Monday, August 22, 2016

D Squad

Theft/1700 blk S Clodfelter Rd- Complainant advised that sometime during the night someone had broken into a work trailer at the location and stole construction tools. No leads or suspects.

Suicide Attempt/00 blk N Mckinley- Officers responded for a report of a male subject who had stabbed himself in the stomach with a steak knife. On arrival he was found with a stab wound to his stomach. He was highly agitated, making repeated comments about killing himself, and unpredictable. He was transported to TRIOS for treatment and CRISIS evaluation.

Auto Theft/Kennewick Area- Rental car company reported that a 2016 Ford Edge with Oregon plates had been rented by a male. He employees that he had loaned the vehicle to a friend and that she had not returned it to him yet. The female has been identified. Vehicle entered in ACCESS as stolen.

B-Shift

Malicious Mischief/5000 blk W Clearwater Ave- Complainant reported that a rock was thrown through the front window of her residence. She only heard the glass break and does not know who threw the rock. Officer Compton located a witness who advised that he saw several young black males running from the area at the time of the incident. A suspect cannot be identified at this time.

Disturbance/900 blk N Cleveland St- Officers responded to the 900 block of N Cleveland regarding a report of 10-15 subjects verbal and physical in the street. The anonymous reporting party stated the subjects involved were black males and females. The reporting party stated that at least 4 of the subjects involved pulled up in a silver

colored Cadillac Escalade and were trying to pick a fight with others. Officers arrived and noticed approximately 20 people in the street, all scattering in different directions. No fighting was seen and no one claimed to be injured. Those that did stay claimed that the argument was verbal only. Apparently three females arrived in the Escalade. One of them was accusing someone of stealing a dog from her. Only one of the three females was located, and she was less than cooperative.

Tuesday, August 23, 2016

D-Shift

Auto Theft Recovery/2700 blk S Quillan St- Benton County SO developed information as to the location of the previously stolen Ford Edge during their ongoing robbery investigation. The vehicle was recovered in the parking lot and impounded by BCSO regarding their investigation.

Assault/700 blk S Dayton St- Officers responded for a report of a male who had pointed a gun at a 13 year old male while at the skate park. The 13 year old fled the skate park on foot to across the street where he requested assistance. He reported that a black male had pointed a gun at him and fired it one time. The investigation revealed the victim was at the skate park and was being picked on by a number of the kids. While there he saw the suspect, who had previously given him problems. On today's date the 13 year old attempted to take pictures of the male for the purpose of identifying him. When he saw this, he chased him to the corner of 8th and Dayton where witnesses stated he fired multiple times at the victim from what is believed to be a BB gun. The 13 year old was not struck and suspect was later identified and fled the scene when he saw officers. He has not been located at this time. Follow up continuing.

Auto Theft/1400 blk E 4th Ave- Complainant reported his 1995 Dodge Caravan was stolen from outside his residence in the early morning. While reporting the incident, he provided a Facebook post from WSP about a vehicle involved in a collision and the driver booked into the Franklin County Jail. He stated the vehicle in the photo was his. Contact was made with WSP who confirmed the information and also advised that the driver at the time of the collision was booked at the FCSO Jail. The suspect was contacted at the FCSO Jail and provided a post Miranda statement during which he stated he got the vehicle from a known transient in Kennewick. Report has been forwarded to the Prosecutor for charges.

Auto Theft/100 blk S Conway Pl- Complainant reported that his green 1997 Honda Accord, was stolen during the night. No leads or suspects, vehicle entered as stolen.

Auto Theft/6800 blk W Kennewick- Complainant reported that her boyfriend's vehicle, a green 1997 Honda Civic 4 door was stolen sometime during the night. No leads or suspects, vehicle entered as stolen.

B-Shift

Warrant Service/2500 blk S Conway Pl- Officers received a tip a 51 year old male was at the location. He was found to have three warrants. Officers contacted him at the house and he was taken into custody without incident. Booked into the Benton County Jail.

Welfare Check/2200 blk W Kennewick Ave- The resident at this location noticed an elderly male pacing back and forth on the sidewalk in front of his home. He made contact with the male, who was obviously suffering from dementia as he could not remember his name or address. Officers made contact with the male who told Officers he was trying to walk to the Uptown to have a beer. He was found to have 2 warrants for his arrest. He was taken into custody and booked at Benton County.

Fraud/00 blk W 36th Ave- 49 year old male was contacted by phone by a male who stated he worked for the IRS and was going to freeze his checking account due to taxes not paid. He also told him he had a warrant for his arrest. The victim fell for the scam and agreed to purchase \$14,100 in iTunes cards so he wouldn't get arrested. He bought the iTunes cards and provided the male with the card numbers and pin numbers. He later contacted his personal accountant, who convinced him the whole thing was a scam and he needed to call police.

Recovered Stolen/5300 blk W 26th Ave- Complainant called to report a suspicious vehicle and trailer parked on her street. She advised it had been there for a couple of days. Officer Johnson located a blue Ford Focus sitting on a trailer. Both had been reported stolen out of Pasco on 08/17/16. The owner was contacted and he later collected the vehicle and trailer.

Suicide Attempt/800 blk E 6th Ave- Officers responded to this address regarding a male named stating he wanted to kill himself. Prior to our arrival he had reportedly cut his wrist and then fled his house. Officer Canada located him nearby. It was determined he did cut himself, however the cut was to his hand and was superficial. Medics arrived and gave him a bandage. He stated he was depressed. He denied wanting to kill himself, however agreed that he made several vague comments. He agreed to speak with Crisis. A meeting was set up for him.

Suicide Attempt/1100 blk W 10th Ave- Officers responded regarding a male that had stabbed himself in the leg. Upon arrival, Officers found the 18 year old bleeding heavily from the upper right thigh area. Castaneda was unconscious but breathing. Medics arrived and transported him to Trios. The ER doctor advised the male had a single stab wound to the right thigh. The reporting party was identified and stated the male came

by this evening heavily intoxicated. She stated he was very depressed over the death of a friend. She claimed that out of the blue, he grabbed a kitchen knife and stabbed his own leg. She tried to calm him down and attempted to walk him to her car in the parking lot but he collapsed and passed out due to all the blood loss. The apartment was examined and there is nothing to indicate anything other than what was reported happened. He is a documented gang member and has a warrant for his arrest out of Pasco. He was admitted at Trios and at the time of this report was in surgery to repair his leg. His condition is serious.

Wednesday, August 24, 2016

C-Squad

Recovered Stolen/6500 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officers responded to a parking complaint of a Honda parked in a resident's driveway. The Honda was a green 1997 Civic that was reported yesterday. The vehicle was about two blocks from where it was stolen. It was unoccupied and no apparent damage done to it. The car was released to the owner. No suspects.

Theft/2800 blk S Underwood- Complainant reported that his vehicle was prowled during the night. His center console was left open, which is where his wallet and handgun had been. The stolen firearm is a Springfield XD .40, serial number XD419604. There are no suspects.

Vehicle Prowl/3300 blk W 34th - Complainant reported that their truck had been entered during the night and several hundred dollars in gift cards were stolen. The truck was parked at their residence. No sign of forced entry. No suspects.

Vehicle Theft/4100 blk W Clearwater- Male contacted the dealership reference purchasing a car from them. The dealership picked him up at a local motel. At the dealership, he provided a ID and credit card to pay for the car. The card was a business card and was declined. He provided a story and requested that they 'force' run the card. The dealership did and allowed him to leave with the car. The card transaction did not go through as the card is not a valid card. The motel has no record of the male staying with them. The suspect has significant history of fraud crimes and may live on west side of the State. The car was entered as stolen and is a maroon 2001 Cadillac Deville 4 door. There are no plates on the car. Report forwarded to Prosecutor for charging.

A-Shift

Theft/300 blk S Union St- Complainant and the newer owner of the business advised unknown subject stole his coffee shop type shed 4X8 worth about \$10,000. This appears to be a civil incident where the subjects that took the shed had supposedly purchased it

from the previous owner, but were very slow to pick it up. The newer owner advised the shed was on his purchase contract, but could not produce any further info on this at this time. Report for info only at this time.
