Monday, January 9, 2017

D- Shift

Malicious Mischief/100 blk N Volland- Complainant reported that sometime between Saturday (01/07) after 1700 hours and this morning, someone had broken a window and left the exterior faucet on, flooding the parking lot. No leads or suspects.

Community Care Fund- DSHS requested assistance in providing lodging for a female for one night until DSHS could get resources in place for her tomorrow. A room was secured for her.

Theft of Snow Shovel/600 blk S Jean Pl- Complainant reported that his snow shovel had been stolen off the front porch. He advised he had propped the aluminum shovel with a wood handle against the front door as he went inside for a second and when he came out he saw a male loading it into a vehicle and drive away.

B-Shift

Assist Out Vehicle Collision/Blue Bridge- Kennewick Officers handled a two vehicle collision for WSP on the blue bridge.

Vehicle Collision/6200 blk W Clearwater Ave- Male was traveling east on Clearwater when he lost control in the icy conditions. His vehicle struck a light pole knocking the light off the top. He was cited for speed too fast for conditions.

Tuesday, January 10, 2017

D Shift

D-Shift assisted a significant number of motorists who slid off the roadway or became stuck in the heavy snow that remains on many side streets throughout the city.

Trespass & Community Care Fund/Trios Hospital- Officers responded to a female who was sleeping in the lobby and refused to leave when asked. She has been staying in the waiting room all night, and has done this on several occasions, coming into the hospital claiming she had a minor injury and then sleeping in the waiting room. She was contacted and advised that she had no place to go and no resources here. She advised that she had family in Seattle and could get assistance if she could get to Seattle. She was transported to the bus station and a ticket to Seattle purchased with the Community Care Fund.

Robbery/1100 blk W 10th Ave- Male reported that on 01/02/2017 he was held at knife point, punched in the face and his car keys, and 2 cell phones were stolen by a 25 year old male. The male was a subject with whom he has been using Meth with, along with others at the location. He reported that the incident happened after the suspect accused him of stealing \$400.00. After taking the keys, the suspect left in the vehicle, a green 2000 Kia Sephia, missing the driver's door handle and the gas tank cover which is broken off. The vehicle has been entered as stolen. Case linked to CID for follow up.

B Shift

Officers assisted numerous motorists who were stuck in the snow.

Collision FTS & ID/Hartford St & Grand Ronde- An unknown suspect struck the stop sign at this intersection and knocked it down. City Streets have been notified.

Vehicular Assault/600 blk W Kennewick Ave- Patrol assisted CAT with arresting a male after he rammed a CAT SUV. Officers assisted with containment on different locations he was thought to be at. See CAT briefing for additional details.

CAT

Narcotics & Warrant Arrest/Entiat & Kent Pl- Detectives Dorame and Bennett recognized a male walking down the street and were aware he was wanted. He attempted to flee and fell down a short distance away. Detective Bennett took him into custody and located a meth pipe that the subject dropped. He was booked on a Benton County Felony Warrant, DOC Warrant, and a possession of a controlled substance.

Eluding, Vehicular Assault, Narcotics & Warrant/600 blk W Kennewick Ave- Detectives Schwartz and Riley attempted to arrest a male for several outstanding warrants. The suspect fled in a vehicle after backing into the CAT SUV. The suspect struck his

passenger with the passenger side door as he fled. A second passenger fell out of the vehicle while he was temporarily stuck. First passenger complained of right leg and knee pain. The second passenger did not report any injuries. The suspect fled at a high rate of speed and got away. Detectives Bennett and Dorame later located him in Pasco on Court St and arrested him without further incident. He was arrested with meth and was booked into Benton County Jail for vehicular assault, attempting to elude, and warrants (DOC, Felony Violation of a Court Order, Fail to Register). The meth possession charge is being forwarded to Franklin County. The suspect vehicle was located in the area of Entiat & Hartford and was towed pending a search warrant.

Wednesday, January 11, 2017

C-Shift

DUI/4800 blk W Clearwater Ave- At shift change, off going officer contacted and detained a male. We responded and handled the investigation. The male was in the drive through. They called after he had got his car stuck on the curb in the drive through and had fallen asleep. He was arrested for DUI. Officer Duty obtained blood evidence by search warrant and was booked for DUI.

Hazard/200 blk E Columbia Dr- Officers responded to a report of the vacant building collapsing. Originally there was concern that there may be transients who sleep in the building. The building is owned by the Port of Kennewick as part of the Columbia Drive project. It appears that the building collapsed under the weight of the snow on the roof. The front wall of the building was still standing and later knocked down to prevent it from falling over. Kennewick Fire had also responded to the call and did not find any evidence that created concern that anyone had been inside when the building collapsed. The Port of Kennewick already had heavy equipment present due to construction and handled making the area safe by demolishing the front wall. City Street Department also responded and handled traffic control on Columbia Drive.

Order Violation/800 blk N Kellogg St- Officers attempted to contact a male and female who were together at Work Source. There is a no contact order in place between them. Officers made contact as the two exited and the male ran. She was cooperative and was arrested on a felony warrant. Other Officers arrived in the area and the male was located and surrendered without incident. He was booked for violating the court order and resisting.

Assault/00 blk N Auburn- Officers responded to an assault where a male had struggled with an employee after trying to push his way into the business. Sgt. Lattin was close by and saw the suspect running from the location. Officers arrived and arrested the male who had been drinking. He denied causing a problem at the business. He was arrested and booked for Assault 4. The male employee was not hurt.

A-Shift

Armed Robbery/5600 blk W Clearwater Ave- A male wearing a dark colored outer jacket and dark colored hoodie underneath wearing a blue handkerchief as a mask entered the business about 7:03PM and demand cash while also advising the clerk he has a gun. When the clerk was slow to respond to his demands he pulled a black semi-auto pistol out of his jacket pocket and pointed it at the clerk. After getting the cash, the suspect left on foot east bound.

Malicious Mischief/600 blk S Kent St- 18 year old gang member was intoxicated and caused some damage to the inside of his mother's apartment. During his tirade he lacerated his hand and arm on some broken glass. He was transported to Trios via medics and then cited and released so he could get sutures for his injury.

CAT

Warrant Arrest/10th Ave & Washington St- Detectives Riley and Schwartz recognized a male and were aware he had three Franklin County Warrants for his arrest. He was arrested and booked into FC Jail.

Thursday, January 12, 2017

C Shift

Graffiti/00 blk E 10th Ave- Black spray painted on the Veterans of Foreign Wars building. The damage was done sometime in the last 48 hours. GAP contacted for removal. There are no suspects.

Counterfeit/12000 blk W Clearwater Ave- The store reported that they had received two counterfeit \$100 bills. An unidentified adult female had tried to pay using the bills. The clerk advised her that the bills were counterfeit and the female left. The clerk had kept the bills. We were not able to identify the female with the information we had. The bills are well done from others we have seen. The bills were collected and placed into evidence.

Auto Theft/3500 blk W Hood Ave- 28 year old male forced entry into one of his apartment neighbor's vehicles, a 1990 red Nissan Sentra and stole it. He was seen driving it by another neighbor and PD was notified. He was located at another apartment and admitted to taking the car because he thought it was abandoned. Prosecutor was contacted and advised to book him for auto theft.

A Shift

Order Violation/1100 blk W 5th Ave- According to male complainant, a female violated the no contact order by calling his residence numerous times. Report sent to CA for charging.

Due to the freezing fog in the area, A-Shift also assisted WSP with several traffic hazards on the Blue and Cable Bridges since the only Trooper on duty was in Walla Walla.

Warrant Arrest/2800 blk W 2nd Ave- CAT detectives were on extra patrol when they saw a male gang member. He was contacted and arrested for two felony warrants and was booked into Benton County Jail.
