**Thursday, September 22, 2016**

**A-Shift**

***Unlawful Imprisonment /Felony DV No Contact Order/4300 blk W Hood Ave-*** Officers responded to a neighbor's report of a DV disturbance in progress. Upon arrival officer could hear a female screaming and a male yelling from inside. When officers knocked on the door the female tried to open it but the 24 year old male slammed the door closed and locked it and prevented the female from opening it or getting out. Due to emergent

circumstances of a domestic violence assault in progress, the door was forced open immediately and he was taken into custody without incident. A records check showed he was in violation of a no contact order and was not supposed to be at the victim's residence. He was booked into jail for domestic violence assault, unlawful imprisonment, not allowing the victim to leave the apartment and felony violation of the DV order.

***Inhaling Toxic Substances/SR 395 & Vista Way-*** Officers were called by Ben Franklin Transit to assist with a 33 year old male rider who was sitting in the back of the bus passed out after sniffing/inhaling an aerosol can of "air duster" out of a brown paper bag. After medics attended to him he was booked into jail.

***Accident- Fail to Stop and ID/SR 395 & Yelm-*** A witness called in saying they observed a semi-truck and trailer make a u turn on Yelm just north of SR395 and clip and break a wooden utility pole. The witness then followed the truck that left the scene without stopping and assisted officers in directions until they got into the area. The semi was stopped on SR 397 just south of E. 1<sup>st</sup> Ave and the driver was contacted. The driver advised he did not realize he clipped and damaged the pole while he was turning around on the side street due to being lost. Report forwarded to City streets and electrical.

***Internal Theft/3600 blk W Clearwater Ave-*** Manager advised that a recent now former employee was caught on camera stealing cash out of the store till. A citation was sent to City Attorney for mailing by Officer Scott since the suspect is avoiding contact. Pasco PD has had a previous case with the suspect for the same type of crime at a convenience store in Pasco as an employee.

***DV Assault/600 blk S Jean Pl-*** Officer Thatsana investigated a DV assault where suspect fled the scene prior to officer arrival. A citation for DV Assault was forwarded to City Attorney.

## **C-Squad**

***Trespass/1000 blk W 4<sup>th</sup>*** Male was contacted for causing a disturbance at the location. He does not live there but attempts contact with a female resident who does not want anything to do with him. Incident was handled via issuing a trespass warning. He refused to leave. He was warned what his refusal would result in his arrest. He continued to refuse to leave and was arrested and booked for trespass.

***Order Violation/4300 blk W Hood Ave-*** Dayshift had arrested a male on felony order violation charges and booked him into jail. This evening the business where the victim works reported that he had called several times. Investigation indicated that he had in fact called twice making contact with the victim in violation of the court order. Jail staff was requested to revoke his phone privilege. Routing paperwork completed requesting additional charges of order violation in this case.

**Assault/400 blk W 16<sup>th</sup>** Staff, who provides care and housing at this location, reported again that a male had left the location. He was located a short time later and returned to the home. As usual he was cooperative with Officers. Once at the home, he began hitting his head on the concrete steps to the front porch. Staff was able to get him inside. A commotion was heard and Officers entered the residence where he was actively assaulting a staff member as they tried to restrain him. Officers took over and got him calmed down. Staff has a crisis plan in place with Crisis Response, which initiated to handle. Report completed and forwarded to City Attorney for charging review reference the assault.

**DUI/Clearwater & Union-** Officer Harrington arrested a 22 year old female for DUI. She was very intoxicated. On the way to the jail she got sick and vomited all over the patrol car. Officers responded to Trios to have her medically cleared. Once at Trios, blood evidence collected via search warrant. She was booked for DUI. Patrol vehicle was taken to the jail who did clean up while Officer Harrington handled search warrant and medical at Trios.

## **CAT**

**Warrant Arrest/4<sup>th</sup> & Vancouver St-** CAT detectives observed a male who was contacted and arrested for a Franklin County Warrant. He was booked into Franklin County Jail.

**Narcotics & Weapons/400 blk S Green Pl-** During the investigation CAT detectives located a suspicious vehicle leaving the driveway of a vacant house in the 400 blk S Green Pl. The vehicle was stopped and the occupants of the car were identified. Detectives could see used syringes and a spoon with residue inside the vehicle. The three occupants were detained and one had a double edged dagger concealed in his waistband. He was arrested for possessing a dangerous weapon and booked into jail. The vehicle was towed for a narcotics search warrant.

## **Friday, September 23, 2016**

### **B-Shift**

**Theft/2900 blk W 46<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Officer Meiners contacted complainant in reference to a theft report. She is in the process of selling her residence and has had a number of showings. She advised that two wedding ring sets have come up missing. Officer Meiners is in the process of contacting real estate agents who have shown the residence.

**Auto Theft/3000 blk W 4<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that sometime during the night an unknown suspect stole his green 1995 Acura Integra. The vehicle was locked at the time of the theft and all keys are accounted for. Entered as stolen.

**Malicious Mischief DV/2600 blk S Ledbetter St-** Officer Sneyd responded for a DV in progress. Complainant reported that her 25 year old son smashed her TV and broke her mirror. The two had been arguing and she called his wife an obscene name. He was arrested and booked for malicious mischief DV.

**Burglary/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that her detached garage had been burglarized within the past few days. The unknown suspect gained entry by breaking through the drywall from an adjoining garage which is currently empty and unsecured. The suspect stole a set of tools.

**Assault DV/4200 blk W 17<sup>th</sup> Ct-** Officer Rosane arrested a 16 year old male for assaulting his father. Dad was attempting to take his son's cell phone away and his son struggled with him and bit him twice on his hand. He was arrested and booked for assault DV.

**Assault DV/5100 blk Columbia Park Trail-** Officer Quinones contacted a female at Trios in reference to an assault. She reported that she and her boyfriend began arguing while in his vehicle. She said he punched her multiple times, attempted to strangle her and then pulled her down to the river in Columbia Park and attempted to drown her. She did have some injuries but nothing consistent with her story. She story changed as more detailed questions were asked. The boyfriend was contacted by phone but refused to meet in person or give his whereabouts. He reported the two were arguing while driving on 240 and Rosales attempted to grab the wheel multiple times and he had to fight her away. He also reported that she attempted to jump out of the vehicle while on the freeway. Case forwarded to the Prosecutor for review.

## **D Squad**

**Assault DV/400 blk N Arthur-** Complainant called dispatch and reported that her husband had assaulted her. She told officers they were arguing and he punched her in the stomach and grabbed her by the neck. As soon as she realized he was going to jail she refused to give any more information and wanted to re-cant what she had already provided. She said she did not want a No Contact Order. He was booked for Assault 4<sup>th</sup> DV.

**Theft/00 blk S Gum St-** The clerk said a white male about, 5/07 stole an 18 pack of beer. The suspect possibly has tattoos on his forearms, was clean shaven and has a buzz cut. The manager will be able to check the store video.

**Assault/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-** 17 year old male assaulted a 14 year old male. They do not know each other; but the 17 year old walked up to the 14 year old and a friend and

grabbed him and threw him to the ground. The 14 year old knew he was injured when he hit the ground. The 17 year old was high on acid and was held on the ground until officers arrived. The victim was transported to Trios by medics for his knee injury. The suspect resisted arrest and was transported to Trios for medical clearance by an ambulance, strapped to the stretcher. He continued to resist at the ER and was sedated twice before he was manageable. He had several abrasions and contusions, all self-inflicted. He was eventually medically cleared and booked at Juvenile for Assault and Resisting Arrest.

**Threats/Clearwater & Leslie-** Complainant reported that her uncle sent her a text threatening to kill her and her father. He said he also received a text from his brother and said he would kill him as well. She said her uncle had been arrested in the morning and she thought he would be in jail for the week end, but he was released. After he was released is when he threatened to kill her, her father and a second male. The on call Deputy Prosecutor was contacted and said to arrest him for felony Threats. A No Contact form was completed.

## **Saturday, September 24, 2016**

### **B-Shift**

**Vehicle Prowl/300 blk N Filmore St-** Complainant reported that during the night an unknown suspect stole a Ryobi table saw out of the bed of his truck. The saw was not secured in any way.

**Arson/ 8500 blk W 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported that last night sometime before 2030 hours an unknown suspect attempted to start a fire in her planter box. The box smoldered but there was no other damage.

**Malicious Mischief/6800 blk W Canal Dr-** Staff reported that sometime during the night two of their delivery trucks were vandalized. The unknown suspect cut the fuel lines on both trucks and broke the window out of one of them.

**Burglary 800 blk N Sheppard Pl-** Officer Rosane contacted complainant in reference to a burglary report. He advised that last night **he accidentally left the man door to his garage unlocked**. An unknown suspect entered the garage and stole tools and a laptop computer. An area canvass did not reveal any witnesses.

**Threats/300 blk N Union St-** Complainant reported that she has been receiving threats from her ex-boyfriend via Facebook. He is upset that she got rid of some of his marijuana and is refusing to give him money. He sent a photograph of himself holding a pistol. Officer Sneyd responded to Pasco to attempt to arrest him on the threats and warrants but he was not located. Case forwarded to the Prosecutor for charging.

***Warrant Service & Narcotics/700 blk N Tweedt St-*** Officer Sneyd arrested a male on four outstanding warrants. Search of his person incident to arrest a small amount of heroin was located. The heroin has been sent to the lab for analysis and he was booked on the warrants.

## **D Squad**

***Warrant Arrest/Columbia Drive & Gum-*** Officer Engel stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. The male passenger in the vehicle was arrested on multiple warrants. While in route to the jail he started to cry and said he needed medical attention because he had shot himself in the stomach with a nail gun yesterday. He said he had already been to Lourdes in Pasco for the injury. The jail staff said he needed to be medically cleared because he asked for medical attention. He was transported to Trios and medically cleared. He was booked on his warrants.

***Burglary/4700 blk S Garfield-*** Complainant reported that an unknown suspect entered his residence via the slider and took his 50" television. Nothing else was missing.

***Auto Theft/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup> Ave-*** Complainant reported that an unknown suspect took his red Oldsmobile Alero. The vehicle was entered as stolen.

***Accident-Failure to Stop and ID/4<sup>th</sup> Ave & Olympia-*** Complainant said a silver sedan passed another vehicle and as he did he struck her vehicle on the left front making her vehicle inoperable. The driver of the suspect vehicle briefly contacted her and told her to get back in her car and he would push her off the street. When she did the male fled the scene in his vehicle. The suspect is a Hispanic male with short black hair. He was wearing light t-shirt and has a moustache.

***Accident Fail to Stop & ID- W 36<sup>th</sup> Ave & Vancouver-*** Male was driving under the influence and hit a parked car. A witness saw the male driving with no headlights and followed it to the residence house. He was contacted and said he has drank Vodka as soon as he arrived home. He was charged with FTS&ID.

***Narcotics/200 blk S Johnson-*** Officer Engel responded to a possible vehicle prowler. A male matching the description was contacted and identified. He had a warrant for his arrest and was in possession of heroin. He was booked for Possession.

**Sunday, September 25, 2016**

**B-Shift**

**Warrant Service/3400 blk W 7<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Officers responded to this residence for a suspicious activity call. The complainant advised the neighbor had run an electrical cord from his outlet to their property. Contact was made at the offending residence and he was arrested on an outstanding warrant. He initially provided his brother's name and was charged with false reporting. The complainant did not want to pursue criminal charges regarding the theft of electricity.

**Forgery/3300 blk W Clearwater Ave-** Officer Sneyd contacted complainant in reference to a forgery report. She reported that her son had been living with her and her husband. In August her husband died and she found that her son stole multiple firearms and other items from the residence in Finley. He was eventually arrested on the theft of firearms by Benton County. She has since found that vehicle titles to two vehicles and a boat were also stolen. Those titles were then forged and placed into her son's name. She believes that all the vehicle have been sold to support his drug habit. Initial report completed and forwarded to CID for review.

**Graffiti/00 blk W 1<sup>st</sup> Ave-** The south side of the building was tagged with the same graffiti as earlier in the week. The business has security cameras and one faces the area of the graffiti. GAP was also notified.

## **D Squad**

**Assault/7000 blk W Clearwater Ave-** Complainant said he was assaulted by two males at the above location. Investigation is continuing.

**Warrant Arrest/2600 blk W Bruneau Pl-** Officers responded for a report of subjects on the property who were not allowed. On arrival, several transients were contacted along with 17 year old female. She was found to have a valid arrest warrant and was taken into custody and booked without incident. At the time of this incident a male was contacted regarding the transients on the property. He advised that they could stay for the night. Officers responded later in the shift for a call from a female demanding that transients be removed from the property. On arrival she stated she is the manager of the property and her boss told her that the transients had to leave. She was very demanding and told officers they had to make the transients leave. She was asked if the first male was also an employee and she said yes. She was advised the make had given permission for the transients to remain for the night and officers would not get involved unless the property owner provides clarification as to if transients persons are allowed to stay on the property during the night. She became argumentative and was advised to have the property owner call or come to the location so we could establish a consistent plan regarding transient persons at the location, and also determine who has authority to make decisions on behalf of the owner.

**Warrant Arrest/4800 blk W Clearwater-** Officers responded for a report of a male refusing to leave the location. On arrival he was contacted and found to have warrants. He was arrested and booked.

## **Monday, September 26, 2016**

### **A-Shift**

**Hit & Run Collision/1700 blk W 7<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Complainant reported unknown vehicle in the last 24 hrs struck their parked 2009 purple PT Cruiser, denting the driver door. No further info.

**Theft from Vehicle//3500 blk W Imnaha Ave-** Complainant advised unknown subject **entered her unlocked vehicle** and stole items from her purse, including a Samsung prepaid phone and \$40 in cash. No other info at this time.

**Field Arrest/E 2<sup>nd</sup> & Date-** Officers were advised of a male in a white pick-up truck acting strange and suspicious in the area of East 2nd & Fir St. When officers arrived the pick-up truck was going west on 2nd. The truck was stopped at Date St. A record check showed the 40 year old male driver had a felony warrant and a suspended driver license. He was arrested and booked into jail.

### **C-Shift**

**Incendiary Device/1800 blk S Huntington Pl-** Officers responded to the location for a report that a juvenile male who had ignited some type of a homemade explosive which created a large dark plume of smoke. Once on scene, Officers contacted a 15year old male who had been confronted by a neighbor. He advised that he had been on the internet watching a "Challenge" and he decided to do it. The challenge involved mixing some items, placing it in a sealed metal container with a port and igniting it. The desired effect was a large column of fire shooting from the port. He decided to improvise and used a 1 quart glass mason jar instead of the sealed metal container. Upon igniting the fuse, the jar exploded several seconds later causing a fireball about 15 feet high and a large plume of toxic smoke. A second unignited mason jar containing the substance was also located at the scene. Kennewick Fire and RPD Bomb Squad were consulted regarding making the substance safe for disposal. Kennewick FD responded, the substance was contained pending disposal by the department of ecology. Report forwarded to the Benton County Prosecutor and ATF. The juvenile was not injured nor was there any property damage.

**DUI Hit & Run/Kennewick Ave & Olympia St-** Officers responded for a Hit and Run collision during which a grey Ford Fusion driven by a female, struck the complainant and then fled the scene. Witness followed the suspect vehicle to 1500 blk W 7<sup>th</sup> Pl and

directed Officers to the location. Once on scene, it was determined that a 53 year old female was driving the vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and caused the collision. She fled because her husband, who had also been drinking, told her she was in trouble. He was right; she was arrested and booked for Hit and Run / DUI.

***Residential Burglary/1600 blk Honeysuckle St-*** Complainant reported that sometime between Saturday evening and early Sunday morning a furnace was stolen from a residence under construction at the location. The suspect(s) uninstalled the furnace which was located in the garage, leaving little to no signs of damage. No leads or suspects.

## **Tuesday, September 27, 2016**

### **A-Shift**

***Stolen Vehicle Recovered/Garfield & Vineyard Dr-*** Officer Melone observed a Pasco stolen vehicle (orange 2003 Nissan Xterra) going west on East Columbia Dr from the Cable Bridge. By the time the officer got through traffic, the orange stolen vehicle ducked into the downtown business area where he lost sight of it for several minutes. As other officers arrived in the area to help, an employee saw the Xterra screaming westbound through the back alley behind the Farmers Market. The driver of the vehicle, later identified as 18 year old male of Pasco then quickly stopped the stolen Nissan. He and his four juvenile passengers all jumped out of the car and started running westbound through the alley. As more officers arrived in the area, the quintet was spotted still together coming out of an alley next to the irrigation canal at Garfield & Vineyard Dr. The group of vehicle thieves was swarmed by officers as they made it to the parking lot at Garfield and Vineyard Dr and were taken into custody. The 18 year old was booked into jail on Possession of a Stolen Vehicle and the four juvenile males were booked into Juvenile Detention for Taking a Motor Vehicle w/Out Permission 2nd Degree.

***Order Violation/8700 blk W Victoria Ave-*** Officer McGee is investigating a possible order violation involving a 30 year old male. The report has been sent to the CA for review.

### **C-Shift**

***Indecent Exposure/1600 blk W 5<sup>th</sup>*** Officers responded for a reported disturbance between neighbors. On arrival, the victim advised that her children had been in some type of argument with the neighbor kids. One of her kids came home crying, telling her that the mother of the other kids threatened them. She stated she went to the residence to confront the mother about the threats. As she did so she stated a male came out and started making threats, pulled his pants down exposing his genitals then

turning and exposing his naked buttocks while yelling at her. He then said to kiss his a\*\* and patted his buttocks. She said her children saw this as it was done in public and several of the neighborhood kids were around and several other adults also witnessed the incident. He denied the incident, which was witnessed by multiple neighbors. He was issued a Criminal Citation and released at the scene.

## CAT

**Narcotics & Warrant Arrest/Kennewick & Vista Way-** CAT detectives observed a male who has a warrant arrive at the store. He arrived in a Dodge Durango with a female driver and a female passenger. He was contacted at the vehicle and arrested for his warrant. Detectives could see methamphetamine discarded on the floorboard at the driver's feet. The female driver provided a false name. The passenger in the car was also identified. Detectives obtained a search warrant for the vehicle and recovered the methamphetamine. They also figured out the driver had provided a false name and her real name was associated with two warrants. Both were booked into Benton County Jail. The second female had been let go, but after the warrant was served, Detectives now has Probable Cause to arrest her for Possession of Meth. Follow-up to continue.

**Warrant Arrest/10<sup>th</sup> & Washington St-** CAT detectives contacted a male at 10<sup>th</sup> and Washington St and arrested him for one warrant. He was booked into Benton County Jail.

## Wednesday, September 28, 2016

### B-Shift

**Auto Theft/500 blk S Hawthorne St-** Officer Jones contacted the complainant in reference to an auto theft. He reported that his wife **was warming up their truck and left it unattended**. When she came back outside she observed the truck driving off. 2002 Chevy S10 was listed as stolen.

Auto Theft/200 blk E Columbia Dr- Complainant reported that her 1988 Toyota Camry was stolen during the night. The vehicle has heavy damage from being involved in a roll-over accident. Entered as stolen.

**Vehicle Prowl/600 blk N Garfield St-** Complainants advised they both own cars which had been parked on the street in front of their residence. Sometime between midnight and noon today, an unknown person entered both cars and rummaged around. **Both vehicles were unlocked**. One had her purse taken from her car. Her purse was located around the corner on the ground. All the contents had been dumped out, but nothing appeared missing. The other was not missing anything from his vehicle, but it had obviously been tampered with. No witnesses or suspects have been located.

**Assault DV/4700 Blk W 27<sup>th</sup> Ave-** Officer Greenough responded to Trios to contact a 16 year old male. He was receiving treatment regarding an assault he just been in. Upon contact, it was determined that he was a runaway. He reported his mother and step-father located him today while walking down the street on 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue. He admitted that he yelled at his step-father. His step father apparently started to strike him and was hit in the face several times. He also kicked him numerous times. The story was confirmed witnesses who were in the area when the incident occurred. The Prosecutors office was contacted, and a 72-hr hold for Assault of a Child DV was approved. CPS was contacted and took custody of the 16 year old. Investigation on going

### **D-Shift**

**Theft Shoplift/3000 blk W Kennewick Ave-** An employee reported that a male and female had stolen items from the store and left toward Kennewick Ave. The male was described as a white male with a white hat, white shirt and shorts. He was with a white female who was wearing a red shirt and gray pants. While on scene, the subjects were seen in the area of Kennewick Ave and Huntington St. As Officers arrived in the area witnesses advised that the two suspects had gone over the back fence and fled, leaving 2 backpacks behind. The suspects were not located. The stolen merchandise was recovered and returned to the store.

**Warrant Arrest/1100 blk W 10<sup>th</sup>** - Complainant called and said a juvenile male was currently at the location and he had a warrant for his arrest. He was taken into custody without incident and transported to the Juvenile Justice Center where he was booked.

### **CAT**

**Warrant Arrest/ Columbia Drive & Fruitland St-** CAT detectives observed a male at this location and arrested him for a warrant. He was booked into jail.

## **Thursday, September 29, 2016**

### **B-Shift**

**Malicious Mischief/200 blk W Canal Dr-** Complainant reported that last night an unknown male damaged a bag of wood chips which was left outside. Video shows the male riding a bike in the lot and then cutting open the bag. The video was unable to capture any images of the suspect's face.

### **D-Shift**

**Assault/1100 blk W 10th Ave-** Officers responded to the group home for an assault of a care provider. 49 year old female who suffers from Downs Syndrome had been

repeatedly slapping and hitting the onsite care provider, even after the care provider made obvious attempts to maintain her distance from her as she completed job related tasks and tended to another resident. When she did so, the female would seek her out to hit her. This is the 4th incident since 05/09/2016 involving her and resulting in Police reports, and the 7th incident in total. In talking with staff it is evident that many steps have been taken to avoid arrest, and Officers were advised that the majority of incidents have not been reported. As a result, the decision to arrest was made. When she heard officers say that she was going to be arrested, she began saying that she would behave, and would not hit any more. The City Attorney and on call Commander were consulted regarding the arrest. The transitions program was also contacted as an alternative to incarceration at the BCSO Jail; however they had no bed available. In an attempt to presumably avoid being arrested, she disrobed several times and even attempted to eat a coloring crayon. She was arrested and booked without incident. The BCSO Jail was notified of the arrest to include details about the circumstances prior to transport.

***DUI Drugs/Clearwater & SR395-*** Female was arrested for DUI Rx Drugs after CAT observed her run the stop sign from Rite Aid into the Walgreen's parking lot and then attempt to make a left turn out of the Panda Express parking lot on to North bound SR 395. DRE evaluation completed and search warrant obtained for blood. She was booked at the BCSO Jail.

## **CAT**

***Trespass Arrest/3000 blk W Clearwater Ave-*** Detectives Schwartz and Dorame were on extra patrol when they observed two subjects run and hide in an unoccupied storage unit. A male and female were contacted, and detained. The detectives discovered the two were using the storage unit to sleep in. The owner was contacted and she requested both subjects be arrested for trespassing. Both were cited and released for Trespass 2<sup>nd</sup>.

## **Friday, September 30, 2016**

### **A-Squad**

***Warrant/5300 blk W Canal Dr-*** Male was sleeping in a vehicle in the area and a citizen requested a welfare check. He had four warrants and went to jail.

***Order Violation/500 blk S Juniper St-*** Female has been harassing her ex-boyfriend's wife then texted him in violation of a valid anti-harassment order. Citation forwarded for mailing.

***Trespass/2500 blk W Falls Ave -*** Male was sleeping behind the building and trespassed per the owner's request.
