in dash dvd stereo. No suspect info.

Burglary/1700 blk S Jean St- Complainant suspects that 2 of the 4 professional movers they hired entered their home after the other 2 drove a truck load of furniture to their new home in Richland. Stolen items include several firearms, tv, computers. Case forward to CID for review.

Shoplift & Possession Narcotics/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- 22 year old female from Sunnyside was attempting to steal about \$300 in merchandise but got spooked, dropped the items and fled but was located and detained by Mall Security and brought back to the store. She confessed to Officer Sullivan she was trying to steal the merchandise and was somehow able to defeat the security tags that were attached to the clothing. Search incident to arrest several loose pills were located in her possession that were identified as methadone and diazepam. Shewas booked into jail for the theft and the pills will be sent to WSP lab.

Friday, July 29, 2016

D Squad

Vehicle Prowl/3700 blk W 21st Ave- Complainant reported a unknown suspect entered her brother's vehicle and took her bag that contained her wallet. The bag was found in a neighbor's yard and the wallet is still missing.

Auto Theft/1500 blk W 6th Ave- Complainant reported that his 14 year old son ran away 7/27/2016 and took his white Chevrolet Caviler. He was entered as a runaway and the vehicle was entered as stolen.

Vehicle Prowl/2100 blk S Sheppard- Complainant reported that an **unknown suspect entered his unlocked vehicle** and took his wallet.

Vehicle Prowl/3600 blk W 22nd Ave- Complainant reported that **an unknown suspect entered her unsecured vehicle** and took a Tupperware container that she had cash in. The container was located in a neighbor's yard and returned.

Reckless Burning/8500 blk W Gage Blvd- Male set a fire and fled on foot. He was later contacted barricaded in his room. He later told Officer Reil that he was running from men with masks sprayed on their faces and he set the fire to get away from them. He was passed onto Crisis Response and this case was forwarded for review.

B-Shift

Theft/100 blk N Ely St- Loss prevention reported that a male selected a bottle of alcohol and then concealed it in his pants. When confronted, the male fled the store on foot. A citizen reported that the suspect went into a store across the street. Officer Sneyd contacted and detained the male. The alcohol was recovered and he was cited and released. He was also trespassed from the store.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/700 blk Vineyard Dr- CAT detectives observed a male walking down the street. He was contacted and arrested for a warrant and booked into Benton County Jail.

Burglary & Attempted Auto Theft/1100 blk N Edison St- At 0012 hrs officers were dispatched to a burglar alarm. CAT arrived within a few minutes and observed an unoccupied vehicle in the drive thru, and a broken window on the southwest corner of the bank. Sgt. Isakson could hear someone inside the bank breaking items. The bank was surrounded by patrol and CAT, and Officer Kohn was notified. About 10 minutes later a male attempted to exit the broken window. The male was given commands to exit the building, and he was taken into custody without incident. The suspect was cut on his legs and arms and appeared to be under the influence of alcohol and drugs. The suspect was identified as a 19 year old male. The bank was cleared, and nobody else was found

inside. The inside of the bank had been severely damaged. The vehicle located in the drive thru belonged to the bank, and the suspect had broken a window on the car to gain entry, and it appeared he was trying to steal it. He didn't give an explanation why he broke into the bank. He was medically cleared at Trios and booked into Benton County Jail for Burglary 2nd, Malicious Mischief 1st and Attempted Auto Theft.

Saturday, July 30, 2016

D Squad

Assault DV/1500 blk Columbia Park Trail- 14 year old male reported that his father threw a stick at him. He said he was throwing sticks at his father and was warned and told his father to bring it. Dad threw a stick at his son, hitting him in the head. The City Attorney's office was contacted and they wanted to review the report and it was forwarded to them. It was decided that the 14 year old was going to stay with his older brother for a few days. Later his mother called and was told that she cannot be involved in the situation because she was being held in Contempt of the Court by violating their parenting plan.

DUI/10th Ave & Vancouver St- Officer Harris responded to a collision. The driver of one of the vehicles appeared to be intoxicated. He was booked for DUI.

Trespass/500 blk W Columbia Dr- Staff reported a male was asking for money or beer from patrons of the store. He was intoxicated and when the patrons refused the male would become aggressive with them. When he was contacted by officers he walked away, ignoring their commands and reached in his pocket. He refused to obey commands to show his hands. He was taken into custody and when a witness contacted the officers the male threatened him. The male was recently released from DOC. He was booked at the BCSO Jail for Obstructing and he was trespassed from the location.

Domestic/1000 blk W 5th Ave- 17 year old male was upset and smashed some household items during an argument with his mother. He left the scene prior to the officer arriving. Mom did not want any charges filed. A JCR was forwarded to the juvenile prosecutor for review.

Burglary/5200 blk W Canal Dr- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect broke into her storage unit and took some items.

B-Shift

Assault DV/3200 blk W 4th Ave- Officers responded to a disturbance at this apartment. Male reported that his girlfriend attacked him and scratched his lip. She was contacted and arrested for assault DV.

Warrant Service/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Officer Compton contacted a male in the mall parking lot. He had two felony warrants out of Juvenile. He was arrested and booked.

Vehicle Prowl/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant reported that sometime between 1800 and 1930 hours, an unknown person entered his locked 1996 Nissan pickup. Several bags containing recently purchased clothing/merchandise were taken. No witnesses or suspects have been identified.

Suicide Attempt/2800 blk S Hartford Pl- Complainant called 911 to report that her boyfriend was suicidal. She explained that she has been dating him for several years and they have a child together. This evening, she decided to end the relationship with him. He became very emotional and stated that he was going to shoot himself. She decided to leave the house with her child. She left the front door wide open. Officers contacted her down the street. She did not see him with a gun, but told us that he does own a handgun. Officers attempted phone contact with the male but he would not answer. Officers hailed the residence for several minutes with negative response. Due to the fact that no crime had been committed, officers cleared. The female and child were given a ride. Officers asked that she not return to the house without contacting the Police first so that we can make another attempt to contact the male.

CAT

Field Arrest/4th & Yelm St- CAT detectives responded to a disturbance involving two females. As the detectives arrived in the area the suspect vehicle was observed driving off. The vehicle was stopped and the driver of the vehicle claimed she didn't have identification, but provided a name. Upon further investigation detectives found out her real name and she was arrested for Driving While License Suspended 3RD and False Reporting. She was booked into Benton County Jail. The passenger in the car claimed she didn't have identification, but provided a name. Detectives were unable to verify this information and had to let the passenger go. Later in the evening detectives checked Facebook, and realized the passenger had provided a false name. She had 4 warrants for her arrest out of Ephrata. Detectives went back to 4th and Yelm and found her sleeping in the suspect vehicle. She was contacted and arrested for 4 warrants and false reporting. She was booked into Benton County Jail.

Sunday, July 31, 2016

D-Shift

Auto Theft/700 blk S lone - Complainant reported his blue 2001 Kia Optima stated that it was parked in the driveway at 2300 hours and was found to be missing at 0730. No leads or suspects and vehicle entered in ACCESS as stolen.

Domestic & Firearms/00 blk W 6th Ave- Officers responded a report of a male damaging property with a bat. He was contacted and detained as he attempted to leave the property. Investigation revealed that he was attempting to locate a shotgun that was stolen from his vehicle. It turns out that the male allegedly stole the shotgun and a significant amount of other property during a series of burglaries in Oregon. It was also determined that he threatened his girlfriend with the bat during the disturbance. He was arrested and booked for domestic violence; the shotgun was recovered at the scene, vehicle impounded for search warrant. CID contacted and case forwarded to detectives.

Warrant Arrest/8th & Dayton- Male that was known to have valid arrest warrants was seen in the area, contacted and arrested without incident.

Auto Theft/1900 blk N Pittsburg- Complainant reported that sometime between 7/29 and 7/31, his 2004 Dodge Ram 2500 diesel was stolen from his residence. He had been out of town for business and found the truck missing when he returned home. The vehicle is a blue in color, four doors and a short box. Truck has been entered in ACCESS as stolen.

Auto Theft/6200 blk W Canal Dr- A Silver 2014 Hyundai Elantra, four door, no license plate, was stolen from the lot overnight. No plate on the vehicle. Vehicle entered in ACCESS as stolen.

Assault/1000 blk W 4th Ave- Officers responded for a report of a male who was assaulted, unconscious and bleeding heavily from the head. On arrival a heavily intoxicated male was found unresponsive on the ground, bleeding heavily from the back of his head. The investigation revealed that he had been pushing and pulling his girlfriend so she left to a neighbor's residence to get away from him. He then began pounding on another neighbor's door. When that neighbor opened the door the male attempted to punch him. In response the neighbor knocked the male unconscious causing him to strike his head on the ground. The male regained consciousness and was transported to Trios. Report completed and sent to the City Attorney for review. Report linked to CID.

Field Arrest/Columbia Park- Officers Cooper and Melone were working the Boat Race detail in Columbia Park. They assisted BCSO deputies who were contacting a male and female who were trying to sneak into the races without paying. Both were detained. Both were verbally uncooperative. The male resisted arrest but was handcuffed without major incident. A loaded .40 caliber handgun was found in his waistband. Both subjects were booked into Benton County.

B-Shift

Auto Theft/00 blk E 1st Ave- Complainant reported that her vehicle was stolen this afternoon. She thinks two males took her vehicle. Both males are "acquaintances" who have been hanging around with her the past day or so. The stolen vehicle is a black colored 2012 Honda Civic 2-door. Listed as stolen.

Theft Shoplift/1100 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Officers responded in reference to a male that was cutting tags off property. Upon arrival, Officers contacted Loss Prevention in the security office. LP was following a male through the store via camera. He selected a HD TV and was pushing it around in a cart. He had also selected some garden shears, and was using the shears to cut the spider wire from the TV packaging. He worked on the spider wire for about 15 minutes, but couldn't cut it off with the shears. He went to the front of the store and tried to find the actual tool used to take apart the spider wire. No luck. Frustrated he left the store where he was contacted by Officers Sneyd and Compton. He was taken into custody without incident and booked for destruction of property and attempted theft.


Assault 4th DV/1300 blk W 3rd Ave- Complainant reported that her husband grabbed her, choked her and prevented her from calling police. He left the residence prior to police arrival. He could not be located. The victim reluctantly reported that she and her husband had been in a verbal argument this evening. She mentioned that she found some drugs and paraphernalia around the house. She decided to flush the drugs and destroy the paraphernalia. This infuriated him and he shoved her to the ground before leaving. She refused to provide specific details about the incident, and refused to provide a written statement or allow photographs of some bruising to her arm that occurred during the altercation tonight. Report has been sent to the City Attorney's office for review.

Trespass/600 blk W 10th Ave- This morning at about 0150 hours the complainant heard some noises coming from the yard next door. They know the home is vacant and has been for about 2 months. Officers arrived and found a side door had been kicked in. Before containment could be made, several (3-4) juveniles ran from the house out the back door. Officer Jones caught one that couldn't make it over the fence. The juvenile female was identified as 13 year old female. She was transported to KPD and later handed off to her grandmother. JCR completed. The other juveniles were not located. A message was left for the listing real estate agency.
