Monday, November 7, 2016

A- Shift

Burglary/4600 blk W 20th Ave- Complainant advised he **left one of his garage roll up doors open** and an unknown subject entered the garage early this morning and went through three vehicles inside that were also unlocked. The unknown thief stole several electronic devices, debit and credit cards. No further info at this time.

Stolen Vehicle Recovery/3500 blk W Hood Ave- Complainant of a reported stolen vehicle called to advise she found her vehicle parked in the lot, unlocked with the keys in the ignition. No suspect info. Vehicle removed from system as stolen.

Theft Shoplifting/2900 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant advised an unknown Hispanic female entered the store loaded up a cart with clothes and then walked out to an older yellow mustang and left without paying for the items.

Shoplift Arrest/Tapteal & Columbia Center Blvd- Loss Prevention advised a Black Male with a grey sweatshirt just left the store without paying with multiple clothing items and was running north across the parking lot towards Tapteal. Loss Prevention kept a visual on the suspect who was eventually caught by a Kennewick and Richland officers. The 36 year old male was arrested and booked for theft.

Disturbance & Warrant Arrest/100 blk S Conway Pl- Male was intoxicated and causing a disturbance. Records check showed had had an outstanding warrant. He was arrested and booked.

C- Shift

Burglary/8600 blk W Gage Blvd- Complainant reported that a storage shed behind their main business had been broken into. Entry was made by breaking out a window sometime over the weekend. A compressor and a shop vacuum were stolen. There are no suspects.

Vehicle Prowl/4400 Blk W 7th- Resident called in at about 23:00 reporting seeing two people attempting to prowl cars in the neighborhood. Several neighbors were contacted as it was obvious that cars had been gone through. Cars were found open and with dome lights on. Several Officers searched through the neighborhood; however the suspects were not located.

C- Shift

Warrant Arrest/100 blk S Rainier St- Complainant reported that she witnessed a 22 year old male go into the detached garage. She has a no contact order on behalf of her 15 year old granddaughter against the male. She believed her granddaughter was with him. The suspect had several active arrest warrants, gang affiliations, and per the complainant is known to carry a gun. Several Patrol and CAT units responded along with Officer Kohn/K9. The location was contained and several subjects exited the garage, with the 15 year old granddaughter being one. The suspect did not exit at first and had to be ordered out under threat of K9 application. He was taken into custody. Narcotics were found inside the garage. CAT handled the narcotic investigation. The suspect was booked on his felony warrant and three misdemeanors out of Kennewick, a Franklin County felony warrant and Violation of Court Order DV.

Warrant Arrest/2800 blk W 10th Ave- Officers contacted two subjects who were preparing to load property into their vehicle from the Goodwill Trailer until seeing the patrol car. One subjects, a 33 year old male was booked on his four local warrants.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/1000 blk N Volland St- Detectives Schwartz and Dorame were on extra patrol when they observed a male in the parking lot who had 11 felony warrants. He was taken into custody without incident. The vehicle he was inside was impounded for a narcotics search warrant. Follow-up to continue.

Wednesday, November 9, 2016

B- Shift

Warrant Service/4000 blk W Metaline Ave- Officers responded to this residence for a verbal disturbance. Contact was made with a male who had an outstanding DOC warrant. He was arrested and booked.

Theft/2400 blk S Tacoma St- Complainant reported that over the past week she had two packages stolen. The first was stolen from her unsecured mailbox. The second was stolen from her porch. No suspect information.

D-Shift

Theft from Vehicle/3000 blk S Neel Pl- Complainant reported that sometime after Sunday and unknown person entered his vehicle and stole some items. He advised that all the manuals to the vehicle were taken, the tray that holds loose change, a flashlight and a headlamp. He advised **there was no forced entry into the vehicle.**

Unlawful Imprisonment DV/1800 blk W 21st- Complainant reported, on 10/30/2016 she and her boyfriend got in an argument over relationship issues. During the argument, she told him that she was leaving. She stated this angered him and he grabbed her around the throat and pushed her against the wall. She fought him off and attempted to leave with her two children. He then took her cell phone and keys from her, and would not allow her to leave. Her daughter yelled at him not to hurt her mom at which point he raised his hand to the child. She got between her daughter and boyfriend at which time he again grabbed her around the throat and threw her down. Her daughter attempted to run to the neighbor for help but he caught her at the neighbor door and drug her back inside the apartment. The neighbor heard the disturbance and went to assist, making it possible for her to get her children out of the apartment. At some point he fled and his location is not known. She stated she told her neighbor not to call police

and she did not call as she was fearful that he would harm her. Case sent to Prosecutor for charges.

Vehicle Prowling/400 blk S Olympia- Officers responded to the location for a male subject wearing a grey sweat shirt who was said to be pulling on vehicle door handles and looking into vehicles. A short time after officers began checking the area a male matching the description, emerged from 400 blk S Olympia and began walking down the sidewalk. He was contacted, provided ID and then fled on foot when he realized he was going to be detained. He was apprehended after a brief foot pursuit through the 500 blk Olympia. He was booked on a Felony Warrant, Obstructing, and Trespassing. At the time of arrest and was found to be in possession of a Master Card with someone else's name on it.

CAT

Recovered Stolen Vehicle/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Detectives Bennett and Sgt Isakson were on extra patrol when they observed an occupied stolen vehicle (gray Mercury Sable) parked on the west side of the business. The vehicle had been reported stolen to Spokane PD within the last week. Several CAT detectives made contact at the vehicle and ordered the suspect to exit. The suspect refused to exit the vehicle and the car doors were locked. After several minutes of giving the suspect commands to exit the vehicle, and his refusal to exit on his own Officer Kuhn broke out the front passenger window. The suspect vehicle was unlocked and the suspect, a 21 year old male, was extracted from the vehicle by detectives, and arrested for possession of a stolen auto. He was transported to Trios for an abrasion and bump to his forehead. He was medically cleared and booked into Benton County Jail for Possession Stolen Auto and Resisting Arrest.

Narcotics/300 blk N Ely St- CAT detectives were on extra patrol when they observed a suspicious vehicle parked on the eastside of the motel. The vehicle was contacted and found to be occupied by four people. The front seat passenger was clearly under the influence of narcotics and couldn't sit still. Detectives observed drug paraphernalia and prescription drugs inside the vehicle. The four occupants identified and were released pending a narcotics search warrant on the Honda Civic. Follow-up to continue.
