Thursday, October 27, 2016

B-Shift

Assault/7300 blk W Bonnie Ave- Officers responded in reference to an assault. Complainant reported that he lives at the trailer with his ex-wife. Today she grabbed a pair of scissors and attempted to stab him with them. He was not injured and left the trailer. Officers contacted her and he refused to come out for some time. She eventually exited and was arrested for assault 2nd.

Assault/2600 blk W Bruneau- Officer Johnson responded for an assault that just occurred. Contact was made with a male who reported he and another male had been in an argument and were asked to leave the building. As they were leaving the other

male punched him in the head multiple times. Officer Johnson searched the area and located the suspect who was arrested and booked for assault 4.

Counterfeit/3100 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officer Brakebill responded for a counterfeit bill. An unknown female came into the branch on or about 10/21/2016 and asked if the \$100.00 she had was counterfeit. Staff immediately realized the bill was a washed \$5.00 bill. Staff did not obtain any information on the female.

Shoplift/7000 blk W Canal Dr- Officer Brakebill responded and contacted the manager who advised that a female entered the store and selected several items. The female went to the checkout and attempted to return 3 of the items saying that she came in with them. Video clearly shows the female concealing the items in her purse. CAT Detectives later identified and located the suspect.

Burglary/1500 S Dennis Pl- Officer Rosane responded and contacted complainant who advised she was incarcerated in the Benton County Jail on 9/28/2016. When she left her residence her house was secure and all items inside. She was released today and discovered her house had been burglarized with several items stolen, including a TV and numerous designer purses, valued at over \$2,800.00 each. No signs of forced entry.

Mental/8800 blk W 3rd Ave- Officer Hanson responded to the location for a welfare check on a male. Officers have been to the residence several times in the last week for the male acting very aggressively towards his wife and caretakers, due to his undiagnosed Dementia/Alzheimer's. Crisis Response advised that they have received an order from a judge to have the male taken in for a mental health evaluation. Lourdes refused to take the male, so Crisis Response is waiting for the judge to issue a new order. Crisis Response will call back when they are ready to serve him with the order.

Warrant Arrest/Canal Dr & Buchanan St- Officer Johnson pulled a vehicle over at the location and contacted the registered owner. He had a confirmed warrant out of Franklin County. He was arrested without incident and booked into Franklin County Jail.

Assault DV/100 blk N Irby St- Officers Sneyd and Rosane responded to a physical DV in progress. A year old male was verbal with his mother. He then pushed his mother back, then punched her several times and choked her. Her breathing was never restricted or had any loss of consciousness. He was still in the act of assaulting her as officers arrived. He had also punched and kicked holes in the walls of the residence. He was booked into the Benton County Juvenile Justice Center for Assault 4 DV and Malicious Mischief DV.

D-Shift

Found Property/00 blk S Gum- An employee reported a safe in their dumpster. The safe did not appear to be damaged and was unlocked. The safe was collected and an information report was completed. Follow up continuing.

Domestic/4200 blk S Yelm Pl- Male and female are roommates and had an argument over her cat and his dog. Nothing physical.

Theft by Fraud/2200 blk N Nevada Ct- Complainant bought a gift card from female on Facebook Buy, Sell Swap. She contacted complainant and asked if she wanted a second \$100.00 card for \$60.00. The card was delivered by a male in a minivan. When she tried to use the card she was told it had no money on it because it had never been activated and stolen.

Destruction of Property/2100 blk W 19th Ave- Male was at his parent's house alone and smashed a TV and computer monitor. He was located later and arrested for Destruction of property and warrants.

Verbal Domestic/7700 blk W 4th Ave- Female's mother reported that her daughter was in an argument with her boyfriend. Female was contacted and said there had been no assault tonight but there had been minor physical assaults in the past. She did not want to go to a shelter and was reluctant to leave. A motel room was offered and she became more agreeable about leaving for the night. The community care fund was used to provide her with a room for one night.

Assault DV/7100 blk W 3rd Pl- Complainant reported that a female struck her son in the face. Female thought she found evidence on Facebook that he had cheated on her. She showed a tablet with the evidence to the complainant. Complainant was looking at the tablet and the female tried to take the tablet back, but complainant did not want to give it back and they scuffled. Her son came into the room and thought the female was assaulting his mother so he grabbed her hoodie and pulled her away. As he was pulling her back her hand struck his face. All parties agree that the strike was not intentional. They all separated themselves from each other. The case was forwarded for review.

CAT

Shoplift Follow Up & Warrant Arrest/600 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Detectives Riley and Salter saw Officer Brakebill's Facebook post reference the shoplift report earlier in the day. The detectives recognized the female suspect and the male. The detectives tracked the female down and she was taken into custody for theft 3rd and 7 felony warrants. She was interviewed about the theft and booked into Benton County Jail.

Friday, October 28, 2016

A-Shift

Warrant Arrest/Columbia Center Blvd & Deschutes- 25 year old male was stopped for a traffic violation. A records check showed he had an outstanding felony warrant for his arrest. He was cited for several infractions and booked into jail for his warrant.

Graffiti/400 blk E Columbia Dr- Unknown subject climbed on the roof of the business to tag the drive thru sign in red sharpie.

Theft/100 blk Vista Way- An unknown black female in her early 20's wearing all black stole a black long hair wig from a display valued at \$45 and left in a dark colored SUV and left the area. The plate the victim recorded was not correct. The Victim said she may have the incident on video but will have to get help to review it and copy the footage if it is there. Complainant said she would call PD back if so.

Malicious Mischief/6000 Blk W 10th Pl- Reporting party advised he was driving by the school this morning notice a few 12 year old looking boys standing on the corner. As he drove by one of them threw something at his SUV striking it. He stopped a half a block away and got out and observed a dent on the RF door. The boys in question ran away and he was not able to identify the one who threw the rock or the other two. Officer Valdez informed Sgt Genack that one of the Middle School Security Officers identified the student that caused the damage. Officer Valdez and the Middle School will handle the follow-up.

Hit & Run/Kennewick Ave & US 395- A male driving a small gray sedan, possibly a 90s Toyota Corolla rear ended another vehicle and then left the scene. The suspect vehicle has front end damage including a broken radiator that was leaking fluid. Traffic Officers are handling the investigation. 30 min later the suspect vehicle was located parked abandoned in the middle of Alder near E 7th. The driver fled. Follow up to continue.

C-Shift

Warrant Arrest/00 blk E 1st Ave- Officers contacted male at this location. He had a DOC warrant for failure to register and was arrested and booked.

Warrant Arrest/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Officers contacted a male in the parking lot after a report that he was acting suspicious. Turned out he was with friends and just waiting at their vehicle. He had a felony DOC warrant from a Child Molestation charge. He was arrested and booked.

Vehicle Theft Attempt/5100 blk W Clearwater Ave- Complainant was alerted by another resident that his car was in the middle of the parking lot. He found that his

1992 Honda Civic had damage to the steering column and ignition. It looked like someone had tried to start it with a screwdriver. There are no witnesses or suspects.

CAT

Warrant Arrest, Order Violation & Resisting Arrest/6400 blk W 1st Ave- Detectives Riley and Salter received information that a female with 6 felony warrants and a male with 3 felony warrants and gang member were at the residence. CAT detectives attempted contact at the residence, but nobody would answer the door. Detectives obtained a search warrant and with the assistance of patrol the warrant was served. The female was found hiding behind a freezer inside a closet and the male was found hiding inside a cupboard. Both were taken into custody. Prior to exiting the house the female had a seizure and Kennewick Fire paramedics responded and took her to Trios. Detectives also contacted a second male at the residence and he was in violation of a No- Contact Order with a second female. That male was taken into custody for Order Violation. While he was in the back of a CAT vehicle he had a mild seizure. He was also transported to Trios for medical treatment. The first male was booked into Benton County Jail for warrants and Resisting Arrest. After the first female and second male was medically cleared they were booked into jail.

Saturday, October 29, 2016

A-Shift

Theft/00 blk S Waverly St- Complainant had his green Magna bicycle stored in his carport and found it missing this morning. No suspects.

Identity Theft/900 blk S Huntington Pl- Complainant found charges on her credit card account from California.

Theft/1100 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- 20 year old male stole \$68.00 worth of alcohol from the store. He went to jail.

Trespass/4700 blk W Metaline Ave- Male was at the location and management wanted him trespassed from the location. He was trespassed.

Theft/100 blk N Union St- Reporting party discovered her vehicle had been rummaged through and a small pocket knife was missing. No suspects.

Assault DV/800 blk W 42nd Ave- Female assaulted her child's father after telling him how bad a father he was. She went to jail.

Hit and Run/900 blk W 5th Ave- Complainant discovered damage to the landscaping at the complex off of 5th Ave where a vehicle left the road traveling over the sidewalk and into the landscaping causing damage. No suspects.

Found Property/8500 blk W Gage Blvd- A customer tried on a pair of boots and when they opened the box they found a black Ruger LC9 with no magazines or ammunition. The handgun was in a black Blackhawk Holster. We ran the gun which returned no record. No suspects.

C-Shift

Warrant Arrest/Olympia & 10th Ave- Officers contacted a male who was the at fault driver in a two vehicle collision. He was arrested on a misdemeanor warrant for Minor in Possession of Alcohol and additionally cited for Driving while License Suspended. The collision was non-injury.

Warrant Arrest/4600 blk W Clearwater- Loss Prevention called for police assistance with an uncooperative shoplifter. Officer's identified the suspect as after she had provided a false name. She had two warrants and was arrested. During the arrest, she slammed her head against the wall causing a cut. She was booked after medical clearance.

Hit & Run/Grand Ronde & Yelm- 19 year old female was south on Yelm approaching the Hwy when she drove through a fence causing significant damage to the property and her car. She then drove away, getting a few blocks before stopping. A witness followed. Officers arrested her for Hit & Run, Driving while License Suspended and a FCSO warrant. She was sober. The home owner to the damaged property was not home.

Hit & Run/Albany & Buntin- 23 year old male hit two parked cars near the Baptist church on Albany. The two parked cars belonged to the pastor. The suspect vehicle had significant damage and the driver fled on foot. CAT located the suspect near Fire Station 62 on Morain St. He was limping from his injuries but claimed that it was not him, at least until CAT pointed out that he is the owner of the suspect vehicle. He was arrested for DUI and Hit & Run. Blood evidence collected via search warrant.

Sunday, October 30, 2016

A-Shift

Vehicle Prowl/600 blk N Johnson St- Complainant advised unknown subject **entered his unlocked vehicle** ransacked it. He then noticed some stuff that was in his car on the other side of the yard by a bush. There was also a pellet rifle laying there that does not

belong to the complainant. The pellet gun was collected for safekeeping. No suspect info at this time.

Collision/Canal & Columbia Center Blvd- Two car minor injury collision handled by patrol. The vehicle at fault ran a red light causing the collision.

C-Shift

Disorderly Conduct/1400 blk N Kellogg St- Male was inside the restaurant causing a disturbance. He was cursing and at one point threw a phone across the room. A male customer tried to calm the subject down and reminded him that there were families with children present. The first male took exception to this and grabbed the second male who put the first male to the ground and let him back up only after agreeing to leave. Officers arrived and detained the first male. He is a transient that we have dealt with several times. He was booked for Disorderly Conduct and Provoking an Assault.

Vehicle Prowl/4100 blk W 34th Ave- Complainant reported that keys were stolen from the center console of his truck. He suspects someone entered the truck between 19:00 and 22:30hrs. Nothing else was taken. The theft occurred at his father-in-law home and not his residence. Browning will notify his employer on Monday of the missing keys. There are no suspects or witnesses.

Assault/200 blk N Dennis- Just after midnight Officers were toned out to an assault with a gun at the tavern. A 65 year old male was engaging with a 56 year old male. According to second male, the first was talking nonsense with the gist of basically how cool/manly he is. The second male challenged him on his story and the first male drew a .38 revolver and pointed it at the second male's chest. Second male grabbed the gun and yelled for help. The male with the gun was knocked to the ground and another male that was near the confrontation took the gun from him. The gun was recovered by Officers and the suspect was booked for Assault 2nd. The gun was loaded. No shots were fired.

Halloween Safety Pointers For Parents

Make Sure your kids dress up safely

- Check that costumes are flame retardant so little ones aren't in danger near burning jack-o-lanterns or other fire hazards.
- Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls and other bumps in the night.
- Try make-up instead of a mask. Masks can restrict vision; a dangerous thing when kid's cross streets and going up and down stairs.
- Make sure kids wear light color clothing or put reflective tape on costumes.

Treats

- Kids need to know not to eat their treats until they get home. Feed them before they start their night.
- Check all treats at home in a well-lighted place.
- Only eat unopened candies and other treats that are in their original wrappers. If you find something suspicious or out of the ordinary, call 628-0333 and have a Police Officer check it as well.
