Tuesday, December 27, 2016

B Shift

Theft/2600 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant called to report that an unknown male was seen on video stealing a candy bar. Officer Rosane recognized the male and a citation was issued and sent to the City Attorney's Office for mailing to the suspect.

Hit & Run/Clearwater Ave & N Irby St- Male driver was struck as he was traveling on W Clearwater Ave by an unknown vehicle and driver. The witness observed the collision and followed the vehicle and obtained a plate. The suspect vehicle was not located.

Missing/1500 blk W 14th Ave- Officers searched numerous locations for missing female. Ben Franklin Transit also provided a copy of the media release and her photograph. Several sightings of the female were reported, including one information report indicating that BFT may have picked her up and taken her to 4th/Columbia in Pasco. Pasco PD also advised and provided a copy of her photograph.

Vehicle Prowl/4000 blk W 10th Ave- Complainant called to report that an unknown suspect **entered his unlocked vehicle** sometime overnight. The only thing missing was an old iPod. No further information.

Malicious Mischief/100 blk E Columbia Dr- Complainant called to report vandalism to the store. He received a phone call on 12/24 from his security company about a broken window. He declined to respond to the business and did not call police. When he arrived on 12/27 he noticed a glass door on the west side had a small hole, possibly a bullet hole in the glass. He also noticed a second story window had nine small holes in the window. The holes appeared to be caused by BB or air soft pellets.

Theft/7400 blk W Canal Dr- Loss prevention called to report that a theft occurred at the store on 12/23. An unknown white male suspect took two hats, but dropped one of the hats at the front of the store. The male placed the other hat on his head and exited the store.

Theft/7400 blk W Canal Dr- Loss prevention called to report that a theft occurred at the store on 12/23. An unknown white male suspect removed the tags from a shirt while in the dressing room and left the store. The tags were located still inside the store.

Theft/7400 blk W Canal Dr- Loss prevention called to report that a theft occurred at the store on 12/24. Unknown white male and female suspects left the store with shopping cart full of items. Both the male and female left the parking lot in a green Cadillac 4 door sedan. Loss prevention was unable to obtain a plate for the vehicle.

Malicious Mischief/600 blk W 6th Ave- Complainant called to report graffiti in several areas of the building written in purple ink in one area. There was also graffiti written in blue and green paint, but it was illegible. The owner requested the graffiti abatement team respond to cover the graffiti.

Vehicle Prowl/3500 blk W 42nd Ave- Complainant called to report that her vehicle was prowled sometime over the weekend. She advised that she went out of town for the holiday weekend and returned on 12/25 and noticed her glovebox was open, but did not realize that her vehicle was prowled until she noticed her black Magellan GPS was missing from her center console. **She believes she left her vehicle unsecure.**

Threats/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant called to report an unknown male made a threat against him and other employees at the location. He was outside smoking when a gold minivan drove up and the front passenger asked about deals the business had. He told the male there were lots of deals, and the male responded with what appeared to be a threat. The van then drove away. Store and mall security were all advised.

D Shift

Missing Person Follow up- Missing female and her dog have been located safe and have been returned home.

Burglary/00 blk N Benton St- A unknown suspect smashed the glass door and stole two generators.

Assault DV/400 blk N Volland- Male spit on his girlfriend as well as grabbing her during an argument. He also kicked the door of her car. He was arrested for Assault DV and Malicious Mischief.

Theft/3600 blk W Clearwater- Male stole a 24 pack of beer and fled. He left his backpack that contained several items with his name on them and is prescriptions.

Theft/800 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Two juvenile males exited the store with merchandise without paying.

Fraud/6400 blk W Clearwater Ave- Male attempted to cash a stolen check that had been washed. The dollar amount went from \$32.00 to \$790 dollars on the check. Suspect was not located.

Malicious Mischief/400 Blk N Volland St- Complainant found his rear driver's side window broken out. Nothing was taken from the car.

Graffiti/2500 blk W Entiat Ave & 2600 blk W Deschutes Ave - The property owner called to report both his properties got tagged on the building walls. He said he would clean it up himself asap.

Fraud/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Two black females purchased a little over \$5000 of Visa gift cards with bogus or stolen credit cards. The two females were identified and are out of California. Case sent to CID for review.

C Shift

Stolen Vehicle/7000 blk W Clearwater- Complainant reported that his black 2006 Nissan Sentra was stolen from the parking lot. He had left the car at the bar at closing and returned to find it gone. The tavern was contacted and confirmed that they did not tow the car. The car has black rims and a Tampa Bay Buccaneer sticker in the rear window.

Assault/Cleveland & Canal- Officers responded a report that a male had been hit with a stick. Officers contacted a 23 year old male and 20 year old male who had a physical altercation over a disagreement about a girl that they both know. The 23 year old claimed the 20 year old had a knife and he defended himself with a baseball bat. The 20 year old claimed the 23 year old had a bat and he defended himself by displaying a knife. The altercation resulted in the 20 year old being admitted at Trios for a broken arm and a good welt on his head. His car was impounded as his knife was inside. The two reportedly had conversations via text/social media prior to the altercation. It was not determined who was the aggressor and victim. Both involved are Somali and speak little English. Information was obtained through language line. Case forwarded to CID.

Warrant Arrest/600 blk N Arthur- 34 year old male was contacted at his apartment. He was arrested and booked on his two misdemeanor warrants.

Assault DV/4400 blk W Hood Ave- Officers responded to a disturbance. Complainant reported her husband had hit her in the face several times and pushed her around. He was arrested for Assault 4th DV and booked at BC Jail

CAT

Collision/6th & Gum St- Detectives Riley and Schwartz observed a non-injury 2 car collision. The driver of vehicle #1 was cited for DWLS 3RD and following to close.

Warrant Arrest/3100 blk W Kennewick Ave- CAT detectives received information that several wanted people were frequenting this house. Detectives observed a male with a DOC Warrant and a female walking up to the residence. Detectives attempted to contact the male, but he ran into the house and wouldn't come outside. After approximately 15 minutes he exited the residence and gave up. Detectives also contacted another female and arrested her for 2 warrants. Both subjects were booked into Benton County Jail.

A- Shift

Graffiti/800 blk Vineyard Dr- Graffiti reported by manager. GAP advised.

Theft/200 blk W Kennewick Ave- Complainant locked up his brown Schwinn cruiser to a light pole near. When he left the bar the bike was gone. It is brown with gray grips, fenders, a white seat and a bent rim.

Order Violation/500 blk N Edison St- Male was at the residence against an order and a disturbance occurred. He was arrested for warrants and Order Violation.

Mental/400 blk S Columbia Center Blvd- Female texted her sister saying she was going to kill herself by taking several pills. She was contacted and transported.

Theft/1900 blk S Neel St- Complainant found his black Schwinn Cruiser stolen from his back yard. The suspects removed several boards to get the bike out.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle/7500 blk Arrowhead to 700 Rd 32 Pasco- Pasco PD located a KPD reported stolen vehicle at 700 Rd 32 in the trailer park. The vehicle was unoccupied. Right before PPD located it, BCSO deputies engaged in a short vehicle pursuit with the reported stolen BMW after the driver, a 30 year old male, failed to obey their commands to step out of the vehicle. Instead he put it in drive and fled the scene, east bound with the deputies in pursuit. The pursuit was eventually terminated and they advised dispatch to let PPD know it was going north over the Blue Bridge. A witness to the theft made a positive identification of the suspect. Pasco PD advised the suspect was driving with a suspended license and had a DOC warrant. Benton County deputies took the suspect into custody and booked him for felony eluding for the pursuit, DWLS and DOC Warrant.

C Shift

Shoplift/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- 16 year old female attempted to steal 3 bottles of alcohol but was detained by LP. She was charged with Theft 3rd and released to her mother.

Shoplift/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Male tried to return 2 bottles of perfume that he picked off the shelf. He left the store with the bottles when they would not give him cash. He was contacted at his house in Richland and issued a Criminal Citation for Theft 3rd.

Graffiti/300 blk N Yelm- A nearby resident reported graffiti on the south side of the bathroom. The graffiti was brown spray paint and consisted of 2 round face drawings.

CAT

Warrant Arrests/800 & 900 blk W Entiat Ave- CAT detectives were on extra patrol in the area when they observed a 27 year old male standing on the porch. Detectives knew he had two warrants for his arrest. They attempted to contact the male but he went into the house and wouldn't come out. The house was contained and after several minutes he exited and was arrested.

Detectives then went a second residence to arrest a 52 year old female for a warrant. She also refused to exit the house, but after several minutes came outside and was arrested. Both subjects were booked into Benton County Jail.
