Friday, December 30, 2016

B- Shift

Burglary/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Male entered the grocery store and took three items without paying and walked out the door. He was detained and learned that he had been issued a criminal trespass warning in February 2016, trespassing him from the store for 100 years. He was released at the scene and advised that the case was being sent to the Prosecutor for review of Burglary charges.

Suicide Attempt/4700 blk W Grand Ronde Ave- Male told his sister that he was going to run away and kill himself if he couldn't move to Arizona with his sister. He was located near the residence and requested to be taken to Crisis Response. He was transported to Crisis Response for a mental health evaluation for the 3rd time in 18 hours.

Fraud/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant called to report fraudulent charges on her charge card that occurred at the store. She advised that her vehicle was stolen out of Pasco. When her vehicle was returned, her keys (including mailbox keys) were missing. She then noticed fraudulent charges that occurred on 12/23 and 12/24 totaling \$2,598.44. She also noticed that two charges totaling \$2,900.00 were declined. She advised a new card was mailed her a new card on 12/15, which was taken from the mailbox after her vehicle was stolen. Loss prevention contacted to obtain video surveillance of the incident.

Graffiti/1300 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officer Jones notice new graffiti to the fence of the residence. Voicemail for the homeowner was left for him to call back with further information.

Vandalism & Resisting Arrest/200 blk W Canal Dr- Complainant called to report that the building had just been tagged by a white male walking away towards 1st and Dayton. Officer Johnson located the male at the bus stops on S Dayton St and told the male he was under arrest. The male refused to comply and struggled with Officer

Johnson before finally putting his hands behind his back. He was very verbal and claimed they were only stickers. Officer Jones located the stickers on several buildings and stop signs and was unable to remove the sticker without damaging the signs. Suspect was booked into Benton County Jail on Destruction of Property and Resisting Arrest.

Burglary/300 blk N Van Buren St- Complainant called to report a burglary that occurred on 12/25 at approximately 2300hrs, but just learned of the incident today. He advised that an unknown white male entered the fenced compound via scaling the fence. The suspect checked multiple company vehicles before moving to the locked shed. The male cut the lock and removed a leaf blower from the shed. The suspect left the compound, leaving the leaf blower behind. There is video surveillance of the incident and they will call when the video is ready for pickup.

Counterfeit/100 blk N Ely St- Complainant called to report a male came into the store today and paid for merchandise with counterfeit bills. The male identified himself to store employees. The bills were taken for evidence and the employee advised there was video surveillance of the incident, however, they would have to contact their corporate office to obtain the video and would call back when available.

Theft/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant called to report two males taking items out of their waistbands and placing them into the trunk of their vehicle in the parking lot. Officer Sneyd arrived and located the vehicle still parked, unoccupied. A short time later, two males exited the mall toward the vehicle. As they were contacted one subject was trying to pull merchandise from his pants that he concealed. Both were detained. He admitted there more items in the vehicle. All of the items were retrieved and he was cited and released. Second subject was released and determined that he had not stolen anything.

D-Shift

Assault DV/8500 blk W Arrowhead- Male punched his girlfriend in the face during an argument. He fled the scene prior to the officers arriving. She was transported to Trios by medics.

CAT

Narcotics, Warrant & DWLS/Quebec & Arrowhead- Detectives Bennett and Dorame recognized a female and confirmed her Driving while License Suspended 2nd Degree status. Two vehicles were stopped simultaneously. She was the driver of one and was arrested. The second vehicle was driven by a male who was also suspended. The passenger of that vehicle was identified and was arrested on a warrant. One vehicle was impounded for a narcotics search warrant. The registered owner of the second vehicle

arrived on scene and gave consent to search. 25 grams of meth, 32 controlled pills, marijuana, and a scale were located together in the vehicle driven by the female. All involved were booked into the Benton County Jail.

Warrant Arrest/3200 blk S Quincy Pl- Detectives Riley and Schwartz arrested a female for 2 outstanding warrants. She was booked into the Benton County Jail.

Saturday, December 31, 2016

B-Shift

Malicious Mischief/3700 blk W Metaline Ave- Officers responded to a disturbance between Clarissa Herrera and Nicholas Burton. The male claims the female damaged property inside their shared residence. She denied damaging any property and says that he often lies to get her arrested. She advised she was going to a friend's house to separate herself from the male. Case sent to the CA's Office for review.

Theft/1300 blk N Columbia Center Blvd- Complainant called to report a theft by a former employee over the past month that was still at the location. He had been notified of suspicious returns done by the suspect between Novembers and December 2016. He completed 17 fraudulent cash returns in the amount of \$1,515.02 and pocketed all of the cash. The on-call Benton County Deputy Prosecutor requested the case be sent up for review. Suspect was released and case sent to BCPA for review.

Theft/900 blk W Entiat Ave- Complainant called to report that both the front and rear license plates were taken from his cream 1996 Lincoln Mark VII Coupe, bearing WA AXJ2925. Both plates entered into the system as stolen.

Warrant Arrest/7300 blk W Bonnie Ave- Night shift responded at approximately 0200hrs after reports that a female was at the location with an outstanding DOC warrant. She was located but due to her recent drug usage, she required medical treatment at TRIOS. She was finally medically cleared for booking at 0930hrs and transported to the Benton County Jail.

Suicide Attempt/7800 blk W Deschutes Ave- Complainant called to report that he found his daughter passed out on her bed. He advised that she has attempted suicide in the past by way of overdosing on medication. There were several bottles of alcohol in her room. She denied attempting suicide. KFD transported her to TRIOS for medical evaluation and Crisis Response was informed to contact her at the hospital.

Theft/4200 blk W Kennewick Ave - Complainant called to report that an unknown suspect took the bistro set from her front porch of her apartment. No suspect info.

Theft/8500 blk W Entiat Ave- Complainant called to report that her son's red and black "Wipeout" bicycle was taken from the front porch by an unknown suspect. She heard a noise at 2200hrs last night, but did not discover the bike missing until this morning.

Stolen Vehicle/600 blk N Fruitland St- Complainant called to report that an unknown suspect stole his black 2012 Infinity G37 while he was inside his storage unit. The vehicle is registered to his daughter. She advised that she did not give anyone other than her father to drive the vehicle. The vehicle was entered into the system as stolen.

D-Shift

Weapons/3000 blk S Jean- Male accidentally shot himself in the upper leg. The round exited thru the lower leg. The weapon is a 44 Mag and the round was a hollow point. His brother in law was at the scene and is a military medic. The brother in law treated him by applying a tourniquet to the leg until KFD arrived. He was transported to Trios and said the wound was accidental. He was very intoxicated. The weapon was placed in evidence until the investigation can be completed.

Assault DV/1200 blk W 42nd Ave- Male attacked his wife by pushing her down. The family dog intervened and stopped the assault. He threatened to commit suicide and was arrested for Assault DV. The jail staff was made aware of the suicidal statements.

DUI/1100 blk N Buchanan- Officers responded to a vehicle stopped in the street in the area of 1100 blk N Buchanan. The male driver of the vehicle was found unconscious and was allegedly under the influence. He was arrested for Physical Control and in accordance with state law his vehicle was impounded.

Theft/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Male allegedly left the store with merchandise that was not paid for. He will be charged with Theft.

Domestic/2000 blk W 2nd Ave- Complainant reported that her boyfriend hit her in the face splitting her lip and spit in her mouth. There was no evidence of what she was claiming. A witness reported that the two were arguing, but there was no assault. She said she did not feel safe at the location and wanted to leave, but he would not let her. Arrangements were made for her to leave and have a place to stay. She gathered some items and placed them in a patrol car. She briefly talked to her boyfriend and then said she was not leaving, returned to the patrol car and retrieved her items. She was told officers arranged for her to have a place to go and she said officers had arrested a male at the location in the past for being black. The officers again reiterated there was place for her to go and she said, "Bye, bye bye bye". She then said that if she is assaulted it will be KPD's fault. She refused to leave even though all arrangements had been made. The officers cleared.

Suspicious Circumstances/300 blk N Ely- Complainant reported that someone has been messing with his vehicle. He said screws and nuts are stripped and the radio is being left on Spanish channels. He also said the employees at a nearby business have been talking about him. He could not say which employees and he could not be specific when he heard them talking.

Hit & Run/7th Ave & Morain- Complainant reported that a vehicle hit his parked Toyota Corolla and left the scene. Parts of the suspect vehicle were collected at the scene. Officer Kuhn was able to determine that parts from the suspect vehicle matched a bronze Jeep. Officer Ayala had taken a separate Hit and Run in a parking lot that involved a bronze Jeep and had photos of the suspect vehicle. The parts Officer Kuhn had collected were missing from the Jeep in the photograph. The registered owner could not be contacted and the investigation is continuing pending contact of the owner of the suspect vehicle.

CAT

Order Violation/900 blk W 44th PI- CAT detectives responded to this location for an order violation in progress. Complainant advised she was at home when her ex-husband came over and walked into the residence in violation of a court order. CAT arrived and took him into custody without incident. He was extremely intoxicated and was transported to Trios for medical clearance. He was booked into Benton County Jail.

Sunday, January 1, 2017

B Shift

Patrol responded to several single vehicle collisions due to slick roads. No injuries involved.

Assault DV & Destruction of Property/2600 blk W Bruneau PI- Officers responded to an assault that just occurred. Male assaulted a female by scratching her face in several places and causing a knot on her head from pushing her into a wall. He also destroyed numerous items in the house including the flat screen TV. He fled the scene prior to police arrival. ATL was broadcast for the suspect. Several hours later he returned to the apartment and she called the police. He was arrested without incident and booked into the Benton County Jail. She declined to have a Protection order issued.

Felony Order Violation & Warrant/600 blk N Arthur St- Female called to report that she was assaulted by a male at the apartment. She stated he asked her for sex the night before and when she refused, he became irate and began punching her with closed fists. She sustained several marks on her face and the top of her head. It was later learned that there was an order between them, with the male as the

respondent. Deputy Prosecutor was contacted and approved a 72-Hour Hold for the male who had fled. The female had two outstanding misdemeanor warrants for her arrest. She was booked into the Benton County Jail.

Hit & Run/27th Ave & Vancouver St- Two vehicles were involved in a minor collision in the round-about at the location when one driver backed into another after getting stuck due to the snow. First driver drove off and did not stop to exchange information. He was contacted at his residence and advised he did not think there was any damage to either vehicle, so he left. He was cited and released for Hit and Run.

Assault/100 blk N Irving Pl- Complainant called to report that his ex-wife just assaulted his new girlfriend. He took a video of the incident which shows both on the ground kicking and screaming at each other. Both females get up and begin pushing each other. The ex-wife left prior to police arrival. Girlfriend did not have any injuries, but said she had hair ripped out of her head. He was unsure where his ex-wife currently lives and we were unable to make contact with her. He advised that he would provide the video of the incident. Case sent to CA for review.

D Shift

FTS&ID/4th Ave & Kellogg- An unknown vehicle damaged a electrical box. There was fresh snow and there were no tire tracks or footprints in the area. PUD was notified.

Recovered Stolen/Clearwater & US 395- WSP stopped and assisted with what appeared to be having mechanical issues. The male driver of the black 2016 Infiniti became combative with the Trooper and was arrested. The vehicle returned as a stolen vehicle out of Kennewick. The registered owner of the vehicle was contacted and said she is out of town. She had another subject pick the vehicle up. The driver was booked on the WSP charges.

Trespass/4600 blk W Clearwater- Female was under the influence of narcotics and was at the location. Employees told her to leave several times and she refused. She was arrested and booked for Criminal Trespass. D Shift dealt with her several times on New Year's Eve, once because she was lying on the sidewalk crying that she was cold and homeless.

Suspicious Circumstance/500 blk W Columbia Dr- Complainant reported that an unidentified male was in the store and was telling a customer that there are a lot of body parts in the river and then told her he left a crime scene at a RR crossing and there were a lot of body parts. The area was checked and nothing that appeared to be body parts was located and the male could not be located either.

Hit & Run/3500 blk W Clearwater- Officers Ayala and Officer Kuhn responded to two different Hit and Run collisions last night. It was discovered that both were caused by

the same vehicle. Officer Kuhn's victim vehicle is most likely totaled. The registered owner of the vehicle said his son drives the suspect vehicle, but was not cooperative. Tonight the officers responded to the owner's residence to collect the suspect vehicle as evidence and he blocked the vehicle in the driveway and refused to let the officer take it. After a period of time he let the officers take the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle is his son and Richland PD assisted by arresting him in Richland for two counts of FTS & ID and one count of Driving While License Suspended in the Third Degree.

Harassment DV/1800 blk W 3rd Ave- Male threatened his girlfriend with physical harm and to break up her furniture. He was intoxicated and confrontational with officers as well. He was arrested for Harassment – DV. She asked for a No Contact Order.

Assault DV/2600 blk W Bruneau Pl- Male pushed and shoved his girlfriend during an argument. He was arrested for Assault - DV and a No Contact Order was requested. He also had Meth on his person when he was searched incident to the arrest. He was charged for that as well.

Monday, January 2, 2017

C Shift

Auto Theft/700 blk S Gum St- Complainant reported that her tan 1996 Honda Accord was stolen. The car was parked on the street and last seen yesterday at 15:00hrs. She provided a license plate which is not a good plate. There is a 4" high sticker of a red flower in the lower passenger side corner of the rear window. Car has been entered as stolen with a request sent to DOL to determine the correct license plate. There are no suspects.

Warrant Arrest/3800 blk Plaza Way- Officers responded to a disturbance where they contacted a male. He was arrested and booked on a misdemeanor warrant. He was also trespassed for a year.

A Shift

Suspicious Circumstance/100 blk N Keller St- Reporting party heard a knock on their back slider and the door being manipulated. The suspect was an unknown gender Caucasian, no facial hair, and rotten teeth asking if they could help pull him out of a ditch. They then said a turquoise bicycle leaning up against their mailbox was gone. They sent the male on his way and then saw the bicycle was gone.

Graffiti/East Kennewick- Red spray painted graffiti was located at Canal and Washington and two businesses both on N Fruitland. "Bubble shaped letters all appeared to be fresh. Forwarded to GAP for clean-up.

Robbery/5300 blk W Clearwater Ave- A male wearing a dark colored winter VOLCOM BRAND BEANIE hat and a layered in multiple dark sweat jackets and wearing a hood cinched tight, walked into the store, implied he had a gun and demanded money from the cash register. Suspect was last seen walking west towards Clearwater and Edison. Follow up continuing

Weapons/Trios ER- At 2205 Trios ER staff advised of a male who walked into the ER with a gunshot wound to the thigh. The doctor advised the wound looked like it was self-inflicted, the victim, a 27 year old gang member claimed he was shot walking down Canal Dr. The victim was uncooperative; his clothing was dry and would not share more details. Follow-up continuing.
