C- Squad

Burglary/8500 blk W 9th Ave- Home owner reported that his garage was entered during the night and two generators were taken. The main garage door was open when they woke this morning. They did not hear the door open during the night and not sure if it did not shut after they had got home yesterday evening. No suspects.

Graffiti/200 blk S Beech- Graffiti was found on City street sign and fencing in the area of 2nd & Beech. The fencing was at a vacant house. City and GAP notified for cleanup. There are no suspects.

B-Squad

Narcotics/8600 blk W 1st Ave - Complainant called to report that she had a package delivered to her containing possible narcotics. She received the package addressed to an address in New Jersey and her address in the return address but listed as a business. She advised that there is no such business at that location. The pills were photographed and entered into evidence.

Aggravated Assault & Interfere with Reporting a DV/1500 blk W 5th Ave- Officers responded to 500 blk N Neel St to contact a female. She called to report an assault that occurred overnight by her boyfriend at her residence. She advised that he punched her several times and strangled her causing her difficulty breathing. At one point, he took

her phone and smashed it several times, prohibiting her from calling 911. She believed he was going to kill her. He was contacted at the residence, arrested, and booked into jail for Assault 2nd-DV.

Meth Possess/1500 blk S Oak St- Male called dispatch for assistance with getting into a detox facility. He advised that he was addicted to methamphetamine. Upon contact he advised that he had methamphetamine on his person and requested to be taken to jail. A small baggy of methamphetamine was located in his coat pocket. He was transported to the Benton County Jail and booked for possession of methamphetamine.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle/7900 blk W Quinault Ave- Pasco Police called to report that Ajax Towing had called them about a vehicle they impounded from a parking lot that returned as a stolen vehicle out of Tacoma PD. Staff advised that the vehicle had been abandoned in the parking lot for several months prior to being towed. Tacoma PD was advised of the recovery.

Theft of Firearm/4000 blk W 10th Ave- Complainant called to report a theft of his firearm. He advised that he has no seen his Browning .22 caliber handgun since Halloween. He advised that nothing else missing from his residence and the gun case is still there. Gun entered as stolen.

Shoplifting/7400 blk W Canal Dr- Store employees called to report that a male was inside the store concealing items. The male fled the store and across W Canal Dr towards Vista Elementary. The male was eventually located in a backyard in the 7300 blk W Yellowstone Ave. The male identified himself only as "Michael" and refused to provide any further information. At the jail, corrections staff identified the male. Staff requested he be medically cleared. He was medically cleared at TRIOS and booked into jail for theft.

Fraud/5100 blk W Clearwater Ave- Complainant called to report a fraudulent transaction on his checking account. He advised that he was letting a friend stay at his apartment. He left his residence on 1/3/17 and left his wallet at the apartment. He said he believes that subject withdrew \$600.00 from his account without his permission. He could not provide details of the transaction and advised the subject had left to Oregon.

D-Squad

Theft/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Male allegedly took a couple hundred dollars of alcohol from the store without paying. Staff attempted to contact him and he ran after dropping the basket containing the alcohol. Staff recognized him from a previous alleged theft.

Mental/2600 blk S Quillan Pl- Officer Ayala responded to welfare check at an unknown location for a female who made some vague statements on Facebook. Officer Ayala was

able to locate a phone number and called her. She said she was fine and did not want any assistance. Crisis Response was informed of the outcome.

Counterfeit/7100 blk W Okanogan- Jail staff reported an inmate Faizon Rawlins had a counterfeit 100 dollar bill on his person. The serial number of the bill is LL62033416F. The bill was taken for evidence.

CAT

DWLS/600 bld Gage Blvd- CAT detectives observed a female driving with a suspended license. She was stopped and arrested for DWLS 3rd. She was enrolled on BCSO work crew, but this arrest immediately violated her status. She was booked into Benton County Jail to serve her time on a previous arrest.

Warrant Arrest/3100 blk W Kennewick Ave- CAT detectives contacted a 25 year old male and arrested him for one warrant. He was booked into Benton County Jail.

B-Squad

Unlawful Issuance of Bank Checks/100 blk N Volland St - Complainant called to report several checks that were cashed on her checking account that she did not issue. She advised that she learned that a female had cashed 3 checks using the complainants' checking account. She received the copies of the checks that were issued with the female as the payee. She also advised that the checks were not the checks that she had for her account, but her account number was correct on the bottom. Businesses where the checks were cashed advised they would call back when the video surveillance was available. Further investigation.

Theft/11th Ave & S Garfield St- Officer Jones responded to a report of mail left in the middle of the roadway. The mail was collected and an attempt to return the mail at their correct destinations was unsuccessful. The mail was entered into evidence.

Robbery/2800 blk W Kennewick Ave- Officers were dispatched to a robbery that just occurred within about one minute. The suspect, described as a Caucasian male wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with "PAW" across the back and the front breast of the sweatshirt. The male pointed a handgun at the female employee and demanded cash. . The male exited the store and ran westbound through the parking lot. Neighboring business provided video surveillance of the suspect enter their store prior to the robbery and the male running westbound past the store just after. Case linked to detectives.

Trespass & Urinating in Public/4600 blk W Clearwater Ave- Loss Prevention called to report a male was in the store after he had been trespassed from the premises several months prior. They also advised the male had urinated outside in the parking lot before entering the store. The suspect was contacted after he purchased an item. The item was returned and he was reimbursed his money. He was booked into the Benton County Jail for Trespass and Urinating in Public.

D-Squad

Auto Theft/400 blk S Date- Officer Harris responded for a stolen vehicle. A red 1998 Chevrolet Cavalier **was left unattended and running to warm it up**. The vehicle was also unlocked and a criminal took the opportunity to steal it. The vehicle has a University of Idaho and parking sticker in the front driver side window.

Mental/400 blk W 21st Pl- Complainant reported that her son said she would find a dead body if she came to his house. He was contacted by telephone and said he was in Yakima and is fine. He refused to let officers contact him and refused to talk to Crisis Response. The reporting party was advised of the contact.

Warrant Arrest/300 blk W 4th Ave- Officer Ayala responded to an anonymous tip of a wanted person at the above location. One subject was arrested for a misdemeanor warrant; another was arrested for 2 felony warrants and a misdemeanor warrant. Third subject was also arrested for a misdemeanor warrant.

Theft/1300 blk W 4th Ave- Officer Kiel saw what appeared to be a disturbance as he was responding to call. The disturbance turned out to be store employees detaining a shoplifter. The suspect, a 23 year old was arrested for Theft.

CAT

Narcotics & Weapons/1st & Washington St- CAT detectives observed a 32 year old male driving a vehicle on a suspended license. As the detectives were getting ready to pull over the vehicle it suddenly pulled into the parking lot and an unknown male got out of the vehicle and quickly entered the store. Detective Riley contacted the male at the vehicle and observed a female in the front passenger seat and a male in the back seat. Detective Riley advised the male he was under arrest for DWLS. He was semi cooperative and didn't want to get out. Detective Riley took the male by the arm to pull him out of the car when Det. Schwartz saw the male was sitting on a handgun. When the gun was first observed Detective Schwartz saw the front passenger a 23 year old female, reach for the gun and slide it under the center console. The detectives backed off and called for assistance. Detectives and patrol arrested the driver and the passenger and detained three other subjects, including one who had two felony warrants. The male who came into the store had dumped some gloves on the

gum rack. The gloves were recovered and contained methamphetamine. All of the occupants are convicted felons. Driver was booked into Benton County Jail for felon in possession of a firearm, possession of methamphetamine, DWLS. Female was booked in for felon in possession of a firearm and possession of methamphetamine. Another male was booked for 2 felony warrants and possession of methamphetamine. Car was towed for a search warrant.
