Monday, August 8, 2016

D Squad

Vehicle Prowl/6800 blk W Canal Dr- Complainant reports that an unknown suspect entered one of the store's vehicles and took \$3,000.00 worth of equipment.

Mental/3000 blk W 4th Ave- Female was causing a disturbance due to mental issues. Crisis issued a Detain and Transport and she agreed to go to Trios and was transported there.

B-Shift

Trespass/3800 blk Plaza Way- Staff called to report that a male was verbally argumentative and would not leave the facility. Officers arrived and contacted the 30 year old male. He agreed to leave the area, however a few minutes later he was seen attempting to get back into the ER. He was contacted again and given a second warning to leave. He refused and was placed into custody without incident and transported to the Benton County Jail where he was booked for Trespass 2nd.

Trespass/100 blk E Kennewick Ave- Complainant reported that last week a 36 year old male caused a disturbance. The male returned this evening and in spite of not causing a problem tonight, they still wanted the male trespassed from the location. He was contacted in front of the location and was trespassed for 1 year.

Malicious Mischief/1200 blk E 6th Ave- Male discovered that his estranged wife was dating someone. He went to the house and got into a verbal argument with his wife. During the argument, the first male punched the second male's vehicle. The punch left a decent sized dent in the rear quarter panel. Suspect then left the scene. Officer Jones was able to track him down Diehl and cited and released him for destruction of property.

Theft/7700 blk W Deschutes Ave- Employee had her purse hanging up in the employee's only room. After work she discovered her purse was missing. She checked store video surveillance and discovered that a Hispanic female entered the employee-only room, taking a jacket and her purse.

Vehicle Prowl/7900 blk W Quinault Ave- Complainant was staying at the motel and looked out her window to see a male prowling cars. She called 911 to report what she was seeing. Officers arrived in the area a few minutes later. The suspect could not be located. Only one vehicle was found to have been prowled. The owner of the vehicle was located. He reported some cash and a cell phone charger stolen. The suspect was described as a white male, possibly high school age, with dark curly hair.

Auto Theft/2400 blk S Tacoma St- Complainant woke up at 0140 hours to the sound of his truck starting in his driveway. He looked out his bedroom window to see his brown colored 2011 Chevy Silverado 1500 backing out of his driveway. The truck then sped off, heading north on Tacoma St. He admitted that he left his truck unlocked with the keys in plain view on the dashboard. The truck was entered as stolen. No suspect info.

Tuesday, August 9, 2016

D-Shift

Auto Theft/9300 blk W 7th Pl- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect **took her unlocked white 2011 Chrysler 300 Class C.** The vehicle was entered as stolen.

Mental/3400 blk W 4th Ave- Female took 30 pills with alcohol in an attempt to harm herself. Medics transported her to Trios where Crisis Response will contact her.

Burglary/3500 blk W 46th Ave- An unknown suspect pried the doors to the residence open to gain entry into a new construction house. A tile saw, pain sprayer and smaller tools were taken.

Assault/400 blk E Bruneau- Complainant reported that his supervisor punched him in the face. The case was forwarded to the City Attorney for review.

Vehicle Prowl/7700 blk W 4th Ave- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect entered his vehicle and stole his .45 caliber Taurus Judge.

Mental/3700 blk Canyon Lakes Dr- Male was having mental issues and was transported to Trios for a Crisis Response evaluation on a Detain and Transport.

B-Shift

Auto Theft/100 blk W Columbia Dr- Complainant works at location and he stepped out of his work vehicle (a 1997 Dodge Caravan) to inspect a few storage units. When he returned a few minutes later, the van was gone. He called 911 to report it stolen. Prior to our arrival, dispatch advised of a hit and run that occurred near Layton Park. A white minivan hit a stop sign near 6th & Cedar and some juveniles were seen running from the vehicle. Officers arrived and found the van, unoccupied. A 15 year old male was seen running in the area. He was detained without incident. He denied stealing the car or being in it, and no witnesses could be identified. He was released to his parents. Officers were unable to identify solid suspects in this case. The van was released back to the owner.

Burglary/8600 blk W Canyon Ave- Complainant reported that between 1200 and 1430 hours this afternoon an unknown person entered his home. A medium sized water bong smoking device was taken from his garage. Additionally his son is missing a PlayStation PS4 gaming system. The PS4 was taken from the son's bedroom. The residence was examined, and there were no signs of forced entry. The complainant reported that the front door and rear slider were left unlocked. The neighborhood was canvassed; however no witnesses could be identified.

Fraud/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- A 45 year old male attempted to cash a fake check in the amount of \$944. The business denied cashing the check and would not give it back to the male who fled the area and was not located by police. Apparently the same subject successfully passed a similar check in a Richland store last week. The same male is a suspect in a vehicle prowl that occurred earlier in the day.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/1500 blk W 4th Ave- Detectives Bennett and Riley observed a male with 5 warrants parked at this location. He was arrested without incident and the detectives located drug paraphernalia. K9 Officer Merkl and Bear were called out. The car was towed for a narcotics search warrant. Follow-up to continue.

Warrant Arrest/4th & Gum St- CAT detectives responded to a disturbance at this location. Two subjects were contacted inside a vehicle. One claimed she was in a verbal argument with her cousin, and this resulted in a concerned neighbor calling in on them. The other subject was booked into Benton County Jail.

Wednesday, August 10, 2016

C-Shift

Auto Theft/5100 blk N Edison St- Complainant reported his maroon 1996 Acura Integra 4-door was stolen from his parking lot overnight. The paint on the vehicle is peeling and faded on the top and it has chrome wheels. The keys were not with the vehicle and there was no broken glass at the scene.

Urinating in Public/600 blk N Arthur St- Two residents of the apartment complex reported a male urinated near the dumpster while facing the public. They said this was the second day in a row he has done this. He lives with his mother in the complex. He was cited for UIP and trespassed from the complex.

Theft/4400 blk W 10th Ave- The manager reported a male stole two energy drinks and a case of beer. The video was too poor for identification, but he was described as being in his 20's, slender with short brown hair. He was driving an older white pickup with racks in the back.

Trespass/3100 blk W Kennewick Ave- Female appeared to be under the influence of meth and was wandering around town disturbing people with her antics. After several calls we located her and trespassed her from several businesses in the area.

Auto Theft/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant reported he parked his white 1994 Acura Integra 2-door in front of the UPS store where he worked at 1400 hours and it was gone at 1600 hours. He said it has black wheels and the keys were not with the vehicle.

A-Shift

Burglary/1700 blk S Jean St- This vacant home is being remodeled and was broken into recently. It was broken into again tonight. Investigations are working the previous case. Forwarded to Investigations.

Assault/100 blk N Union St – Female was at the location acting bizarre and screaming at people. She demanded a ride from a male at the location who refused. She pushed him and kicked his car leaving a dent. She then fled on foot and was not located. Later she called in and upon arrest went ballistic. She was cleared at Trios and booked into jail.

Hit and Run/2800 blk W 10th Ave- Female was on a scooter crossing from the north side of 10th to the south side at the crosswalk with the crosswalk signal telling her to cross. An older, small white pickup ran the light and struck her in the thigh and ran over her scooter's rear wheel destroying it. The suspect fled east bound.

Assault DV/600 blk N Arthur St- An intoxicated male assaulted his girlfriend by striking her in the side of the head causing her ear to bleed. The female victim was uncooperative. He was booked for Assault 4th DV.

Theft/700 blk W Canal Dr- Complainant said while out riding his bike he stopped for a beer and when he went to leave he noticed his bike was stolen. Brand new EVO High Life black cruiser worth \$300.

CAT

Warrant Arrest & Narcotics/2800 blk W 10TH Ave- Detective Schwartz and Dorame observed a male driving on 10th Ave. The vehicle was stopped and driver was arrested for a warrant and with a suspended license. Detectives searched the male and located heroin in his pocket. His vehicle was towed for a narcotics search warrant. This is the 4th time this year CAT has towed his vehicle for thefts and narcotics. The two passengers' in the vehicle were released. He was booked into Benton County Jail. Follow-up to continue.

Thursday, August 11, 2016

C-Shift

Attempted Auto Theft/5000 blk W Clearwater Ave- Complainant found his vehicle near the entrance of the parking lot, 50 feet away from where he parked it. A shaved key was jammed in the driver's door and two more shaved keys on a seat. He said his exhaust is very loud and he would have heard it start. The suspects likely pushed it to the entrance of the lot and tried unsuccessfully to start it. Latent prints were collected from the vehicle.

Order Violation/3300 blk W Clearwater Ave- Officer Veitenheimer responded to a report of transients sleeping in the stairwell of the location. She contacted a male and female. The male had a warrant and was the respondent in a no contact order with the female. He was booked for Order Violation DV and his warrant. Both were trespassed from the location.

Graffiti/700 blk S Auburn- Staff reported tagging to the south side of their building with black and white paint. GAP was notified.

Theft/5200 blk W Clearwater Ave- An employee reported a male concealed alcohol in his pants and left the store. They saw him contact a female behind the store and hand her the bottle. Officer Harrington contacted both subjects and the male was booked for theft.

Theft/2700 blk S Quillan- Loss Prevention reported a male took items and left in a vehicle. They got the plate of the car and Officer Veitenheimer used the information and Facebook to determine the suspect. Officer Banner located him with his friend and

when he made contact, the male friend ran because of a warrant. Theft suspect returned the property and he was cited for theft.

Mental/Gage & Louisiana- Officer Davis responded to a report of 88 year old male causing a disturbance. He was gone upon arrival, but received another call of the walking in traffic in 8500 blk W Gage Blvd. He was contacted and taken into protective custody due to his severe dementia. At Trios he was uncooperative and sedated. He will be held at Trios until an Alzheimer's home is secured for him.

Recovered Stolen/100 blk E 13th Ave- Officer Duty ran the plate of an unoccupied silver Honda Civic and discovered it was stolen from Richland. Nobody answered the door at the residence, but a neighbor said he saw a thin white male who was bald with the vehicle two days ago.

A-Shift

Rape/1500 blk N Edison St- Officer McGee responded to Juvenile Detention to take a rape report from a 16yera old female. She had been picked up by Richland PD on a warrant and after arriving at Juvenile advised the staff that she was raped last night and wanted to report it. Report forwarded to CIU for follow up.

CAT

Warrant Arrest & Narcotics/18000 blk S. Hawthorne St- Detectives Schwartz and Dorame were driving past a house when they observed several people standing outside. The detectives exited their vehicle to make contact when a male dropped to the ground behind a car. The detectives contacted the male and recognized him as having a DOC warrant and Franklin Co Warrants. The male had dumped an ax handle and methamphetamine on the ground. He was taken into custody. The detectives also recognized a female and took her into custody for a Spokane County warrant for Dangerous Drugs. They were both transported to Benton County Jail.
