Monday, October 24, 2016

A-Shift

Search Warrant/300 blk N Dayton St - Officer Quinones completed a search warrant for the car impounded on this graffiti arrest at Canal and the underpass. Marijuana, paraphernalia were located in the center console. New charges have been forwarded to Juvenile on the 17 year old suspect.

Theft from Vehicle/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant advised he was parked at work, **his vehicle unlocked** and an unknown suspect stole his drywall cutting knife and lunch. No suspect info at this time.

Single Vehicle Collision/4100 Blk 7th Ave- 32 year old male driving in severe inattention mode drifted off the road striking a wooden telephone pole, shearing it off at the bottom. He was cited and released Driving while License Suspended & Negligent Driving.

Malicious Mischief/6000 Blk W 10th Pl- Complainant advised he was driving by the school this morning and noticed a few 12 year old looking boys standing on the corner. As he drove by one of them threw something at his SUV striking it. He stopped a half a block away and got out and observed a dent on the right front door. The boys in question ran away and he was not able to identify the one who threw the rock or the other two.

C-Shift

Domestic Assault/1300 blk W 7th Pl- Officers contacted a male and female in reference to them fighting. They have been together for 6 years and have children together. He was highly intoxicated and accused her of cheating. He threw beer on her, broke her phone, and then hit her in the face. He was booked for assault DV after being medically cleared.

False Reporting/400 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Officers responded to reports from a neighbor who heard a male and female in an altercation inside the apartment. Officers contacted both of them. The female lives at the location and is dating the male. He provided a false name and then claimed to not know his own date of birth. She claimed not to know her boyfriend's name. Officers were able to confirm the name provided was false and arrested the male. He had a warrant out of Sunnyside that turned out to not be extraditable. There was no evidence to support an assault occurring between the two. He was booked for False Reporting.

Community Care Fund/1600 blk S Union St- Officer Veitenheimer contacted a vehicle parked in the lot after hours. Two adult males were staying in the car. Both males were deaf and from Idaho. They had traveled to Kennewick looking for help and services for the deaf. They had documentation showing they had appointments for services on the 26th. They were very low on gas, so figured they would sleep in the car at the Library so they could use computers to arrange help. Their situation was consistent with all checks and what Officers were seeing. Community Care Fund used to fully gas their car, purchase a meal, and motel room to Thursday.

Tuesday, October 25, 2016

A-Shift

Vehicle Collision/800 blk E 3rd & Gum St- Officers responded to a one vehicle roll over at East 3rd & Gum St. The driver of the Ford pick-up truck was attempting to make a left

turn from 3rd to northbound Gum at a speed unsafe for conditions and slid off the road hit the curb and flipped the truck. No injuries reported. The 22 year old male driver was cited for negligent driving.

Graffiti/400 blk S Ely St- Unknown suspect painted on the rear of the building. No suspect info. GAP Notified.

Theft/6000 blk W 10th Ave- A student left her iPhone in her assigned locker and when she returned for it she found it missing. No suspect info at this time.

Graffiti/4200 blk W 27th Ave- Unknown suspect tagged the back wall of the business. GAP notified.

Theft/200 blk N Underwood St- A 74 year old handicapped man advised us that his 3 wheeled red PRIDE Victory scooter w/ grey tires was stolen from his carport.

Order Violation/1300 blk W 7th PI- Male was arrested for DV last night and went to court this morning. A No Contact Order was issued and he was released. He returned to the residence and took her car then returned it. He is back in jail.

Assault DV/1100 blk N Grant PI- Resident at My Friend's Place was at the location when his mother and sister arrived. His mother is currently homeless and wanted to hang out for the day. She found out he was not going to school so she took his video game system as punishment. He retaliated by assaulting his mom and sister. Forwarded to the Prosecutor for review.

C- Shift

Suicide Attempt/100 blk S Conway PI- 22 year old male called Dispatch and advised he had cut his wrists. Officers arrived to find him bleeding from his arm. There was significant blood in the apartment and blood flowing from his covered arm. Medics arrived and dealt with the injury. He was intoxicated and did not advise why he had cut himself. His girlfriend was home. There was no evidence to indicate anything other than self-inflicted. He was transported to Trios.

Order Violation/1300 blk W 7th PI- The previous shift had arrested and booked a male for order violation. He had been arrested on our previous shift for DV Assault and an order was put into place. He was let out today, violated the order and day shift put him back into jail. The Jail reported tonight that he had made a call to the victim in violation of the order. We investigated and issued an additional citation for order violation.

Wednesday, October 27, 2016

B- Shift

Malicious Mischief/100 blk S Conway Pl- Complainant reported that sometime during the past day an unknown suspect damaged her mailbox. The suspect pried open the box door causing the lock to break. It is unknown if any mail was stolen.

Assault DV/400 blk E 10th- Officers responded to the trailer park for an assault in progress. Officer contacted a female and her husband. She had a cut to her lip which was bleeding. It was determined the two had been arguing and her husband assaulted her. He was arrested and booked for assault DV.

Fraud/100 blk N Union St- Officer Meiners contacted complainant in reference to a theft of a credit card and fraud. She reported that the card was stolen on 10/22/16 when she left her purse unattended. After the theft the suspect used the Visa card at a fast food restaurant. Officer Meiners contacted the business and they are working on security video footage of the suspect.

Theft/7300 blk W Canal Dr- Staff advised a female had been in the store shopping and then left. As she exited she set off the alarm at the door. She fled on foot to a nearby restaurant where she dumped two pairs of jeans in the restroom. She then attempted to hide at another store but was located and arrested. She was booked for the theft.

D-Shift

Theft/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant told officers that someone stole her cell phone while she was at the mall. The victim was able to locate her phone at a home in Benton County. The residents at the location were contacted and said they did not know anything about the phone and were less than cooperative. Several more officers and CAT detectives responded along with Benton County Deputies and started to apply for a search warrant. A 16 year old female tried to take the blame for the theft, but was not believed. The phone was returned but the Sim card was missing. Officers managed to get the Sim card but the suspect broke it. A second female admitted to the theft, coaching the first female and sending her to the officers. Second female was arrested Theft in the Second Degree.

Disorderly Conduct/Clearwater & Edison- Officer Noble observed a male walk in front of two separate vehicles blocking their right of way. He made an obscene hand gesture to the driver of the second vehicle. He was contacted and arrested for Disorderly Conduct and 3 Felony Warrants.

Halloween Safety Pointers For Parents

Make Sure your kids dress up safely

- Check that costumes are flame retardant so little ones aren't in danger near burning jack-o-lanterns or other fire hazards.
- Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls and other bumps in the night.
- Try make-up instead of a mask. Masks can restrict vision; a dangerous thing when kid's cross streets and going up and down stairs.
- Make sure kids wear light color clothing or put reflective tape on costumes.

Make Trick or Treating Trouble Free

Treats

- Kids need to know not to eat their treats until they get home. Feed them before they start their night.
- Check all treats at home in a well-lighted place.
- Only eat unopened candies and other treats that are in their original wrappers. If you find something suspicious or out of the ordinary, call 628-0333 and have a Police Officer check it as well.
