### D Squad

**Order Violation/200 blk E 15<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that the neighbor tied lattice to his fence. He has a No Contact order with his neighbor as the respondent. The served order specifically states that she will not tie anything to his fence. The neighbor is listed as the suspect for violating the same order on two prior occasions. Both of those cases were forwarded to the City Attorney to be reviewed for charges. This case was forwarded to the City Attorney as well. There is a modified order that needs to be served on neighbor that adds the complainant's wife as a protected party. Officer Quinones attempted to serve the modified order but she did not answer the door.

**Assault DV/700 blk S Sharron-** Female slapped male in the face several times for using the wrong coffee cup. They live at the same residence. She has a mental condition and was transported to Trios by medics for evaluation. The case was forwarded for review concerning charges.

**Order Violation/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Male was knocking on female's door in violation of a court order. He fled prior to the officers arriving. There is probable cause for arresting him and an ATL was broadcast.

### B-Shift

**Assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV/2100 blk N Steptoe-** Officers responded to this address regarding a civil type situation. A 44 year old male was attempting to collect some property at the residence. He wanted the police to assist because there was a protection order between him and the other party. The order had not been served yet. Prior to police arrive he became upset. He punched and shattered a car window belonging to the female. She was inside the car when he punched through the closed window, slightly striking her. He then left in his vehicle and phone contact was made with him. He was less than cooperative and told officers he was going to kill himself instead of going to

jail. An ATL was completed. A citation has been completed and sent to the City Attorney for mailing.

**Assault of Child/4700 blk W Metaline Ave-** Less than 4 month old baby girl was brought to Kadlec in Richland by her parents. At the time the child had a decreased level of consciousness. ER doctors went to work and placed her into a medically induced coma. She was transported to Sacred Heart in Spokane. Doctors believed she suffered from "shaken baby syndrome". Detective Sgt Simington was notified. Detective Baynes respond to assist with the investigation.

**Order Violation/3000 blk W 4<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant called 911 to report that she had just been assaulted by her boyfriend. He fled on foot prior to police arrival and could not be located. There is a valid pre-trial protection order, listing the male as the respondent. The female explained that despite the order, she has been allowing him to stay with her because she feels sorry for him. This evening, they got into a verbal argument. She stated that he grabbed her by the neck and punched her one time in the face. A mark below her right eye confirms her account. There is probable cause for felony order violation. An ATL was broadcasted

**Warrant Arrest /7<sup>th</sup> Ave & SR 395-** Detectives Riley and Dorame contacted a male at the Metro Mart and arrested him on an outstanding DOC warrant. He was booked into Benton County.

## **C-Squad**

**Stolen Vehicle/1000 blk N Volland-** Officer Nebeker stopped a 90's Honda Accord for a traffic violation. Shortly after initiating the stop, Dispatch put out priority KPD that the car was returning as stolen out of Pasco. Officer Nebeker recognized him and had the male step from the car and advised him that he was going to be detained. The suspect attempt to run, resulting in him being taken to the ground. A continued struggle ensued. A citizen at the store stepped in and assisted in controlling the suspect which allowed him to be placed into handcuffs. While the arrest was taking place the stolen Honda rolled backwards and into Officer Nebeker's patrol car. The open driver's door hit the push bumper of the Patrol SUV. There was no visible damage to the patrol vehicle. The door of the Honda was forced open and no longer shuts. The male suspect was booked for possession of stolen property and resisting arrest.

**Auto Theft/1000 blk W 14<sup>th</sup>-** Complainant reported that her white 2001 Pontiac Sunbird was stolen during the night. The car was parked at the residence around 23:00 and

gone this morning. **The car was left unlocked with the keys in the car.** The vehicle has been entered as stolen, there are no suspects.

**Assault/1600 blk S Dennis St-** 18 year old female reported her 57 year old step-grandfather asked her for a hug. When she hugged him, he placed his hands down the back of her pants under her underwear. He was interviewed and admitted to the touching. Report forwarded to the Prosecutor.

**Vehicle Prowl/4100 blk W Metaline Ave-** Male was in his living room and looked outside to see a male enter his vehicle. He did not know the male, so he retrieved his shotgun and confronted him. The suspect began to run, but stopped when confronted with the shotgun. The suspect was under the influence of meth and stated he was looking for a puzzle in the car. He was booked.

## **A-Squad**

**Assault/1500 blk N Edison St-** Male had a party at his apartment and an unknown male showed up and consumed a lot of alcohol. He then assaulted a female guest and was asked to leave by the complainant. The suspect then assaulted the complainant. Officer McGee arrived and when placed under arrest the suspect fought. He was booked for Assault 3 and reviewed for the misdemeanor offenses. Officer McGee sustained minor scratches and a scrape where the suspect attempted to bite him.

**Arson/400 blk E Bruneau Ave-** Two dumpsters were set on fire at the location next to a gas main which also ignited. Kennewick Fire arrived and quickly began working the fire until the end of shift. Investigation continuing.

**Attempted Theft of Motor Vehicle/52900 blk W Canal Dr-** Detectives Salter and Riley assisted patrol with a theft of merchandise from a store in the 5300 blk W Canal Dr. A male was located and identified as the thief. The business chose to have the suspect trespass and released. It was then discovered numerous vehicles had been broken into across the street at the car lot and the male had discarded paperwork from one of those vehicles during police contact. That vehicle had been started and was running. The male was re-contacted and arrested for attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

## **C-Shift**

Officer Duty spoke with her over the phone and she declined assistance from Kennewick Police or Crisis and would not say where she was. There have been 4 similar calls with her since June.

***Shoplift Arrest/5200 blk W Clearwater Ave-*** Male was arrested for theft of alcohol. He was a .35 on the PBT. After medical clearance from Trios he was booked into jail.

***Burglary/500 blk E Bruneau Ave-*** Officer Hughes responded to a report of a burglary around 2000 hrs. Owner arrived and found a subject had forced entry into the business via a side door. The office was ransacked, unsure what was stolen except for petty cash. No suspect info at this time.
