Thursday, August 25, 2016

C-Squad

Recovered Stolen/400 blk E Kennewick- Tow Company removed a vehicle from Hawaiian Village on August 3rd. The car returned as being stolen on 6/16/16 from the Day's Inn in Kennewick. The car is a tan 2000 Lincoln Towncar. The towing company will be following up with the insurance company who has already paid out on the claim from the victim. No suspects.

Fail to Supervise/2600 blk W 1st Ave- A juvenile court employee reported a 1 and 5 year old were at this residence unattended. Officers arrived and could not get anyone to come to the door. The residence was searched and they located the mother asleep in a locked bedroom with a male. The residence was filthy. Mom was cited for fail to supervise and the report was forwarded to CPS.

A-Squad

Robbery/6090 Blk N Ely Pl- Complainant said a Hispanic male in his 20's with a unknown description tattoo on the left side of his face came to the location where he and several friends were sitting on the curb smoking cigarettes and demanded one of their cell phones. The suspect then allegedly pulled a pistol from his waistband to get the cell phone. When all was examined there were holes in their stories and we found nothing to confirm their allegations. We released the victim after statements. No locate on the suspect.

Theft/2900 blk W 19th Ave- Complainant reported her X-box and other items were stolen from the residence. She said she knew who took the items but wouldn't tell who it was. She wanted it documented only.

Friday, August 26, 2016

D Squad

Mental/3000 blk W 4th Ave- 15 year old male posted on Facebook that he was going to kill himself. After trying several addresses he was located at the above location. He was cleared by medics and was with his adult Aunt who said she would get him in touch with his counselor.

Trespass/3100 blk W 7th Ave- The property manager for the vacant location arrived and heard someone inside. The property manager ordered the person out but the suspect did not comply. Officers checked the residence and located a male inside. He said he has been staying in the vacant residence off and on for a year. He was booked for Criminal Trespass.

Vehicle Prowl/4700 blk W Metaline- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect **entered his unlocked vehicle** and took his wallet, \$400.00, GPS and speakers.

Urinating in Public/100 blk W Kennewick Ave- Staff reported a male was sleeping in the front of the business doorway, blocking the entrance. He was contacted and agreed to move on. As the officers were entering the business to talk to the complainant, the male was seen urinating on a sign a few steps from the business. He was arrested and booked for UIP.

B-Shift

Burglary/2800 blk W 10th Ave- Loss prevention stopped a male after he shoplifted a watch from the store. He had previously been trespassed from the store so he was arrested for burglary 2nd. During the search incident to arrest heroin was also found on his person.

Fraud/00 Blk N Union St- Officer Johnson contacted the complainant in reference to a fraud. She reported she used her debit card at the ATM and left it behind. After realizing her card was missing she checked her account and found 3 fraudulent charges. Officer Johnson is attempting to identify the stores the card was used at. Follow up continuing.

Forgery/3000 blk W Kennewick Ave- Staff reported that a male and female were inside attempting to cash a fraudulent check. Officer Rosane stopped the suspect vehicle and identified the occupants. Staff further advised the male had been in the previous day attempting to cash another fraudulent check. The female was cooperative and provided a recorded statement about the incident. The Prosecutor was contacted and she requested the male be booked on the fraud.

Saturday, August 27, 2016

D Squad

Trespass/1400 Blk E 4th Pl- Officer Quinones responded to a suspicious person in the area. A male was seen trespassing on railroad property and he refused commands to stop. He then entered a gated and locked city compound. The male was detained there. He had a DOC warrant and was in possession of PUD property. He was booked on the warrant, 2 counts of Criminal Trespass and Possession of Stolen Property.

Counterfeit/4500 blk W 27th Ave- Employees said that the manager of a convenience store brought in a counterfeit 50 dollar bill. The serial number is I170399434A. The investigation is ongoing.

Vehicle Prowl/3900 blk S Cedar- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect **entered his unlocked vehicle** and took a laptop, Galaxy Note and various chargers.

Domestic/00 blk N Shepard - Officer Harris responded to disturbance reported by a neighbor. One resident was contacted and said the disturbance was verbal only and his partner had left. He had scratches on his face and there were broken items on the floor. The case was forwarded to the City Attorney for review.

B-Shift

DUI Collision/Kennewick Ave & Union St- Officer Sneyd responded to a one vehicle collision in the roundabout at Kennewick Ave and Union St. Male drove through the center of the roundabout and then struck a light pole before coming to rest in the HAPO parking lot. Witnesses reported he attempted to leave the scene but was unable to due to the severe damage to his vehicle. A search warrant for blood was obtained. He was arrested and booked for DUI and violation of an ignition interlock device (2 previous DUI's).

Assault DV/6600 blk W 20th Ave- Complainant reported that her 78 year old brother recently moved in with her and her husband. At that time her brother had a gun which was secured in a safe that he does not have access to. Tonight he wanted the gun back and began causing a disturbance. When she advised no, he went to the kitchen and grabbed a knife which he threatened her with. He was arrested and booked for unlawful display of a weapon DV per the Prosecutor's Office. A No Contact Order was issued.

Sunday, August 28, 2016

D Squad

Order Violation/400 blk S Dennis- Officer Noble responded to a disturbance. Male was at the location in violation of a court order and was refusing to leave. He told the resident that if the resident wanted him to leave he would have to call the police. The resident did and when officers arrived the male fled on foot. He was quickly apprehended and arrested. He did not comply with commands and was painted with a taser before complying. Once in the patrol vehicle he hit his head on the Plexiglas several times and when he did not get the reaction he was hoping for stopped. He was booked for an Order Violation, two Felony Warrants and two Misdemeanor Warrants.

Burglary/1600 blk S Dennis Pl- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect forced entry into her garage and took 2 tool boxes, a radio, weed eater and 2 tackle boxes.

Vehicle Prowl/4000 blk S Morain Lp- Complainant reported that an unknown suspect broke the passenger side window out of his vehicle and took some change and a tachometer.

B-Shift

Assault/500 blk N Morain St- Officers responded to Crisis Response for a report of a male out of control in the lobby. He had been transported and dropped off at Crisis by Pasco PD. After Pasco left he began hitting walls and charged at a counselor who had to retreat to a back room for her safety. He was arrested and booked for assault.

Burglary/400 blk S Ely St- An unknown suspect broke into two trailers in the lot sometime during the past day. One trailer was missing a TV.

Theft/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Loss prevention observed a female conceal items in her purse and then leave the store without paying for them. She stated that she thought she could put items in her purse, take them to her vehicle and then return to the store to pay for them. She was arrested for shoplift and an outstanding warrant.

Assault/7300 blk W Bonnie Ave- Officers responded to a report of an assault with a knife and a male stabbed in the hand. Upon arrival contact was made with a male who had a few minor cuts to his fingers. He reported that he arrived at the trailer and observed a male urinating in the parking lot. He confronted the male and an argument ensued. He said that the suspect was sitting in a car at this point and had something shiny in his hand. He reached into the car and grabbed the suspect's hand and cut his fingers. The suspect was identified but he left on foot prior to police arrival. It appears the victim grabbed hold of a set of keys which had a cork screw and small utility knife attached. Case forwarded to City Attorney for review.
