Monday, December 12, 2016

B Shift

Patrol and Traffic handled a number of collisions citywide.

Welfare Check/3200 blk S Gum St- Officers responded in reference to a suicidal male. It was reported he had made suicidal statements on Facebook and via text. He was not at the residence and was not answering his phone. ATL issued to check his welfare.

D Shift

DUI Collision/Clearwater & Union- Female drove off of Union and little north of Clearwater hitting a power pole and knocking it down. The power line was across Union. The intersection at Clearwater was closed and PUD and city streets responded. Female was arrested for DUI.

DUI/Kennewick & Dayton- Officer Kiel stopped a for a traffic stop. She was arrested for DUI and a search warrant for a blood draw was applied for and granted.

Theft SL/ 2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- On 11/17/2016 two males entered the store on Kennewick Avenue and allegedly took \$500.00 worth of merchandise from the store without paying. On 12/11/2016 the same males returned to the same store and allegedly took \$250.00 worth of alcohol from the store without paying. Pasco Police recovered a shopping cart from the store in Pasco with some of the stolen alcohol still in it. Posted to Facebook with images.

Domestic/1300 blk W 7th Pl- Female and her boyfriend were verbal and he was locked out of the residence. She said she does not want to be there and is planning on going to Iowa on Friday. The community care fund was used to get a room for her.

Tuesday, December 13, 2016

B Shift

Counterfeit/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officers responded to a report of two transient males attempting to use a counterfeit \$100 bill. The suspects left prior to police arrival and were not located. They attempted to use the bill at two different check outs and told staff they had found it in the snow. Bill collected as evidence.

Burglary/3600 blk W 2nd Ave- complainant reported that he owns the duplex at this location and it is currently vacant. Sometime over the weekend an unknown suspect entered the residence and stole a roll of carpet, a refrigerator, paint and plastic tarps. There were no signs of forced entry and a canvass did not locate any witnesses.

Forgery/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Officer Engel contacted employees in reference to a male attempting to cash a counterfeit check. The male attempted to cash business check for \$852.86. When the employee advised she needed to verify the check the suspect left leaving the check and an ID behind. The business was contacted and verified it was a counterfeit check. Follow up with locating and interviewing the suspect is continuing.

Theft/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant reported that she had left her wallet and cell phone on the counter at the customer service desk. When she realized she returned but both items were gone. Employees reviewed video and observed a female take both items. The female had given employees at the desk her info as she was wiring money. The female was located and arrested for her 6 Felony Warrants by Night shift. She was with her daughter and a male. Her daughter was arrested for 2 warrants and the male was arrested for 4 Felony Warrants. Posted to Facebook

Discharge of Firearm/6700 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officer Engel contacted complainant in reference to her neighbor negligently discharging a firearm causing a bullet to enter her apartment. The neighbor was interviewed and advised he had been practicing his pistol grip and pulled the trigger on his Glock 19. There was a round in the chamber which discharged, traveled through multiple walls and into the neighbor's apartment. Report forwarded to City Attorney for review.

Theft/3900 blk W 27th Ave- Officer Johnson contacted the regional asset protection officer of in reference to an internal theft. They reported that over the past 4 weeks an employee had stolen \$1,487 in cash from her cash registers. They completed their investigation and interviewed the employee who admitted to stealing the money. Officer Johnson interviewed the suspect and she again admitted to the theft. Forwarded to the BCPA for charging.

Trespass/3000 blk W 4th Ave- An employee of the apartment complex found a male in the laundry room. He had just finished defecating on the floor and fled on foot. Officers located him near in the 2800 blk W Kennewick Ave and detained him. He was verbal and tried to pull his hands away during cuffing. He was booked for trespass and resisting arrest.

D Shift

Disturbance/4900 Blk W Clearwater- Officer Reynolds responded to a disturbance, the second one of the day, involving a female. She was tweaking and refusing to leave the location and was arrested for Trespassing, Obstructing and Resisting Arrest. Her daughter was turned over to CPS.

Disturbance/00 blk W6th Ave- Complainant called and said she wanted a male to leave the residence. He was cooperative and said he was OK with leaving and had started to gather his belongings before the officers had arrived. She kept repeating she wanted the officers to escort him out of the location. After he left she became upset that the officers just let the male leave and now told them he assaulted her. When the officers tried to get details of the assault she had none and finally just walked away. She had two slight red marks on her neck, but did not give any information about how she got them. The report was forwarded to the City Attorney for review. She called back and tried to report that her father assaulted her and said that assault is what caused the red marks she originally said the first male had caused.

Suicide Attempt/3700 blk S McKinley- Female attempted suicide by taking pills and cutting her wrist. Medics transported her to Trios where an officer stood by with her until Crisis Response could respond.

Disturbance/1100 blk W 10th Ave- Male was extremely intoxicated and could not talk. He was taken into protective custody and transported to Trios where he was eventually medically cleared and turned over to a friend.

Mental/2100 blk W 21st Ave- Male refused to pay for a limo ride. While that was being investigated his son called in a welfare check on his father stating he is spending money he does not have and is Bi-polar. The male issued a check to the Limo driver that was not signed and was not a form of payment taken by the Limo Company. The son asked that his dad be arrested if at all possible. He was arrested for Theft of Services and Issuing a Fraudulent Check. Crisis Response was contacted and said they are familiar with the male. Crisis called the jail to put a hold on him until they can contact him for an evaluation.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/600 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- CAT detectives received information a 50 year old male was at the motel. He was contacted and arrested on one warrant. He was booked into Benton County Jail.

A Shift

Theft/3100 blk W John Day Ave- Complainant began dating a male from Spokane. He ended up stealing over \$10,000 of her jewelry and her vehicle which she recovered. He fled after pawning several articles of her jewelry and selling her belongings on Craigslist.

Assault DV/2900 blk W 7th Ave- Male assaulted female when they were exchanging their daughter for visitation. He was booked for Assault 4 DV.

Assist Fire/1000 blk W 14th Pl- Officers responded to a house fire and found the house engulfed in flames upon arrival. Everyone was evacuated and Fire quickly extinguished the fire. Nobody was injured.

Suspicious Circumstance/300 blk E 47th Pl- Complainant recently purchased the residence and found evidence of transients trying to get in the basement. He suspects they are living in Elliott Lake and requests extra patrol.

C Shift

Disturbance/00 blk N Dayton- Male was again causing issues with his neighbors in the 4-plex apartment building. We've had multiple contacts with the subject as of late, and

he has over 200 involvements. He has a history of not being cooperative. He was cited tonight for destruction of property and noise. He had caused damage to a neighbor's door denting it and then had the music on loud in his apartment for the purpose of upsetting his neighbors.
