### C-Squad

**Vehicle Prowl/400 Blk S Dayton St- Complainant** reported that his 1992 Toyota Camry was broken into on July 2<sup>nd</sup> while parked at the library where he works. There was no damage done to the car. He waited until today to report it as he was gathering information to assist Police. He did locate footage on security video of a male breaking into the car and removing items. He also advised that he located fingerprints on the inside of the car windows. Officer met with the victim, dusted for prints, and collected the security video. The identity of the suspect is not known. It is also not known what was taken from the car.

**Trespass/400 blk N Volland-** Officer Nebeker was at this location on a call when he noticed a vehicle that he knew to be associated with a male who was previously issued a trespass notice from this location. He was located and arrested for trespass.

**Vehicle Prowl/400 blk N Columbia Center Blvd-** Complainant reported that **her unlocked car** was entered and items stolen during the night. The items included her cell phone and a credit card. The card was used around 04:00. Follow up being done to obtain security video.

**Theft/4800 blk W Clearwater Ave-** Complainant reported that a female suspect stole one of their tables. The female loaded the table into a small red car occupied by two black males and left in the car. The female was identified by someone who saw the Facebook post. Follow up continuing.

### A-Squad

## **Tuesday, August 2, 2016**

### **C-Shift**

**Assault & Malicious Mischief DV/5900 blk W 17<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Night shift responded at 0530 hours to a domestic where a 26 year old male had damaged several areas of the house with a baseball bat, spit in his father's face, and pushed his mother out the front door as she was calling 911. When officers arrived, he barricaded himself inside the house where he had access to firearms. Dayshift obtained a search warrant and officers entered to find him passed out inside a locked bathroom. He was taken into custody without incident and booked into jail after medical clearance. His parents said his behavior has become erratic lately due to alcohol and narcotics, and possibly a mental illness.

**Warrant Arrest/600 blk S Washington St-** Officers responded to a tip a wanted male was at the location and had several warrants. He was booked into Benton County.

**Theft/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd-** Mall security reported an employee had stolen money that had been turned into her. She eventually admitted she used some of the money for lunch and a phone charger. She turned over the \$45 she had left. She was booked for theft and trespassed from the mall.

**Eluding/700 blk S Volland St-** Officer Cooper observed a vehicle run a red light at Kennewick Ave and Vancouver St. He attempted to stop the vehicle at Kennewick Ave and Vista. The vehicle continued slowly to the intersection of US 395 where it accelerated and ran the red light. Officer Cooper pursued until the driver began driving recklessly and terminated. He saw a Hispanic male driver and black male passenger. The owner of the vehicle lived in the 700 blk S Volland where officers located the vehicle unoccupied. The owner said the driver and passenger were inside her residence and retrieved them. Male admitted to driving and was booked for Eluding, Driving with a suspended license 2<sup>nd</sup>, and a DOC warrant. His passenger tried to jump out a window until he saw officers. He was booked on several warrants.

## **A-Shift**

**Graffiti/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant found four different garages spray painted in black paint. No suspects.

**Assault DV/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Male became upset over things missing in the residence and started blaming the roommates (his brothers). His brother had a pair of his brother's socks on so he assaulted him and went to jail.

**Theft/400 blk N Georgia St-** Complainant found two solar lights missing from the residence. No suspects.

**Theft/100 blk E Kennewick Ave** –Complainant found his bottle of Oxycodone missing from his glove box. No suspects

**Warrant/400 blk E 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Male called Dispatch after his roommates kicked him out and wouldn't allow him to get his stuff. They wouldn't answer the door and he had a warrant. He went to jail.

**Malicious Mischief/4800 blk W Clearwater Ave-** At 02:43 hours Dispatch broadcasted alert tones for shots fired into the residence which turned out to be a rock thrown through a window and two vehicle's rear windshields broken outside the residence with rocks. The complainant's 16 year old son has been getting into trouble and left the residence about an hour prior. He was not located. No suspects or injuries.

## **CAT**

**Warrant Service/1200 blk E 6<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Detectives Trujillo and Bennett arrested and booked a female into Franklin County Jail on a felony warrant. She was uncooperative and head-butted and kicked the patrol car. There were no injuries or damage.

## **D Squad**

**Assault DV/2900 blk W 19<sup>th</sup> Ave-** 41 year old male shoved his 18 year old nephew, causing him to fall and cut his arm. He left the scene and was contacted on Ely and was arrested and booked for Assault DV and a warrant.

**Order Violation/200 blk W 6<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that her ex-boyfriend has been texting and emailing her in violation of a No Contact Order. Officer Harris called

the male, but he did not answer. A message was left telling him to call and he has not. There is probable cause to arrest him for violating a No Contact Order.

**Harassment/4500 blk S Everett-** 64 year old female reported she was threatened by her 21 year old grandson. She said he said he was going to hit her and then said he was going to pour gas on her and light her on fire. There were no witnesses but the conversation was recorded by her. She left the scene prior to officer arriving. Prosecutor's office said he should be arrested for Harassment and the Prosecutors office would review the case. Victim was told to call the police immediately if she has any more problems with her grandson and was told to petition the courts for an Anti-Harassment Order. There is probable cause to arrest him.

**Vehicle Prowl/400 blk Clover Island Dr-** Complainant reported that an unknown suspect entered her locked vehicle and took a mason jar containing cash. There was no damage to the vehicle. .

**Assist Fire/200 blk N Fruitland-** KPD assisted KFD with an RV on fire at the location. On arrival, a 5<sup>th</sup> wheel trailer was found fully engulfed and had spread to a nearby motorhome. The flames were extinguished, but both RV's were a total loss. While on scene it was determined that numerous subjects had been living in RV's on the property which violates city codes. All were advised that they could not live on the property and would be required to vacate. The Community Care Fund was used to provide temporary lodging and KFD also coordinated with the Red Cross to identify and provide additional resources.

## **B-Shift**

**Assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV/5500 blk W Hildebrand Blvd-** Officers responded in reference to a physical domestic between two females. Officers contacted two females. Second female stated first female and at third female were in a verbal argument earlier this evening. During the argument the third female apparently struck the first. She was uncooperative and refused to provide a statement and the suspect had left prior to Officer arrival. Her whereabouts are unknown at this time. Criminal citation for assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV sent to City Attorney for mailing.

## **CAT**

**Recovered Stolen Vehicle, Narcotics & False Reporting/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Detectives Dorame and Bennett were conducting surveillance for a wanted gang member and observed a stolen 2001 Kia Optima driving through the parking lot. A traffic stop was conducted as the car parked and the driver was identified. Two passengers were identified. One of the passengers had the keys and attempted to disassociate herself with the car before providing a false name because she had a juvenile warrant. One of

the occupants dumped marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The female with the keys was booked into Juvenile and the case is being forwarded up for review. The stolen car was returned to the owner, but suffered body damage from several minor collisions.


